She became the first female production scheduler at Lily Tulip Cup Company before deciding to attend electrician apprentice training classes.

After graduating in 1977, Connie became one of the first women in the electrician trade in the State of California and a member of Riverside's International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers (IBEW) Local 440. In 2000, she returned to the Local 440 Office where she was Office Manager until her retirement in 2015.

Connie was a master at knitting which she also taught at some of the local knit shops. She loved the outdoors and was an avid mountain climber, hiker, and backpacker. She hiked across Death Valley, up and down the John Muir Trail, and to the summits of Mount San Geronio, San Jacinto, and many others. She was also a faithful member of Harvest Christian Fellowship.
