



BACKGROUND:

Summary

The Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) provides for the construction of the Grapefruit Boulevard and 62nd Avenue Traffic Signal Project, in the Community of Mecca. Grapefruit Boulevard is a two lane road that travels in the north-south direction. 62nd Avenue is a two lane road that travels in the east-west direction.

The proposed new traffic signal and improvements will improve the operation and safety of the intersection and the adjacent Union Pacific Railroad (UPRR) at-grade crossing. Addition of left-turn lanes on 62nd Avenue for both eastbound and westbound directions will improve safety and capacity for roadway users. The addition of a northbound right-turn lane on Grapefruit Boulevard will provide a dedicated lane for right-turning motorists waiting to proceed eastbound while the adjacent railroad gates are down, allowing the traffic signal to continue to serve through traffic on Grapefruit Boulevard.

The work includes widening the intersection for the installation of the traffic signal, at-grade improvements at the UPRR crossing, curb and gutter, and Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) compliant curb ramps. Additional work includes placement of pavement markers, roadside signs, traffic stripes, pavement markings, and other work that may be required.

The submitted plans and specifications have been approved as to form by County Counsel.

Environmental Findings

At its meeting on February 6, 2018 (Item 3.14), the Riverside County Board of Supervisors determined that the Grapefruit Boulevard and 62nd Avenue Traffic Signal Project will not have a significant effect on the environment. The approval of the plans and specifications and authorization to advertise for bid is an implementing action in furtherance of the project, and no further documentation is required under CEQA.

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Impact on Citizens and Businesses

The proposed traffic signal will improve traffic and pedestrian safety by providing controlled traffic movements.

The work is scheduled to begin in the spring of 2019. The work will be phased to keep the road open during construction as much as possible and will take approximately three months to complete.


Additional Fiscal Information

The construction contract is estimated to cost approximately \$912,785 and will be funded with East County DIF Signal Mitigation Fund, and HSIP – Highway Safety Improvement Program funds for which the Department successfully competed.

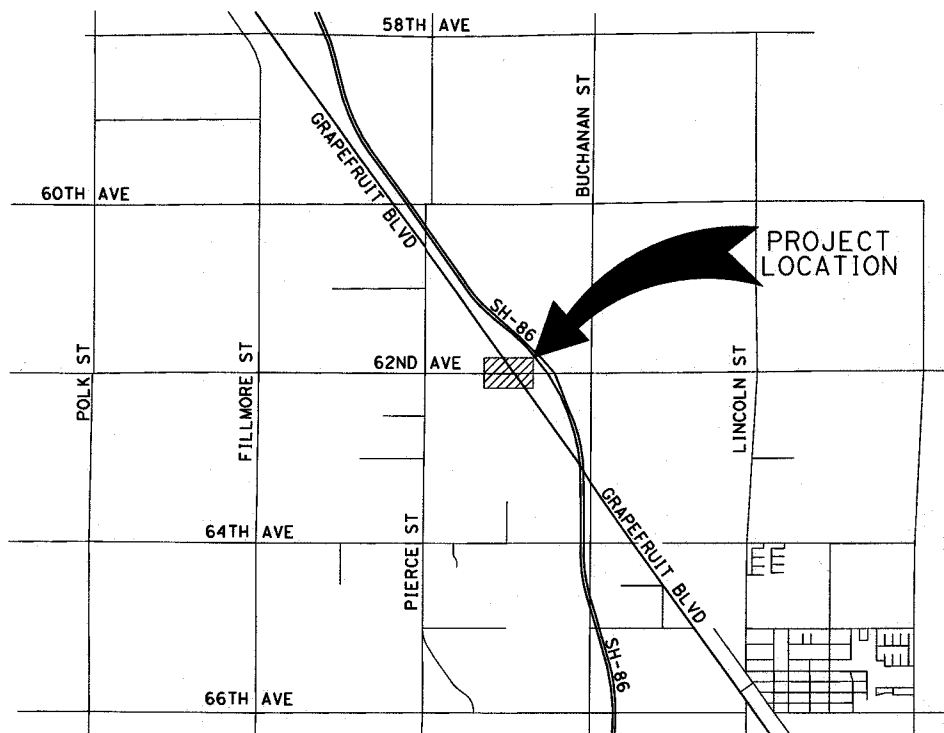
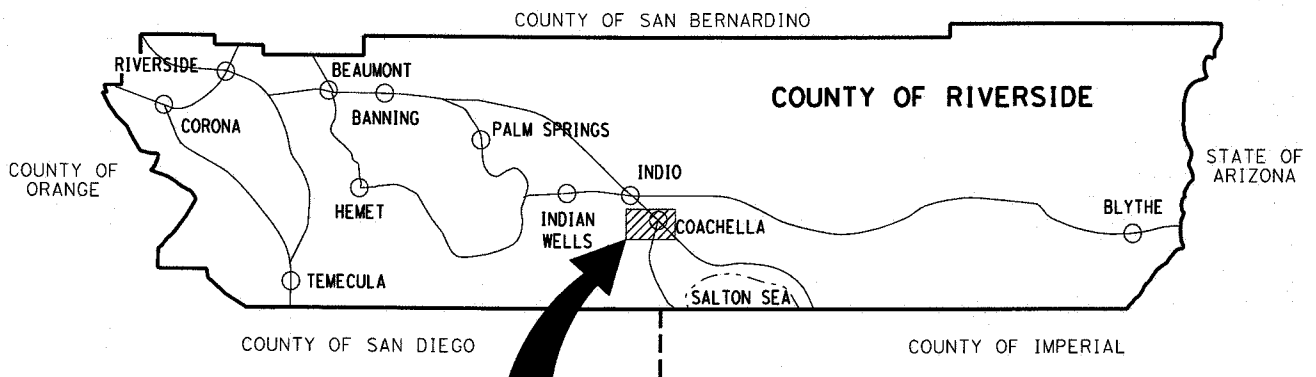
