On motion of Supervisor Washington, seconded by Supervisor Jeffries, and duly carried by unanimous vote, IT WAS ORDERED that the meeting of Tuesday, February 26, 2019 be adjourned in memory of Ronald H. Roberts, a beloved 78-year-old former Temecula Mayor/City Council Member who passed away on February 4, 2019, on what was his 58th wedding anniversary.

An instrumental force in the community, Ron loved Temecula and worked selflessly for nearly 25 years to help create the beautiful city. He first began his service to the City of Temecula when he was appointed to the Temecula Traffic Commission in 1990. Two years later, he was elected to his first term on the City Council and was then reelected to five continuous terms. He served as Mayor five times over the years and retired in December 2014.

During his time on the City Council, Ron had a tremendous impact throughout the City of Temecula's infrastructure, facilities, and parks. Named in honor of his vision, leadership, and perseverance, the Ronald H. Roberts Temecula Public Library remains as one of the best and busiest of 35 libraries in Riverside County.

Ron served on numerous County commissions and boards over the years, representing Temecula as Chairman of the National League of Cities Transportation Infrastructure & Services Committee, Chairman of the Western Riverside Council of Governments, Chairman of the Riverside County Transportation Commission, Chairman of the Southern California Regional Rail Authority (Metrolink), President of Southern California Association of Governments, Chairman of Southern California Association of Governments Transportation & Communication Committee, Chairman of South Coast Air Quality Management District Mobile Source Air Pollution and Reduction Committee, and Chairman of the Temecula Valley Balloon & Wine Festival.

Ron was a loving and devoted husband, father, grandfather, and friend. He is survived by his wife Jeanne, son Ron Jr. (wife Kara), daughter Wendy (husband Sam), and five grandchildren.

Ron's memory and passionate spirit will live forever in the hearts of those who knew and loved him. He will be greatly missed but never forgotten.

On motion of Supervisor Spiegel, seconded by Supervisor Jeffries, and duly carried by unanimous vote, IT WAS ORDERED that the meeting of Tuesday, February 26, 2019 be adjourned in memory of William "Bill" Alexander, a 75-year-old longtime Mayor and City Councilman in Rancho Cucamonga, California who passed away on January 25, 2019.

Bill and his family moved to the region that would become Rancho Cucamonga in 1969. In 1977, when residents voted to incorporate it, he participated in the meetings that helped name the new City. His life as a public servant began when he was hired as a Fireman and became a Captain and Arson Investigator for the City of Ontario, where he had served for 30 years. He went on to serve on the Foothill Fire Protection Board for 11 years.

After helping to create the City, Bill served as Rancho Cucamonga Mayor and Councilman for 26 years with dedication and commitment. He was elected to the Rancho Cucamonga City Council in 1988. He was elected as Mayor in 1994 and went on to serve for 12 years before departing in 2006 when he lost a close race. After a four-year break, Bill returned in 2010 as a Councilman for two terms. He retired from his position in December 2018 at 75 years old.

During his term as Mayor, Bill oversaw serious development projects in the City, including the construction of Victoria Gardens in 2004. He advocated for several housing development projects, at times to the disapproval of many residents. He also placed a lot of emphasis on establishing community areas throughout the City, which has more than 30 community parks and sports facilities. Despite his hard work, Bill did not do it for the merit or accomplishment. He poured his heart into the City and was practically available to the community on a 24-hour basis.

Along with being a good grandpa, Bill wanted to spend his retirement continuing to volunteer at the local animal shelter, where he fiercely advocated against euthanizing animals. He also looked forward to continuing his Elvis Presley impersonations, an act that made his children and grandchildren laugh.

Bill is survived by three sons, one daughter, seven granddaughters, two-great-grandsons, and one great-granddaughter. His memory and passionate spirit will live forever in the hearts of those who knew and loved him. He will be greatly missed but never forgotten.
