BACKGROUND:

Summary

The Riverside County District Attorney's Office is comprised of about 700 attorneys and support staff which serve more than 2 million residents. The District Attorney's office files, on average, more than 40,000 criminal cases each year and is one of the largest District Attorney's offices in the state of California. They work with every component of the criminal justice system, as well as within the community to prevent and deter crime and to promote public safety.

The Human Resources Classification and Compensation Unit received a request from the District Attorney's Office to designate their District Attorney Communications Manager job classification at-will. The at-will designation is supported for this classification due to the high level of responsibility for all community and internal communications for the District Attorney. In addition, the incumbent assigned to the role will manage important community programs such as the District Attorney's Citizens Academy and will work closely with the District Attorney and the Chief Assistant District Attorney to develop communications objectives. This request is only to designate the classification as at-will and no changes to the salary are recommended.
