On motion of Supervisor Perez, seconded by Supervisor Jeffries, and duly carried by unanimous vote, IT WAS ORDERED that the meeting of Tuesday, April 16, 2019 be adjourned in memory of Robert W. Lamb, a retired Brigadier General, PhD, Professor of Chemistry, and beloved resident of Rancho Mirage, California who passed away on February 27, 2019, just five days after his 90th birthday.

“Bob” was born in Lone Tree, Indiana on February 22, 1929, the year the Great Depression began. After graduating from Switz City High School, he joined his aunt in Scottsdale and hauled ice blocks, dug ditches and wells, and scaled oil rigs—anything to make enough money to earn his bachelor’s and a master’s degree in Chemistry. He went on to pursue more graduate work at Purdue University until a draft number interrupted his studies, and he received an officer’s commission into the Air Force.

In 1953, Bob was sent to the Army Chemical Warfare Center and then to Wright Patterson AFB Material Laboratory where he conducted research on the detection of toxic gases. In 1956, he was assigned to the newly formed Air Force Academy as Instructor of Chemistry. Two years later, he became the first officer sponsored by the department for a PhD, which he earned in 1961 from the University of Colorado. In 1965, he moved his family to Belgium for three years for an assignment in Brussels at the European Office of Aerospace Research. Bob returned to the Academy in 1968 and was selected a Permanent Professor in 1970. He later became the head of the Department of Chemical and Biological Sciences. He retired as a Brigadier General in 1979.

After 20 years at the Academy, Bob was offered the position of Manager of Training and Education by Bechtel Corporation in Jubail, Saudi Arabia. He was then recruited by Boston University where he was vice president and head of overseas graduate programs in Heidelberg and London.

In 1996, Bob moved to Santa Fe, New Mexico where he met his wife, Carolyn Bussard-Lamb. They later moved to Puerto Vallarta, Mexico where they lived for 10 years. In 2014, they retired to Rancho Mirage where he loved their “forever” home. He enjoyed traveling, reading, theater, writing, movies, swimming, and crossword puzzles.
