- 3. Approve in-principle the BCTC Rock Crushing Project located at 16791 Davis Avenue, in Riverside, California; to dispose of the metal rebar that poses a safety issue and crush the foundation concrete into road base:
- 4. Approve a preliminary project budget in the amount not to exceed of \$190,575 for the Project;

- 7. Authorize the Purchasing Agent to execute pre-qualified consultant service agreements not to exceed \$100,000 per pre-qualified consultant, per fiscal year, in accordance with applicable Board policies for this project, and the sum of all project contracts shall not exceed \$190,575.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

#### **Summary**

The Ben Clark Public Safety Training Center is located at 16791 Davis Avenue in Riverside, California and sits on a 180 acre site that is responsible for enhanced training and educational opportunities for all emergency service providers including law enforcement, fire, custody and emergency medical practitioners. At various locations throughout the site there are large concrete foundation pieces with metal rebar that pose a safety issue and look unsightly. The Sheriff's Department has to dispose of the metal rebar and crush the foundation concrete into road base that can be spread throughout the site. This will help eliminate safety hazards to the site.

Pursuant to CEQA, the BCTC Rock Crushing Project was reviewed and determined to be categorically exempt under State CEQA Guidelines Sections 15301 Existing Facilities Exemption and Section 15061 (b)(3), General Rule or "Common Sense" Exemption. The Project as proposed is limited to minor improvements to an existing County-owned facility, consisting of the consolidation and recycling of existing material on site. The rock crushing activities would

not alter the function or expand the use of the facility. With certainty, there is no possibility that the activity in question may have a significant effect on the environment because it merely involves minor alterations to an existing facility to provide consolidation and recycling of materials to allow for better use and functioning of the property. A Notice of Exemption will be filed by EDA staff with the County Clerk within five days of Board approval.

EDA recommends the Board of Supervisors (Board) approve the BCTC Rock Crushing Project and preliminary project budget in the amount not to exceed of \$190,575. EDA will pursue the most effective project delivery method and award in accordance with applicable Board policies.

#### Impact on Residents and Businesses

The rock crushing project at BCTC will enhance the safety and security of the site by removing large concrete foundation pieces as well as remove the unsightly debris. The Project will not cause a disruption to staff working at the Training Center or the public.
