

BACKGROUND:

Summary

The Cranston Fire began Wednesday, July 25, 2018, near the mountain communities of Idyllwild and Mountain Center and burned more than 13,000 acres. Conditions of extreme peril to people, property and critical infrastructure necessitated the mandatory evacuation of the area during the fire. The Director of Emergency Services proclaimed that a "Local Emergency" exists in Riverside County, which was ratified by the Board of Supervisors at their meeting of July 31, 2018.

It is requested that the Board of Supervisors adopt Resolution No. 2019-093 to terminate the Proclamation of Local Emergency. The vast burn areas left by the Cranston Fire left Riverside County residents and visitors threatened by flooding and debris flows. Monsoonal storms over the burn area(s) led to post fire flash flood warnings issued by the National Weather Service, resulting in evacuations and road closures. This pattern was repeated when storms occurred over the area(s). The situation resulting from said conditions of extreme peril is now deemed to be within the control of the normal protective services, personnel, equipment, and facilities of and within the County of Riverside.
