

BACKGROUND:


Summary

The Holy Fire began Monday afternoon, August 6, 2018, in the Cleveland National Forest and quickly moved from Orange County into Riverside County. Conditions of extreme peril to people, property and critical infrastructure necessitated the mandatory evacuation of several communities near Lake Elsinore and Temescal Valley. The Director of Emergency Services proclaimed a "Local Emergency" in Riverside County on August 9, 2018. The Board of Supervisors adopted Resolution No. 2018-170 in a special meeting on August 16, 2018, to ratify the Proclamation of Local Emergency as declared by the Director of Emergency Services.

It is requested that the Board of Supervisors adopt Resolution No. 2019-092 to terminate the Proclamation of Local Emergency. The vast burn area left by the Holy Fire left Riverside County residents and visitors threatened by flooding and debris flows when rain occurred, leading to flash flood warnings, possible evacuations and road closures. The situation resulting from said conditions of extreme peril is now deemed to be within the control of the normal protective services, personnel, equipment, and facilities of and within the County of Riverside.
