BACKGROUND:

Summary

The City of San Bernardino (City) desires to contract with the County of Riverside, by and through its Department of Animal Services (County), to provide field, shelter and licensing services to safeguard the health and safety of the City's domestic and wild animals and for the purpose of promoting the humane treatment of animals. County has the personnel and experience to provide such field, shelter and licensing services and is willing to enter into the proposed Agreement with City. The terms and provisions of the proposed contract are set forth in the Agreement attached.

The proposed Agreement term begins May 1, 2019 and terminates on April 30, 2020. The parties may mutually agree to extend the services agreement.

The fees that County will charge to City for animal field, shelter and licensing services pursuant to this Agreement shall be \$2,100,000 to be paid by the City in monthly payments. The parties intend to review and revisit the rates and level of services provided within 6 months of entering into this agreement and may amend the agreement as warranted.

Rates are subject to change as adopted by the Board of Supervisors.

County staff recommends the approval of the attached Agreement.

Impact on Residents and Businesses

This Agreement will safeguard the health and safety of City's residents and domestic and wild animals while promoting the humane treatment of animals.

Questions to ask that possibly Dr. Drusys can answer

1. Why were 5000 treatable animals euthanized?
2. Why are more contract city animals euthanized over Riverside animals?
3. Why are they \$1.3 million in the red with all of the contracts they already have?
4. If the shelter can't financially manage their own animals and existing contracts, how can they take more animals?
5. What happens after, when they have to triple or quadruple the number of dogs in the kennels due to space?
6. Will Owner surrenders be the first euthanized? Even if they are adoptable?
7. Will their residents demand an expansion because they have to build more for space? Who pays for the expansion?
8. How many dogs legally and safely can they put in kennels together? Currently multiple large dogs in 1 kennel and up to 10 small dogs in 1 kennel. This is per Dr. Drusys. There was a Riverside dog recently who was labeled "red", which is euth listed for getting beat up by a kennel mate.
9. Are the extra 5 Animal control officers going to be hired? I'm a teacher in San Bernardino. We have 88 schools, and we call Animal control several times a week to pick up dogs and cats off our campuses. Many of these dogs are pit bulls. This is a safety and health issue. Currently the San Bernardino animal control officers respond quickly. Can you guarantee this for our San Bernardino schools?

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Bertie Vanettes

Riverside shelter kills 75% of its Cats as it is. To add another 500 cats to them a month, means death to those cats.

At the Riverside Shelter, 40% of cats are Euthanized and are considered Treatable. Another 33% of Cats are considered Untreatable and Euthanized - that is Fully 75.5%. That is a shocking number. This shelter euthanizes more cats other than the other shelters in the system. (except for Blythe which is very small).

The number of cats that die under the Riverside Shelter is astounding, shocking and scandalous.

For 2018-

Total cats admitted to all shelters: 14677-

Total cats Euthanized - treatable - 4086 = 27.8%

Total cats considered Untreatable - 3803 = 25.9%

Cats died in Riverside care - 312 = 2.1 %

Total cats killed/died for all Riverside Shelters: 55.6%

Cats admitted to Riverside; 8032

Total Cats Killed- treatable - 3212 = 40% -

Total Cats Killed-untreatable - 2668 - 33.2%

Other died: 183 - 2.3 (slightly higher than all)

Total cats Killed or died = 75.5 %

Total cats KILLED/DIED: 8201 = 55.6% Riverside cats = 6063 = 75.5%

Riverside needs to commit itself to saving cats before it takes on more cats.

And what makes Riverside UNTREATABLE so high?

It is IRRESPONSIBLE FOR Riverside to take on San Bernardino cats!

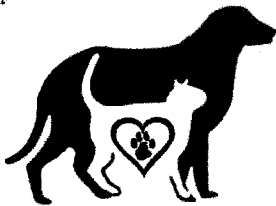

Dear Mayor John Valdivia,

Over the past several years we have notified the Mayor's office to the many issues we observed at the city shelter. We have had many meetings with former managers from Sue Hoak, Adam Affrunti, Debi Shuker, Oscar Perez and now Lt. Macomber. The relationship between the City Shelter and the Humane Society of San Bernardino Valley has been good, rocky, bad, and non-existent, and now I can say the relationship is back on good terms because of the communication and desire to do the right thing for the animals in our city by Lt. Macomber. Unfortunately doing the right thing comes at a cost, and not always in favor of, or on the same page with the very vocal rescue and volunteer groups.

The shelter has many documented deficiencies (which we outlined in letters in 2014 and 2015). On a recent visit we were shocked to see how the facility has deteriorated even more. Previously the issues were mainly understaffing, inadequate training, lack of proper and legal medical protocols, cleanliness and building maintenance. All of those issues still apply.

Today, out of seven buildings, six of them are uninhabitable! Ceilings are falling down and obvious roof leaks are visible. The flooring is giving way, extension cords are used rather than proper, safe, electrical wiring. Black mold is present and visible. Previous insulation has deteriorated and has become the living quarters for rats and birds. The drains are not effective; individual kennel space doesn't even meet the city's municipal code requirements. There is no isolation to protect the healthy animals from the sick. Proper sterilized cleaning of equipment and laundry can only be accomplished with appropriate washers, dryers and dishwashers, which the current electrical system cannot accommodate or be upgraded.

We also have many concerns to having "any non-profit" entity manage the City Shelter as disclosed the previous plan for shelter operations and the RFP. The city will be relying on a non-profit to heavily subsidize the shelter's operations to meet the service level necessary. Unless the non-profit is quite wealthy or highly funded, we see bigger problems ahead for the City of San Bernardino Shelter.

The inability to address these problems affects the wellbeing of the animals, the shelter staff, visitors, and the communities the shelter serves. Simply put, the facility as is, presents a far greater risks to the City of San Bernardino as a fire risk, known medical hazards and obvious OSHA violations. The current facility is not sustainable.

The pets under the care of the City of San Bernardino and your staff deserves better.

I do not understand how you could possibly be re-engaging with SBC about taking over their animal duties yet again. It was just announced that Riverside is deep in the red and will have to be making cuts to its own services and now you are planning on taking in over 8,000 more animals a year? This has to be a joke. Your shelters are already overwhelmed. In one of your shelters alone, it has been documented that you have killed more than 25 dogs in just 1 day, yet now you have the space for 8,000 additional animals? I don't think so. San Bernardino and its residents need their own shelter and YOUR own residents don't need the additional burden of taking over an entire city's discarded animal population (SBC is the 17th largest city in California). The couple of million of dollars SBC is offering is not going to cover even half the expense of hiring more kennel staff, animal control officers, dealing with the diseases that 8,000 more animals will be bringing into your shelters, those same shelters that often times have multiple dogs per kennel already. Your only recourse will be to mass euthanize animals at an alarming rate and that will not go unnoticed. Your own constituents do not want to take this on. These are the same people that voted you into office and expect that you will listen to them when they object to such a ludicrous idea that in no way shape or form helps your own people and their animals whatsoever.

Subject: Please VOTE NO on the San Bernardino City Animal Services Contract

I attended that last Board of Supervisors meeting on May 9, 2019 to urge them to VOTE NO in adopting the Contract to provide animal control services for the City of San Bernardino. Riverside County is dealing with large deficit spending and taking on the vast animal services problem of a large city located outside our borders was proved NOT to be revenue "neutral" because 5 full time employees needed to be added in order to properly service this area. The contract was valued at \$2.1 million and **did not** provide for the 5 additional employees needed to service this city. Now, the EXACT SAME contract is on the Board's agenda for the May 21, 2019 meeting. What has changed during the last two weeks?

I believe that there will be an attempt to state that the \$2.1 million in this contract will be sufficient to cover the salaries of these 5 new employees (salaries, benefits, unemployment insurance, retirement) and provide the same level of service to the City of San Bernardino. Dr. Allan Drusys, Director of Riverside County Animal Services, testified at the Board of Supervisors meeting on May 9th that the contract **did not include any additional personnel**.

I am very concerned that this will be the case and that the current level of Riverside Animal Control staffing will be deemed SUFFICIENT to cover the 81 square miles of the City of San Bernardino without having a detrimental effect on the residents of Riverside County.

It's tempting to take in this multi-million dollar contract but the county is contractually obligated to provide animal services to the city of San Bernardino according to federal, state and county laws and regulations. Ethically, this \$2.1 million contract must not be considered as a solution to the deficit Riverside County Animal Services is currently facing. And there is no guarantee that this funding will be sufficient to begin with.

I was alarmed that during the May 9th meeting, Dr Drusys testified that Riverside County had sufficient space to take in the more than 10,000 dogs and cats which were taken into the City of San Bernardino shelter and by nonprofit rescue groups last year. Dr. Drusys' testimony was based on 2008 shelter statistics; not the 2018 statistics of which I have attached. In fact, Riverside County Animal Services took in almost 32,000 dogs, cats, and other pets in 2018 of which more than 5,400 healthy, adoptable pets were euthanized due to lack of kennel and cage space.

I am extremely concerned that this mass influx of dogs and cats into the the County's main shelter located in Riverside will result in even higher numbers of dogs and cats being euthanized because no additional space is being considered.

Just earlier this year, the Mayor of San Bernardino and the City Council called for Referral For Proposals to run and maintain the shelter but then were abruptly pulled back before any action could be taken. Two City Councilpersons have been actively organizing citizens and other interested persons to submit an RFP but were not given the opportunity to do so. The politics surrounding the animal shelter in San Bernadino is very active and remains fluid.

There is NO need for the Board of Supervisors to rush the vote for adopting this Contract until all options to keep the City of San Bernardino animal shelter open and maintained are exhausted. And for allowing an in-depth analysis of the budgetary impact this Contract will have on Riverside County.

Thank you for this opportunity to share my views with the Board of Supervisors.

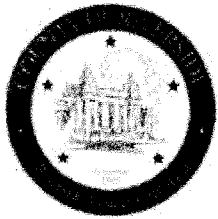

Riverside Shelter has long been perceived by the general public as a no-kill facility because it is one of the impressive shelters for the area.

The public who believes that contracting shelter animals to Riverside have not been made aware of practices from Riverside shelter. High intake with higher kill records will have to increase-how do you add more animals without increasing added space and shelter employees, right now, as the contract would become effective?

Possibly funding or support currently for Riverside shelter might be jeopardized with this becoming a TV media interest. Success of SBC shelter's ability in retaining much lower intake of animals, of obtained donated supplies, and high rescued animal rates are due to the local community and their contacts. Many of these resources have said that Riverside shelter separated in distance by congested traffic with long timely drive time will have significant drops in SBDO citizens/volunteers supporting the move.

Effects include fostering shelter dogs and intervening owner surrender pets before going in to the shelter. We already see terrible people tying dogs to the fence or let loose in the parking lots especially when told SBC can not take the animal because it is not in their home district. Loose animals have lots of open land surrounding this area where animals run and hide until they cause traffic accidents, spread diseases, pregnancies, and possible bite and injure of people or other animals. This will become a burdon on Redlands , Devore, Upland, and Big Bear shelters with a SBC closure.

The shelter is not in top condition but it does not have to be built all at once. What if SBDO obtain enough financial backing in the next year or decides that Riverside's contract is not what they want to continue.? The people signing this contact decision only see numbers in their favor.

It is the behind the scenes activity, that has been gaining strength for several years, that has kept SBC going..the same group that will work hard to bring SBC back home.

Please consider that this community is passionate about keeping their shelter here.

My shelter services is with Riverside Jurupa Valley Shelter. I am a second grade teacher with the San Bernardino City Unified School District. My concern with SB city contracting with Riverside County Animal Services is the response time and availability of animal control officers going to our schools to pick up stray animals. We have 64 elementary schools, 23 middle schools, and 18 high schools. That is a total of 88 schools. We currently have many stray dogs (usually pit bulls) and cats that end up on our school campuses. Many of the SB residents are not responsible pet owners, so dogs are allowed to run freely on the streets with no tags or microchips. Fortunately our San Bernardino animal control officers are aware of the urgency and safety on campuses, so they get to our schools promptly. Can you please guarantee to our schools that Riverside County Animal Services will provide the same services for our school campuses? I watched the last Riverside County BOS meeting where it was discussed that Riverside may possibly employ five SB Animal control officers. This is necessary and we need the five additional animal control officers.

With budget cuts on campuses we already have a lack of staff. We need animal control officers to immediately get to the schools to take the dogs and cats. This is a safety issue.

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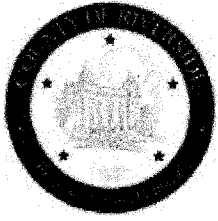

Hello. I am aware of the current financial situation, where we're \$22 million in the hole. I understand services need to be cut in some department. We are all worried about which departments they may be. What scares me is that the animals will be the one to bear the brunt of the pain. So naturally I would find it worrisome to hear that you may be considering taking on another city's financial burden. I care deeply about the animals and am very involved in helping them. But that is exactly what San Bernardino officials see it as, and what it would be for us taxpayers.

I have so many questions and concerns.

- *Additional kennel staff, animal control officers, and shelter space will be needed to accommodate the animals. Are taxpayers paying for this?
- *Where will an additional 187 animals each week go? Dogs will be at risk of injuries and even death, when you cram that many more into each kennel.
- *How many animals will immediately be euthanized upon intake due to lack of space?
- * How will you contain disease, when you already have distemper outbreaks often? How will you ISO all these new arrivals?
- *How much of a decrease in the Live Release rate will Riverside see of it's own intakes, due to their animals now competing to be adopted or rescued among an additional 9,640 more animals?
- *What happens when Riverside realizes that 40% of the intakes from SBC are cats, and they far exceed the 15 total that Dr. Drusys feels in sufficient for a shelter to have available to the public?

This would be financial irresponsible of you guys to put us in this position, as well as the animals who would suffer for lack of sufficient funding. PLEASE do not sign the contract with San Bernardino City. Thank you

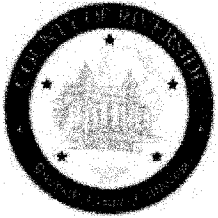

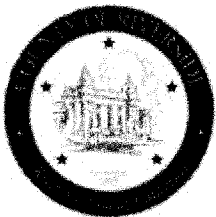

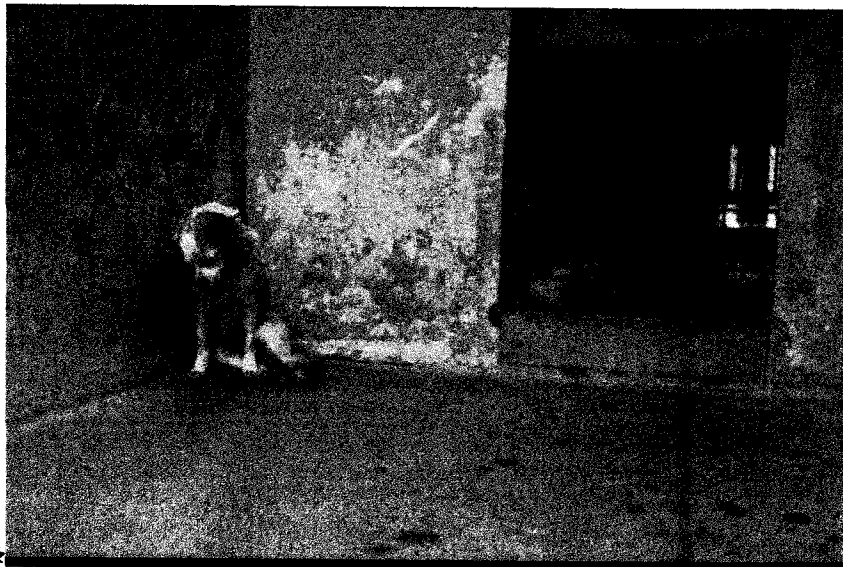

Subject: A heartfelt plea

Riverside officials, I want to first thank you for listening to us at your last meeting. Mayor Valdivia fiddles with his phone, and leaves the room, when people are speaking to him at the podium. He sits there anxious to respond, "Okay next speaker." He does not listen to his constituents.

I understand BOS Karen Spiegel, you and Mayor Valdivia has been diligently working behind closed doors, to push the shelter contract through, for whatever it takes. Lack of transparency is never good. Mayor Validiia is anxious to push this contract through, even if the Mayor must lie to you, Riverside officials. The fact he's telling you there's only 6,500 animals which includes a small percent of cats, is a bold faced lie. If you really care about the animals, you will question what is San Bernardino going to do with their cats? 40% of the intakes are cats, and most of them are feral.

Dr. Drusys, how do you feel about ferals again??? How many cats do you think a shelter should have available? A LOT less than SBC will have.

Last year 8,000 animals came through that door. It does NOT include parking lot intercepts, that rescue did when they were at the shelter to pull other animals. One rescue alone told me they intercepted about over 1,000 animals. Now that there will be no shelter there for the rescues to visit, there will be no one there to intercept these animals. Someone will need to step up and take possession of these animals, and deliver them to Riverside to then be surrendered. You're intakes are going to be more like 10,000.

These intercepts include cats, most that are feral. The contract states that Riverside will NOT take ferals. I understand the Mayor doesn't care if the city is over run with loose dogs running all over, and feral cats taking over the place. He'll probably eventually send people out to trap and kill them. But I'm curious if Riverside officials are fine with this? Where does your conscious stand?

Can you explain what happens when the \$2.1 million doesn't cover the unexpected number of animals coming into your facility, and you want more money, but the Mayor has been recalled, and the one replacing him doesn't think you need more funds? Will Riverside officials simply turn their back on these animals, start killing more intakes, or sell them to laboratories? Word is you guys play with your numbers now. If you need to put down animals, you claim they're "untreatable." Will we see more "untreatables?"

If you don't have the room for intakes because you're full, will you start turning away Riverside's animals or kill them upon arrival?

Simply put, for SO MANY REASONS, this is a disaster to happen should you sign this contract.

There are so many options available to SBC. First off, they have lied about their operating budget. They have \$700,000 sitting in the shelter fund. They don't pay for anything for the animals. Ice, A/C unit, a washer, beds, blankets, tick preventative, soap, cleaner, shampoo, food, and more has been donated over the years. Their biggest expenses are the police department's salaries. Why do we have a \$260,000 police lieutenant running an animal shelter?? Why are we NOW bringing in another police department official? I'm not sure what Adam Affrunti's salary is, but you can be sure it's than the \$80,000 the last manager was paid.

At this stage, I think it's best Riverside turns down the contract and allows for SBC officials to truly consider other options, which they never did. Capt Green has done nothing but lie about how many animals you will get, and how much it would cost to rebuild a shelter. It's apparent they have some skin in the game here, to get this contract passed.

Please do the right thing. Worry about your own animals, and make it a goal to reduce your euth rate, and your untreatables. You also need to focus on your own financial situation.

This cannot happen. Last year's intake in SBC was 8,000 animals. When you add parking lot intercepts by rescues that never made it into the shelter, the figures reach more than 10,000. 10,000 more animals coming into the Riverside Shelter will result in thousands more deaths to homeless animals every year, including those from Riverside city. There simply isn't enough space to isolate an additional 200 animals PER WEEK, or to kennel them as well. Also, note Riverside does NOT TAKE FERAL CATS. Feral cats make up a huge percent of the population at SBC.

SB taxpayers note, the contract provides for an "adjustment" from \$2.1 million annual cost to an UNCAPPED increase after 6 months. If you don't care about animals, you should care about where your tax dollars are going!

Keep San Bernardino City Shelter open and improve it. It can be done and not at the inflated estimate the PD is throwing out there! They never sought estimates, nor did they allow for a RFP process.

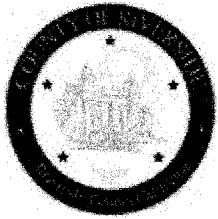

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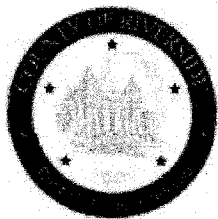

Dear Supervisors:

Here we are again dealing with this contract to take on the animal control for the City of San Bernardino. I don't know why we're doing this yet again. San Bernardino needs to take care of their own animal control issues and build a new shelter or rehab the one they have.

Riverside Animal Control had its budget cut. The shelter does not have the room or staffing to handle the additional animals, over 7000, that would come in from San Bernardino. The shelter director stated at your last meeting that no adoptable dog is euthanized. The staff designates a large number of dogs un-adoptable due to kennel stress or aggressiveness. The dogs are then euthanized. The reality of the situation is that animals become stressed in the noisy, loud, shelter setting with multiple animals in each kennel. Some animals may appear aggressive but its strictly due to the situation they are put in, including owner surrenders which confuse the animal. Many dogs recover from these issues once they leave the shelter. Everyday there are lists of dogs facing euthanasia. This is very frustrating for animal rescuers and others like myself. concerned for the animal's welfare. Also, the cat population including feral cats is another whole issue. Riverside Shelter already euthanizes a large number of cats. How will this change with many more coming in daily.

Please do not sign this contract for animal control for San Bernardino. There are many rescues and volunteers willing to take over the shelter operations in San Bernardino. If Riverside County refuses the contract, the city will be forced to work with these groups.

Taking on the responsibility for an additional 8,000+ (conservative estimate) animals is not feasible for a system that is already strained to keep up with the demand for our own city/county. Riverside County Animal Services does their best to maintain the health and well being of animals already in their care, but are currently forced to euthanize thousands of animals each year.

According to the department statistics, which can be found on their website, Riverside County Shelters took in 40,761 animals for the 2018 calendar year, of those 11,256 animals were euthanized or died. Over ELEVEN THOUSAND ANIMALS. What will that number look like when we add an additional 8,000 plus animals?

Budgets, resources and adoption partners are already strained. There is no guarantee that the City of San Bernardino would be able to satisfy their payment obligations for the contract, where will the funding come from then? Ultimately Riverside residents and animals will pay the price.

The proposed contract is not good for Riverside County Residents or Animals. Again, I respectfully request that you vote against entering into this contract with City of San Bernardino.

Subject: A heartfelt plea

Riverside officials, I want to first thank you for listening to us at your last meeting. Mayor Valdivia fiddles with his phone, and leaves the room, when people are speaking to him at the podium. He sits there anxious to respond, "Okay next speaker." He does not listen to his constituents.

I understand BOS Karen Spiegel, you and Mayor Valdivia has been diligently working behind closed doors, to push the shelter contract through, for whatever it takes. Lack of transparency is never good. Mayor Valdivia is anxious to push this contract through, even if the Mayor must lie to you, Riverside officials. The fact he's telling you there's only 6,500 animals which includes a small percent of cats, is a bold faced lie. If you really care about the animals, you will question what is San Bernardino going to do with their cats? 40% of the intakes are cats, and most of them are feral.

Dr. Drusys, how do you feel about ferals again??? How many cats do you think a shelter should have available? A LOT less than SBC will have.

Last year 8,000 animals came through that door. It does NOT include parking lot intercepts, that rescue did when they were at the shelter to pull other animals. One rescue alone told me they intercepted about over 1,000 animals. Now that there will be no shelter there for the rescues to visit, there will be no one there to intercept these animals. Someone will need to step up and take possession of these animals, and deliver them to Riverside to then be surrendered. Your intakes are going to be more like 10,000.

These intercepts include cats, most that are feral. The contract states that Riverside will NOT take ferals. I understand the Mayor doesn't care if the city is over run with loose dogs running all over, and feral cats taking over the place. He'll probably eventually send people out to trap and kill them. But I'm curious if Riverside officials are fine with this? Where does your conscious stand?

Can you explain what happens when the \$2.1 million doesn't cover the unexpected number of animals coming into your facility, and you want more money, but the Mayor has been recalled, and the one replacing him doesn't think you need more funds? Will Riverside officials simply turn their back on these animals, start killing more intakes, or sell them to laboratories? Word is you guys play with your numbers now. If you need to put down animals, you claim they're "untreatable." Will we see more "untreatables?"

If you don't have the room for intakes because you're full, will you start turning away Riverside's animals or kill them upon arrival?

Simply put, for SO MANY REASONS, this is a disaster to happen should you sign this contract.

There are so many options available to SBC. First off, they have lied about their operating budget. They have \$700,000 sitting in the shelter fund. They don't pay for anything for the animals. Ice, A/C unit, a washer, beds, blankets, tick preventative, soap, cleaner, shampoo, food, and more has been donated over the years. Their biggest expenses are the police department's salaries. Why do we have a \$260,000 police lieutenant running an animal shelter?? Why are we NOW bringing in another police department official? I'm not sure what Adam Affrunti's salary is, but you can be sure it's than the \$80,000 the last manager was paid.

At this stage, I think it's best Riverside turns down the contract and allows for SBC officials to truly consider other options, which they never did. Capt Green has done nothing but lie about how many animals you will get, and how much it would cost to rebuild a shelter. It's apparent they have some skin in the game here, to get this contract passed.

Please do the right thing. Worry about your own animals, and make it a goal to reduce your euth rate, and your untreatables. You also need to focus on your own financial situation.

To Whom it May Concern:

I cannot attend the 5/21/19 meeting, but I emailed the County Board of Supervisors and wanted to have the below shared as public record.

I support San Bernardino outsourcing to Western Riverside's facility with a local rescue center run by a non-profit in partnership with the city of San Bernardino to serve as an owner surrender and stray drop off, a cattery with a TNR/RTF program and other resources for San Bernardino residents. This stance makes me a target, but I'm willing to go against the grain for what I feel is right based on my experience as a San Bernardino resident, rescue President, teacher in Rialto with similar demographics, and now as Vice Chair of the Animal Control Commission — all of which gives me a view into the different worlds that affect animal care, control and welfare in San Bernardino.

I was one who spoke out last June against outsourcing because I felt we needed time to research funding possibilities and give non-profits the year to come up with financing to rebuild. I started to rethink my stance after we several sick dogs, discussions with members of the rescue community that showed a lack of municipal sheltering knowledge, joining the Commission, and also witnessing the damage the online social media presence has caused our city.

While a group of SBC networkers with a large following are adamantly against outsourcing, they do not represent everyone in the rescue community or all residents of San Bernardino; most on the other side of the issue or somewhere in between, are hesitant to speak up because of the outrage that is directed toward anyone who disagrees. The animal control commission will not discuss their opinions about the shelter issue at our meetings, even though that is the current focus, for fear of being targeted.

Another point to consider -- the animal control commission's non-profit proposal subcommittee ^{Support} has been working on several solutions to the problems that could arise from outsourcing. The committee had requested nonprofit proposals, we received proposal ideas from one non-profit - The PAW Mission - and had been working on a few scenarios with them, including the resources they could provide if the city outsourced and if they did not. That process was put on hold when Councilwoman Ibarra motioned to remove the police department from oversight and open up an RFP to nonprofits to completely take over the shelter. We have been in a holding pattern since.

If the Riverside contract is approved, the city is putting out an RFP for non-profits to propose an intake center/adoption center/rescue center - where locals can drop off strays and owner surrenders. The overseeing rescue group can network owner surrenders from there and hopefully hold strays for a duration of stray hold to give locals a chance to reclaim them there. This center can also serve as a low cost/free spay & neuter, vaccination & chip clinic, educational center as well as a cattery for friendly cats with programs for ferals. This is a manageable and feasible enterprise for a non-profit that could grow.

There are many positives moving forward, but we have not been able to work toward solutions while the current shelter remains open in a state of disrepair and the status quo persists. Some say why not just have a 501(c)(3) run the current shelter? There are a host of legitimate concerns about that, most having to do with the city possibly teetering on the edge of bankruptcy again, lack of support and resources the city can feasibly extend to a non-profit running a volunteer program, the conditions of the building and the processes required to renovate, the intake of SBC, the condition of the dogs we pull from SBC — the majority have kennel cough and worse due to no airtight quarantine, no onsite vet or RVT, others had serious injury or illness shelter staff wasn't even aware of, like our Buddy pulled right after the city voted to wait a year on outsourcing, who was septic with a hole in his neck leaking green and yellow puss due to a ruptured abscess staff didn't notice — all of which is due to the state of the facility, the overwhelming intake, lack of funds, etc., and made me reassess my stance on outsourcing.

I'm hoping we can once and for all move forward with a group of rescues working in partnership with the cities of Riverside and San Bernardino on a local, manageable rescue center and finally bring some peace to our city and its animals. There are no easy answers, but we simply can't move forward on solutions while the shelter issue remains in limbo. San Bernardino needs a few years to rebuild itself, and during that time we can look into land grants, bond and tax measures, etc., or a non-profit can work on funding for a private facility and bid on private sheltering services. Eventually San Bernardino will need to bring a shelter back with well-developed relationships with rescues and spay/neuter & other education programs already in place. We are nowhere near that point at the moment.

Thank you for considering my position.

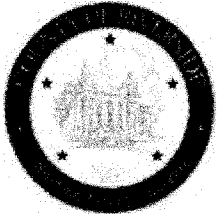
