BACKGROUND:

Summary

Waste Collection Franchise Agreements covering most unincorporated portions of Riverside County were phased in between 1997 and 1998. Within each of the existing eleven Franchise Agreements is a provision for an annual adjustment of the rates effective each July 1st. The franchise areas (Areas) are spread throughout the entire county unincorporated area and are present within each Supervisor's District.

This adjustment allows a pass through for any changes to landfill costs including the Alternative Daily Cover surcharge or transfer station fees, plus an increase based on Consumer Price Index (CPI) for the balance of the rate. There will also be the continued adjustment of fees charged in Desert Center due to the reduction of the County subsidy. Costs are adjusted by the CPI for the Riverside/San Bernardino/Ontario, CA, as published by the United States Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics. The proposed rates were adjusted as delineated in the franchise agreement using a CPI of 3.0% for the twelve (12) month period January 2018 through December 2018.

The detailed rate calculation worksheets factoring in the CPI increase have been reviewed for accuracy and the updated rate sheets are maintained by the Department of Environmental Health.

Recycling Processing Fees

California Law mandates each jurisdiction divert at least 50% of the waste material it generates. To meet that mandate, the waste haulers provide residential curbside recycling bins and commercial recycling bins to divert recyclables to processors and away from the landfill. In the past these programs provided the waste haulers with a marketable commodity that could be used to offset the costs associated with collection, processing and transporting recyclable materials to other markets. Recent changes in the global market for recyclable materials have had a negative impact on a large number of recyclable material types and raised the price of processing and moving material while also depressing the commodity prices of those materials. Foreign initiatives, such as Green Fence, National Sword and Blue Sky from China, have limited

or removed markets for materials while also causing a ripple effect of similar limitations or bans in other countries where recyclable materials were previously accepted.

To offset the rising costs of recyclable collection, the waste haulers in all franchise areas are requesting the addition of a new line item to the rate schedules that accounts for the cost of processing recyclable material. These costs are based on the previous year's costs for collection, processing and transport of recyclables. This new line item will not be subject to annual CPI adjustments but will be based on the prior year's actual costs for recycling processing.

For the 19/20 fiscal year, CR&R, Inc. is requesting a \$0.54 monthly increase for all residential customers with recycling bins.

Impact on Residents and Businesses


The current typical residential account pays between \$24.44 to \$35.47 a month. The approval of the proposed 3.0% CPI increase and recycling processing fee would result in residential rates ranging between \$25.71 to \$37.07 per month. Commercial customers rates vary based on the size of bins and frequency of services provided. Waste service would increase by 3.0% of the base rate.

The approval of this change will result in no cost to the County; implementation expenses are borne by the franchisee.

RESOLUTION NO. 2019-081

A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE ESTABLISHING WASTE HAULER FEES

FOR CR&R, INC., IN FRANCHISE AREAS 5, 6, 7, 8, 9 AND 13

WHEREAS, California Government Code section 25827 authorizes the Board of Supervisors to prescribe terms and conditions for the collection of solid waste in the unincorporated areas of Riverside County;

and

WHEREAS, California Public Resources Code section 40059 authorizes the County of Riverside to determine all aspects of solid waste handling which are of local concern, including whether the services are to be provided by nonexclusive franchise, and the charges and fees for such service; and

WHEREAS, Riverside County Ordinance 745 has established that a solid waste hauler, duly permitted or franchised by the County of Riverside, shall be entitled to payment for services rendered in the amounts as specified in a Resolution adopted by the Board of Supervisors; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors recognizes the benefits of entering into Waste Hauler Franchise Agreements for the efficiency of solid waste management; and






