



BACKGROUND:

Summary

Riverside County Information Technology (RCIT) is committed to providing the best information technology (IT) and communication services possible to our county departments. RCIT's optimized service delivery model and investments in the County's IT infrastructure, such as the state of the art RC3 Data Center, the Converged Communication Network, and Public Safety Enterprise Communication (PSEC) System have further enhanced RCIT's ability to serve our county departments and its citizens.

In addition to our county departments, RCIT provides a relatively small but important level of IT and communication services to a number of external agencies as well. Agencies such as the California Highway Patrol (CHP), Inland Empire Health Plan (IEHP), State Employment Development Department (SEDD), and many others use and depend on the services of RCIT. In fact, RCIT (including PSEC and RC3 Data Center) provides IT and communication services to nearly 90 external customers, which generates approximately \$1,500,000 in receivables to the County each year. In some instances, the outside agencies ask the County to sign one of their service/procurement agreements in order to process payment for services provided.

On May 12, 2015 (3-26), the Board previously granted the authority to the CIO to sign these agreements, and it is again necessary to obtain board authorization for the CIO to continue to sign such agreements. Specifically, today's action would reauthorize the CIO to sign revenue-generating information technology services agreements with non-county agencies up to \$50,000 per agency, per year, as approved by County Counsel. This includes non-RC3 related IT and communication services, such as the agreements with CHP and SEDD for telephone services. RC3 related services are covered separately under Ordinance No. 861 and Board Action Item 3-19 (9/30/14), which specifically authorizes the CIO to enter into license agreements with external customers to provide rack and square footage space at the RC3 Data Center.

Today's action also includes PSEC use agreements with non-county agencies up to \$50,000 per agency, per year, as approved by County Counsel who utilize the Public Safety Enterprise Communication (PSEC) System. Since January of 2014, when PSEC became operational many of the County's cities have joined the PSEC system, realizing the County's vision of creating a

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regional radio system to enable interoperability among all city and county public safety entities and allow for a coordinated response in the event of a multi-jurisdictional emergency or disaster.

Approval of this item will allow RCIT to continue to serve as a collaborative county partner in assisting state, local, and other outside entities with IT and communication services.

Impact on Residents and Businesses

Assisting these outside entities with IT and communication services has a positive impact on their ability to serve the citizens and businesses of the County. Also, by adding PSEC users it will facilitate the greatest level of safety and support for the residents of Riverside County.
