

**BACKGROUND:** Community Improvement Designation funds will be given to the following organizations:

1. Riverside County Office of Education: These funds will provide additional resources for the Student Scholarship Program to the youth of Riverside County.
2. Beaumont Community Chamber of Commerce: These funds will provide supplemental assistant to the yearly functions of the chamber which are used to promote business development.
3. Banning Cultural Alliance: These funds will help support the Ensemble Concerts by the Redlands Symphony and the Banning Art Gallery that support the quality of life for residents.
4. City of Perris: These funds will help support our senior citizens by developing and supporting existing programs that improve their quality of life.
5. DeAnn's Pass Kids: These funds will help support programs tailored for people with special needs. It will expand the opportunity to enjoy extracurricular sports such as baseball and basketball. I helps promote health, safety and relationship building.
6. Reach Out West End, Inc.: These funds will provide the needed resources to promote health, public safety, economic prosperity and youth development for the residents of Riverside County. The funds will help continue the National Innovative Conference.
7. Edward Dean Museum: These funds will support the preservation of history in a collection of pieced from 16<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> century Asian and European furnishings. The funding will help keep cost low and provide an avenue for education in the pass.
8. Perris Valley Filipino-American Assoc.: These funds will provide support for cultural advancement and preservation of the organization along with community outreach in behavioral health awareness and community events.

9. Perris Valley Chamber of Commerce: These funds will continue to support the yearly functions of the chamber that actively promotes business development in the region. The events that the chamber puts on increases the quality of life for many residents in the Perris valley.
10. UC Riverside Presley Center of Crime & Justice: These funds will support scholarship opportunities for students by participating in evidence based research that promotes public safety.
11. Habitat for Humanity San Gorgonio Pass Area: These funds will provide supplemental support for affordable housing as well as beautification projects in the pass area. Through their "A Brush with Kindness" various volunteers aim to improve the quality of life for low-income families.
12. KVCR Educational Foundation, Inc.: These funds will continue to support academic research and television broadcasting of documentaries focused in the Inland Empire. Through their Uncovered in the Archives stories are told, researched and preserved for future generations.
13. Enhance the Gift Ministries: These funds will support visual and performing arts programs through a summer camp. It will support youth development through dance and music.
14. Community Center for Healthy Minds: These funds will continue to support the efforts made to reduce DUI accidents through educational programs. It aims to reduce accidents and raise awareness to better serve public health.
15. Riverside County District Attorney Victim Services: These funds will continue to support the yearly Candlelight Vigils that provide victims' families a time where they can honor their loved ones.
16. Southern California Railway Museum: These funds will help promote, establish and expand programs tailored for education.
