BACKGROUND:

Summary

The Executive Office administers the Litigation and Legislative Administration budget unit which pays for various countywide efforts including contracts with state and federal lobbyists, countywide memberships and legal costs of county litigation. Costs for outside counsel and County Counsel have been higher than expected this fiscal year. County Counsel costs have increased in an effort to reduce outside counsel costs and annual attorney costs have decreased from \$450,000 to less than \$200,000, however it is necessary that certain litigation has an outside counsel representation. The use of special counsel is limited to complex litigation where County Counsel does not possess the specialized knowledge and experience. A budget adjustment is needed to pay the remaining invoices.

County Counsel continues to process all bail bonds in the County on behalf of both the County and all of the cities as required by law. In prior years, the department absorbed these costs, but due to the significant resources required to review, evaluate, and litigate each matter, along with administrative oversight required for each bond, the department has developed a streamlined approach to reduce cost and increase efficiency. Given the breadth of resources required by the department to process each bond, the department is no longer able to absorb these costs. Any forfeited bond funds are deposited into the Contribution to Trial Court Fund. A budget adjustment is needed to cover the cost of these invoices.

Additional Fiscal Information

Costs for outside counsel and County Counsel are higher than anticipated in FY 18/19, therefore a budget adjustment is needed to increase appropriations.
