BACKGROUND:

Summary

On July 15, 2014 (Minute Order 3.21), the Board accepted the California Energy Commission (CEC) Electric Vehicle (EV) Infrastructure Grant to establish a larger presence of EV Charging Stations throughout the County. Funding for the stations has been exhausted and the CEC grant requires that we develop operational guidelines and rates for the public use of the stations. Market research and ChargePoint consultants recommend the establishment of a competitive rate as an approach to promote the continued high usage of the stations. Market behavior analysis indicates possible impacts to demand that will self-correct over time and further mitigated by the promotion of the sites. The rate will assist in the recovery of operational costs for the stations such as network, maintenance, and electricity usage. The Economic Development Agency's (EDA) Energy Management Division will monitor the use of the stations to determine if further guidelines need to be established.

On December 11, 2018 (Minute Order 3.14), the County of Riverside Board of Supervisors adopted the Initiation of Proposal to establish new EV charging station rates through County Parking Ordinance 626 as it relates to County Parking Facilities. The Board approved the Introduction of Ordinance 626.10, an amendment to County of Riverside Ordinance No. 626 relating to parking fees, on June 18, 2019. Through the adoption of amended County Parking Ordinance 626, the county will satisfy the CEC grant requirement as well as provide uniform utilization procedures and full cost recovery of the station's maintenance and electricity costs. The proposed rates and operational guidelines are included in the attached Parking Ordinance 626 amendment.

Per Board Policy A-5, EDA has worked in conjunction with the Auditor-Controller's Office in the establishment of the rate methodology and utilization plan.

Impact on Residents and Businesses



Additional Fiscal Information

The EV charging stations are a new service provided by the County and an evaluation of the program will be completed after one year of use and monitored throughout the year. Usage, expenditures, and revenues will be evaluated at each of the charging stations. It is estimated that the new rates will allow for full cost recovery of EV charging station utilization. The department will return to the board if adjustments are needed for cost recovery.

3 AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE
4 AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 626 RELATING TO
5 COUNTY PARKING FACILITIES

6 The Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside ordains as follows:

7 Section 1. Ordinance No. 626 is amended in its entirety to read as follows:

9 "ORDINANCE NO. 626

10
11 AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE
12 RELATING TO COUNTY PARKING FACILITIES

13
14 Section 1. PURPOSE. The purpose of this ordinance is to establish regulations
15 concerning the use and operation of County Parking Facilities.

16 Section 2. AUTHORITY. This Ordinance is adopted pursuant to California Vehicle
17 Code Sections 21113 and 22519.

18 Section 3. DEFINITIONS. As used in this ordinance, the following terms shall have
19 the following meanings:

- 20 a. County. The County of Riverside.
- 21 b. County Employee. A person who works for, or with, the County of
22 Riverside in a permanent, Temporary Assignment Program (TAP),
23 contractor, intern or volunteer position or a person who has been issued
24 or who has purchased an employee, volunteer, contractor or temporary
25 parking permit.
- 26 c. County Vehicle. A vehicle owned or leased by the County.
- 27 d. Driveway. An entrance or exit used by vehicles to access County Parking
28 Facilities or a vehicle corridor within County Parking Facilities.

- 1 e. EDA. The County of Riverside Economic Development Agency.
- 2 f. Electric Vehicle Charging Stall. A marked parking stall with a device or
- 3 station installed that provides power to charge the batteries of an electric
- 4 vehicle.
- 5 g. Handbill. Any printed or written matter, circular, flyer, leaflet, pamphlet,
- 6 paper, booklet or any other printed matter or literature which is not
- 7 delivered by United States mail.
- 8 h. Parking Access Device. A device enabling a vehicle to enter and exit
- 9 County Parking Facilities to which access is controlled. Parking access
- 10 devices shall include, but are not limited to, parking access cards and
- 11 transponders.
- 12 i. Parking Facility. A parking structure or surface parking lot owned, leased
- 13 or operated by the County in or upon which the County allows the parking
- 14 of motor vehicles, whether located within the unincorporated area of the
- 15 County or within the boundaries of an incorporated City.
- 16 j. Parking Stall. The area between two parallel lines painted on the ground
- 17 or the area between lines forming a "T" or "L" painted on the ground.
- 18 Parking stalls shall not include hatched or crosshatched areas painted on
- 19 the ground or any areas fully enclosed by solid lines painted on the
- 20 ground.
- 21 k. Parking Structure – A building for the parking of motor vehicles, having
- 22 two or more tiers or levels and with the top tier either roofed or not.
- 23 l. Permanently Affixed. Incapable of being removed without destruction.
- 24 m. Reserved Parking Stall. A Parking Stall that is designated by a sign,
- 25 stenciling or both that has been assigned to a specific person or
- 26 department.
- 27 n. Surface Parking Lot – An open area designated for parking motor
- 28 vehicles, both secured and non-secured.

1 Section 4. APPLICATION. This ordinance shall apply to all County Parking Facilities
2 that have signs posted at each entrance bearing substantially the following language:
3 "PARKING BY PERMIT ONLY – VIOLATORS WILL BE CITED – Riverside County Ordinance
4 No. 626" or "COUNTY PARKING ORDINANCE NO. 626 STRICTLY ENFORCED."

5 Section 5. PARKING PERMITS. Except as provided in Section 6 of this Ordinance,
6 parking in County Parking Facilities, shall be regulated by the following permits and devices:

- 7 a. Employee Permit – A vehicle properly displaying a current, EDA-
8 authorized permit may park in any employee-only, designated parking
9 facility in the County, provided any applicable fee has been paid.
- 10 b. Temporary or Volunteer Permit – A Temporary Permit is a paper permit,
11 which may be issued for up to one (1) month. Up to three (3) Temporary
12 Permits may be issued per calendar year to an individual. A Volunteer
13 Permit may be issued for up to six (6) consecutive months. A vehicle
14 displaying either one of these permits may be parked in the employee-
15 only areas of all County Parking Facilities, provided any applicable fees
16 have been paid and all information fields on the application have been
17 filled out completely.
- 18 c. Carpool Parking Placard – A vehicle properly displaying this permit may
19 park in the carpool-only areas of all County Parking Facilities, provided
20 the vehicle displaying the Carpool Parking Placard is a marked County
21 vehicle, has properly displayed an authorized Employee Permit, or has
22 properly displayed a Temporary Permit, and all applicable fees have been
23 paid.
- 24 d. Parking Validation Stickers – A Parking Validation Sticker in one-hour or
25 two-hour increments may be issued by a County department or division
26 for authorized, visiting guests in any County fee-charging Parking
27 Structure. Issued validation stickers must be equal to or greater than the
28 fees due. A maximum of eight (8) hours validates a full day of parking in

County-owned Surface Parking Lots or Parking Structures. Validation stickers may be purchased through the EDA Parking Services Office.

e. Parking Access Device – A person in possession of this device may enter and exit the assigned County Parking Facilities allowing access to those assigned Parking Facilities, provided that all applicable fees have been paid.

f. Parking Vouchers – A person may obtain a Parking Voucher from the Clerk of the Board when attending a scheduled meeting of the Board of Supervisors to testify or address the Board. A person in possession of a Parking Voucher may park their vehicle in the County-owned Parking Structure located at 3535 12th Street or 4080 Lemon Street (County Administrative Center) during the Board of Supervisors' meeting without paying the usual, required fee.

g. Temporary Training/Meeting Permit – A Temporary Training/Meeting Permit is a paper permit printed and issued by a County department other than EDA/Parking Services. This permit shall be issued for a maximum of one (1) day and contain the driver name, vehicle license plate number, effective date, location and name of the department issuing the permit. A vehicle displaying this permit may be parked in the employee-only stalls of all County Parking Facilities, providing all applicable fees have been paid and all information fields that are required have been filled out completely. These Temporary Training/Meeting Permits will be issued by the department conducting the training or meeting after the permit has been reviewed and approved by the EDA Parking Services Office.

h. After Hours Placard – An After Hours Placard is a hanging placard issued to non-County employees. The placard shall list the dates on which it is effective. A vehicle properly displaying this placard may be parked in the

1 employee-only areas of all County Parking Facilities from the hours of
2 5:00p.m. – 5:00a.m. daily, provided all applicable fees have been paid.

3 Section 6. PARKING PERMIT EXCEPTION. No parking permit of any type is
4 required for non-employees to park in the public-only areas of all County Parking Facilities.

5 Section 7. PROPER DISPLAY OF PARKING PERMITS. Parking permits shall be
6 displayed in the follow manner:

7 a. The parking permit referenced in section 5.a of this ordinance shall be
8 permanently affixed to the front of the parked vehicle's windshield, four
9 (4) to six (6) inches from the bottom of the windshield on the passenger
10 side of the vehicle.

11 b. The parking permits referenced in sections 5.b and 5.g of this ordinance
12 shall be displayed from the rearview mirror or shall be displayed on the
13 dashboard of the vehicle in a manner such that the permits themselves
14 and their effective dates, names and license plate numbers are fully
15 visible from the outside of the vehicle.

16 c. The parking placards referenced in sections 5.c and 5.h of this ordinance
17 shall be hung from the rearview mirror of the vehicle or shall be otherwise
18 made completely visible from the outside of the vehicle.

19 Section 8. RESERVED PARKING SPACES. The Assistant County Executive
20 Officer/ECD, or his or her designee, shall direct and control the designation of reserved parking
21 spaces. Pursuant to Vehicle Code Section 22511.8, he or she may reserve parking spaces for
22 the exclusive use of any disabled person or disabled veteran displaying a special license plate
23 or placard issued in accordance with Vehicle Code Sections 22511.55 and 22511.59. The
24 Assistant County Executive Officer/ECD, or his or her designee, may also reserve parking
25 space for the exclusive use of County officials, agencies, departments or employees.

26 Section 9. PROHIBITED ACTIVITIES RELATED TO PARKING. No County employee,
27 on or off duty, shall park a vehicle in the public-only areas of any County Parking Facility unless
28

1 parked in an electric vehicle charging space while actively charging the vehicle. No County
2 employee or any other person shall do any of the following:

- 3 a. Park in a designated disabled or disabled veteran parking space without
4 displaying a special license plate or placard, issued in accordance with
5 Vehicle Code Sections 22511.55 and 22511.59.
- 6 b. Park in an area not designated for parking.
- 7 c. Park in designated red zone.
- 8 d. Park in a reserved space without the appropriate authorization.
- 9 e. Park a County vehicle in a public-only parking area.
- 10 f. Park outside the confines of a parking space.
- 11 g. Occupy more than one (1) parking space.
- 12 h. Block or obstruct a driveway.
- 13 i. Fail to properly display a required parking permit.
- 14 j. Park with an expired permit.
- 15 k. Fail to pay a required monthly parking fee.
- 16 l. Fail to pay the required exit fee.
- 17 m. Violate a parking time limit.
- 18 n. Block or obstruct another vehicle.
- 19 o. Block or obstruct a toll booth.
- 20 p. Back a vehicle into a parking stall in a parking structure.
- 21 q. Alter or forge a parking permit.
- 22 r. Park a non-electric vehicle in an electric vehicle charging stall
- 23 s. Park any vehicle in an electric vehicle charging station stall while not
24 charging or after charging has been completed.
- 25 t. Charge a vehicle while not parked in a non-electrical vehicle charging
26 stall.

1 u. Park a non-County-owned vehicle in any County Parking Facility in
2 excess of twenty-four (24) hours without prior written authorization from
3 the Parking Services Office of EDA.

4 v. Park a non-County-owned vehicle in the Orange Street Parking Structure
5 located at 4293 Orange Street, Riverside, CA 92501.

6 Section 10. OTHER PROHIBITED ACTIVITIES. No County employee or any other
7 person shall deposit, fasten or leave any Handbill in or upon any vehicle located in a County
8 Parking Facility unless the occupant of such vehicle is present and willing to accept the
9 Handbill. The Board of Supervisors has adopted this content-neutral regulation to prevent the
10 littering and traffic safety problems associated with Handbill distribution in Parking Facilities.

11 Section 11. PARKING ACCESS DEVICE. No County employee or any other person
12 shall allow another vehicle to enter or exit a County Parking Facility using his or her parking
13 access device. No person shall lend, give or borrow another person's parking access device.

14 Section 12. ENFORCEMENT. This ordinance shall be enforced by a County
15 Parking/Ordinance Enforcement Officer under the direction and control of the Assistant County
16 Executive Officer/ECD or his or her designee.

17 Section 13. VIOLATIONS AND PENALTIES. Any person violating Section 9.a of this
18 Ordinance shall be punished by a three hundred sixty dollar (\$360.00) fine and may have his or
19 her parking permit or access device revoked. If a Section 9.a citation is canceled due to the
20 person who received the citation showing proof that he or she was issued a valid placard at the
21 time the citation was received, a twenty-five dollar (\$25.00) cancellation fee will be charged
22 pursuant to Vehicle Code Section 40226.

23 a. A one hundred dollar (\$100.00) additional penalty may be added to all
24 violations relating to disabled person spaces and placards. The collected
25 additional penalties shall set be set aside and be used for improving
26 enforcement of disabled person parking spaces and placards.

27 b. A 20% assessment may be added to all violations (on street or off street)
28 pertaining to disabled person spaces (including ramps and access).

1 Collected assessments shall be used by the County for services to elderly
2 or functionally impaired adults pursuant to Penal Code Section 1465.5.
3 Any person, who violates any other provision of Section 9 or 11 of this
4 Ordinance shall be issued a fifty-three dollar (\$53.00) fine and may have
5 his or her parking access device revoked. A twenty-five dollar (\$25.00)
6 fee may be added to any fine each time a check is returned for insufficient
7 funds, and an administrative charge may be added to any delinquent fine
8 to cover the cost of collection. Any person violating Section 10 of this
9 ordinance shall be: 1) guilty of an infraction offense and punished by a
10 fine, not to exceed one hundred dollars (\$100.00), for a first violation; and
11 2) guilty of an infraction offense and punished by a fine, not to exceed two
12 hundred dollars (\$200.00), for a second violation. The third violation and
13 any additional violations perpetrated by the same person within the same
14 calendar year shall constitute a misdemeanor offense and shall be
15 punishable by a fine, not to exceed one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00), or
16 six (6) months in jail, or both. Notwithstanding the above, a first or second
17 offense may be charged and prosecuted as a misdemeanor.

18 Section 14. REMOVAL OF VEHICLES. In addition to the penalties described in
19 Section 13 of this ordinance, a vehicle may be removed to the nearest public storage facility
20 under the circumstances described in Section 22658 of the Vehicle Code. In the event a vehicle
21 is removed, the notices required by Sections 22852 and 22853 of the Vehicle Code shall be
22 given.

23 Section 15. PARKING FEES. Parking fees related to the parking of vehicles in all
24 County Parking Facilities are hereby established as follows:

Section 16. SEVERABILITY. If any provision, clause, sentence or paragraph of this ordinance, or the application thereof to any person or circumstance, shall be held invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity shall not affect the remaining provisions of this ordinance, or the applications of such provisions, which can be given effect without the invalid provision or applications and, to that end, the provisions of this ordinance are hereby declared to be severable.

Section 17. EFFECTIVE DATE. This ordinance shall take effect thirty (30) days after its adoption."

This summary is presented pursuant to California Government Code Section 25124(b): a certified copy of the full text of Ordinance No. 626.10 may be examined at the Office of the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside, located at 4080 Lemon Street, 1st Floor, Riverside, California.

Ordinance No. 626.10 amends Ordinance No. 626 in its entirety to update the defined terms, parking permit descriptions, and other sections within the ordinance and to establish operational guidelines and rates for public use of county-owned Electric Vehicle (EV) charging stations. On July, 15 2014, the County of Riverside Board of Supervisors accepted the California Energy Commission (CEC) Electric Vehicle Infrastructure Grant to increase EV infrastructure in Riverside County. As part of the CEC grant, Riverside County is required to develop a rate for public use of county-owned EV charging stations. Through the amendment of County Parking Ordinance 626, the county will satisfy the CEC grant requirement as well as provide uniform utilization procedures and fully cost recovery of the station's maintenance and electricity costs.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 626
RELATING TO COUNTY PARKING FACILITIES

This summary is presented pursuant to California Government Code Section 25124(b): a certified copy of the full text of Ordinance No. 626.10 may be examined at the Office of the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside, located at 4080 Lemon Street, 1st Floor, Riverside, California.

Ordinance No. 626.10 amends Ordinance No. 626 in its entirety to update the defined terms, parking permit descriptions, and other sections within the ordinance and to establish operational guidelines and rates for public use of county-owned Electric Vehicle (EV) charging stations. On July, 15 2014, the County of Riverside Board of Supervisors accepted the California Energy Commission (CEC) Electric Vehicle Infrastructure Grant to increase EV infrastructure in Riverside County. As part of the CEC grant, Riverside County is required to develop a rate for public use of county-owned EV charging stations. Through the amendment of County Parking Ordinance 626, the county will satisfy the CEC grant requirement as well as provide uniform utilization procedures and fully cost recovery of the station's maintenance and electricity costs.

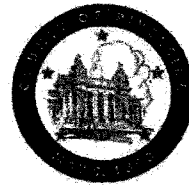

BACKGROUND:

Summary

On July 15, 2014 (Minute Order 3.21), the Board accepted the California Energy Commission (CEC) Electric Vehicle (EV) Infrastructure Grant to establish a larger presence of EV Charging Stations throughout the County. Funding for the stations has been exhausted and the CEC grant requires that we develop operational guidelines and rates for the public use of the stations. Market research and ChargePoint consultants recommend the establishment of a competitive rate as an approach to promote the continued high usage of the stations. Market behavior analysis indicates possible impacts to demand that will self-correct over time and further mitigated by the promotion of the sites. The rate will assist in the recovery of operational costs for the stations such as network, maintenance, and electricity usage. The Economic Development Agency's (EDA) Energy Management Division will monitor the use of the stations to determine if further guidelines need to be established.

On December 11, 2018 (Minute Order 3.14), the County of Riverside Board of Supervisors adopted the Initiation of Proposal to establish new EV charging station rates through County Parking Ordinance 626 as it relates to County Parking Facilities. The proposed rates and operational guidelines are included in the attached Parking Ordinance 626 amendment.

Per Board Policy A-5, EDA has worked in conjunction with the Auditor-Controller's Office in the establishment of the rate methodology and utilization plan.

Impact on Residents and Businesses


Residents, businesses, and visitors of community will have the availability of the use of clean energy for their transportation vehicles. With an increased number of electric vehicles on the road, the air quality of the County will improve the health of residents.

Additional Fiscal Information

The EV charging stations are a new service provided by the County and an evaluation of the program will be completed after one year of use and monitored throughout the year. Usage, expenditures, and revenues will be evaluated at each of the charging stations. It is estimated that the new rates will allow for full cost recovery of EV charging station utilization. The department will return to the board if adjustments are needed for cost recovery.
