Born on May 18, 1948 in Tucumcari, NM, Paul graduated from Ramona High School in Riverside in 1966 and then enlisted in the United States Army to serve in the war in Vietnam. He later completed Officer Candidate School and rose to the rank of Captain in the field artillery of the United States Army National Guard.

In his civilian life, Paul completed coursework at Riverside City College and Weber State University. He held positions in the restaurant, automotive, and newspaper industries. Many in the community knew him for dressing as Santa Claus to spread holiday cheer for families and friends. He loved history, motorsports, camping, and fishing.

Paul was a loving and devoted husband, father, brother, and friend. He is survived by his wife Kathy Wyatt-Adcock; his son Nicholas Adcock; his sisters Patty Sesler, Carolyn Stinson, and Nancy Adcock; and many more relatives. He was preceded in death by his wife Terry Adcock; his parents Dorothy and Paul Adcock; and his siblings Katherine Gilmer and Dell Adcock.

Born on September 15, 1935 in Rochester, New York, Al had four children, one step-child, eight grandchildren, and 12 great-grandchildren. He was married to his first wife Nancy for 33 years and was married to his second wife Pamela for 23 years. She passed away in 2017.

Al was a beloved member of the Canyon Lake community since 1975 and a "dear friend" of The Friday Flyer where he worked for over 18 years. He will always be remembered for his upbeat attitude and as a hard worker who was willing to help others.

For the past 30 years, Al played Santa at Breakfast with Santa, an annual event sponsored by the Ski Club. In recent years, he also played Santa at the City's annual Tree Lighting event. He was named Canyon Lake's "Volunteer of the Year" in 2010. In 2011 and 2014, Al was the recipient of the Ski Club's Ray Novak Perpetual Award. The award is presented to a member who is voted as the most actively valuable member during the year, both on and off the water. In 2017, he was honored as the Grand Marshal of Canyon Lake's Fiesta Day Parade.

An avid water skier, Al was Canyon Lake's oldest barefoot skier and was a member of the Ski Club for two decades, serving 10 of those years as president of the club. He was an essential part of developing water sports in Canyon Lake and taught many skiers the basics of skiing on the lake. During his retirement years, Al participated in ski tournaments throughout the United States, where he often won in his age division and set course records. He holds the slalom water ski record for his age division. In 2017, at the age of 80, he skied barefoot in Canyon Lake's annual Polar Bear Day.

Al was a loving and devoted husband, father, grandfather, great-grandfather, and friend. His memory and passionate spirit will live forever in the hearts of those who knew and loved him.
