

BACKGROUND:

Summary

The County of Riverside Transportation Department, in cooperation with the California State Department of Transportation (Caltrans), and the Coachella Valley Association of Governments (CVAG), proposes to construct a new bridge over the Union Pacific railroad (UPRR) tracks, State Route 111, and Hammond Avenue, in the community of Mecca. The railroad tracks run in a generally north-south direction and separate the Community of Mecca, on the east side of the tracks, from goods and services on the west side of the tracks. Currently, 4th Street is the only road that provides access to the community of Mecca and traffic going in and out of the community must wait at the tracks for trains to pass before they are able to cross. Due to projected regional population growth, the vehicular traffic and train traffic is expected to increase causing additional congestion and delays at the existing 4th Street crossing.

The new bridge over the railroad tracks along Avenue 66 will be constructed south of 4th Street and will provide a secondary uninterrupted access to the Community of Mecca. The proposed project will construct a two-lane roadway and elevated structure over the UPRR, Hammond Road and State Route 111 (SR 111) (Exhibit A).

The project includes realignment of a section of Avenue 66 (SR 111) and construction of a new bridge that crosses over existing SR 111. Because of the magnitude of work within Caltrans right-of-way a cooperative agreement is required by Caltrans to allow the County to construct the improvements within the Caltrans right of way and to designate the County as the sponsor and implementing agency for assuring the project is completed.

By Minute Order 3-38 of April 30, 2019, the Board of Supervisors approved an Agreement between the County of Riverside and Caltrans that outlined each agencies responsibility for the construction phase of the project. This Amendment No. 1 revises the Funding Summary Table and Spending Summary Table of the Agreement to more accurately reflect the funding that is programmed for the project. All other terms and conditions remain.

Construction is anticipated to begin in early 2020.

Environmental Findings

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On October 5, 2017, Caltrans, acting as lead agency for the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) and the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), made a Categorical Exemption/Categorical Exclusion Determination under Section 6005 of 23 U.S.C. 327, based on an examination of the proposed grade separation project and supporting information.

The Avenue 66/UPRR Project will improve access and safety in the Community of Mecca and improve goods and services movement through the region.



This Amendment No. 1 to Agreement 08-1695 (AMENDMENT), effective on
, is between the State of California, acting through its Department of
Transportation, referred to as CALTRANS, and Riverside County Transportation Department, a
political subdivision of the State of California, referred to hereinafter as COUNTY.

RECITALS

- CALTRANS and COUNTY collectively referred to as PARTIES, entered into Agreement No. 08-1695 on June 25, 2019, defining the terms and conditions for a new grade separation and roadway to cross the Union Pacific Railroad, State Route 111 (SR-111), and Hammond Road from a realigned SR-111/Avenue 66 in the Community of Mecca, California referred to as PROJECT.
- 2. The AGREEMENT established FUNDING SUMMARY NO. 1 AND SPENDING SUMMARY NO. 1
- 3. PARTIES now seek to revise funds by replacing FUNDING SUMMARY NO. 1 and SPENDING SUMMARY NO. 1 in its entirety with FUNDING SUMMARY NO. 2 and SPENDING SUMMARY NO. 2
