BACKGROUND:

Summary

Riverside County Children and Families Commission, First 5 Riverside (RCCFC/F5R) implements the provisions of Proposition 10, which provides tobacco tax funds to facilitate the creation and implementation of an integrated, comprehensive, and collaborative system of information and services to enhance optimal early childhood development and to ensure children are ready to learn and embrace lifelong learning.

Commission Membership

Statewide, the composition of commission membership, excluding the required appointees, varies both in number and the categories represented. It is recommended that the Commission remain at nine commission members to be selected and appointed as permitted by H&S Code, Ordinance No. 784, and Board Policy A-21.

Staff Recommendations:

At a previous Board of Supervisor's meeting on August 27, 2019 (Agenda Item 3.54), staff introduced Ordinance No. 784.11 to change the composition of the Commission to align with the Riverside County 2030 Vision. This Ordinance No. 784.11 is being reintroduced to include revisions requested at that meeting, including setting membership terms in alignment with the appointing Supervisor's term of service.

Proposed Membership: 9 members

Sitting members will be retained and membership will be reduced to be in alignment with appointing Board of Supervisor's term.

- One member of the Riverside County Board of Supervisors (no term);
- One member shall be from among the persons responsible for management of the County functions within the Human Service Portfolio specializing in children prenatal through age 5;
- One member shall be from among the Health Officer or persons responsible for management of County functions within the Riverside University Health System (i.e., Public Health, Behavioral Health or Medical Center and Clinics) specializing in children prenatal through age 5;
- One member shall be from a representative responsible for management of County functions from Riverside County Office of Education specializing in early childhood development;

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Five (5) members - a representative from each supervisorial district from among categories described in the Children and Families Act Health and Safety Code 130140 (A)(iii):


Composition of the proposed membership strengthens the creation of an integrated coordinated system for children and families by including experts from county departments while retaining a majority of members from the public in compliance with the Act.

1 the intent of this Ordinance to facilitate the creation and implementation of an integrated,
2 comprehensive, and collaborative system of information and services to enhance optimal
3 early childhood development. This system should function as a network that promotes
4 accessibility to all information and services from any entry point into the system. It is
5 further the intent of this Ordinance to emphasize local decision making, to provide for
6 greater local flexibility in designing delivery systems, and to eliminate duplicate
7 administrative systems.

8 The California Children and Families First Act of 1998 provides for funding
9 through an excise tax on tobacco products in order to implement the goals and objectives
10 which are outlined in the Act itself. It is the further intent of this Ordinance to create the
11 Riverside County Children and Families Commission and the Riverside County Children
12 and Families Trust Fund in order to receive funding through the Act and to implement the
13 goals and objectives outlined in the California Children and Families First Act of 1998.

14 Section 3. AUTHORITY. The creation of the Riverside County Children and families
15 first commission is made pursuant to Health and Safety Code Sections 130140, et seq.

16 Section 4. DEFINITIONS. As used in this ordinance, the following terms shall have
17 the following meanings:

- 18 A. "Act" means the California Children and Families First Act of 1998.
19 B. "California Children and Families Commission" means State Commission
20 established in accordance with Health and Safety Code Section 130110.
21 C. "Commission" means the Riverside County Children and Families
22 Commission established in accordance with Health and Safety Code Section
23 130140.
24 D. "County Strategic Plan" means the plans adopted by the Commission and
25 submitted to the California Children and families Commission pursuant to
26 Health and Safety Code Section 130140.
27 E. "Trust Fund" means the Children and Families Trust Fund established
28 pursuant to Health and Safety Code Section 130105.

1 Section 5. ESTABLISHMENT OF COMMISSION. There is established a
2 commission to be known as the Riverside County Children and Families Commission.
3 Such commission is a department agency of the County. Notwithstanding its status as a
4 department agency of the County, the Commission shall have, consistent with statutory
5 requirements, independent authority over the County Strategic Plan created pursuant to
6 Section 13 and the Trust Fund established pursuant to Section 6.

7 Section 6. ESTABLISHMENT OF TRUST FUND. There is established within the
8 County Treasury a trust fund to be designated as the Riverside County Children and
9 Families Trust Fund. All money received from the state commission to carry out the
10 provisions of the California Children and Families First Act of 1998 will be placed in the
11 Riverside County Children and Families Trust Fund, held by the County, for exclusive use
12 of the Commission. All interest gained from the Riverside County Children and Families
13 Trust Fund will be credited to the trust fund for use by the Commission.

14 Section 7. MEMBERSHIP. The Commission membership shall consist of nine
15 members.

16 A. One member shall be a member of the Board of Supervisors and will not
17 have a term limit.

18 B. Three (3) members shall be from among persons responsible for
19 management of County functions specializing in children prenatal through
20 age five (5) as follows:

21 One member shall be from within Human Service Portfolio; one member
22 shall be from among the Health Officer or Riverside University Health
23 System (i.e., Public Health, Behavioral Health or Medical Center and
24 Clinics); and one member shall be from Riverside County Office of
25 Education.

26 The four members described in Subsections A. and B. of this Section 7 shall
27 not be subject to the term limits specified in Section 8.

28 C. Each member of the Board of Supervisors shall appoint one member. It is

1 recommended that the appointment follow the suggested categories
2 described in the Children and Families Act, Health and Safety Code Section
3 130140 (A)(iii). These remaining members shall be any of the following:
4 (1) recipients of project services included in the County Strategic Plan; (2)
5 educators specializing in early childhood development; (3) representatives
6 of a local child care resource or referral agency, or a local child care
7 coordinating group; (4) representatives of a local organization for
8 prevention or early intervention for families at risk; (5) representatives of
9 community-based organizations that have the goal of promoting nurturing
10 and early childhood development; (6) representatives of local school
11 districts; and (7) representatives of local medical, pediatric, or obstetric
12 associations or societies. Although a member from each of the above-
13 referenced categories is not required, it is desirable that members from as
14 many categories as possible serve on the Commission at all times. Any
15 member appointed to the Commission pursuant to this subsection shall
16 reside and/or work in Riverside County at the time of appointment and for
17 the duration of his or her term.

18 D. One member of the Board of Supervisors shall serve as an alternate member
19 of the Commission.

20 Section 8. TERM.

21 Commission members shall serve at the pleasure of the Board of
22 Supervisors. Commission members who are appointed by the Board of
23 Supervisors shall serve a term of office in alignment with the appointing
24 Supervisor's term, absent removal by the Board of Supervisors, except as
25 otherwise provided in Section 7 of this Ordinance.

26 Section 9. VACANCIES AND REMOVAL.

27 A. A vacancy on the Commission occurs automatically on the happening of
28 any of the following events before the expiration of the term:

1. Removal of the incumbent for any reason;
2. Death or resignation of the incumbent;
3. Ceasing to be a representative from the categories provided for in Section 7; or
4. If the Commission holds only one regular meeting during each calendar month, absence from three (3) consecutive regular or special meeting or his/her absence from four regular or special meetings in any twelve (12) month period.

B. The Secretary of the Commission shall certify the happening of any vacating event to the Board of Supervisors. The Board of Supervisors may waive any vacating event for any member of the Commission by a majority vote by the Board of Supervisors.

C. The Board of Supervisors shall make interim appointments to fill unexpired terms in the event of vacancies occurring during the term of members of the Commission. The interim appointment term of office will align with the term of office served by the appointing Board of Supervisors member. The Board of Supervisors shall act within 60 days to fill a vacancy.

Section 10. CHAIRPERSON RULES AND REGULATIONS. The members of the Commission shall annually elect a chairperson who shall serve for a term of one (1) year. The Commission shall make such rules and regulations as necessary to conduct its business.

Section 11. COMMISSION SUBJECT TO RALPH M. BROWN ACT. The Commission's meetings are subject to the open meeting laws contained in the Ralph A. Brown Act.

Section 12. COMPENSATION. The members of the Commission shall serve without compensation but may receive actual and necessary expenses incurred in carrying out their duties.

Section 13. DUTIES. The Children and Families Commission is charged with the

1 following duties:

- 2 A. To implement the goals and objectives of the Act.
- 3 B. To administer the monies in the Riverside County Children and Families
4 Trust Fund.
- 5 C. The adoption of an adequate and complete County Strategic Plan for the
6 support and improvement of early childhood development in the County in
7 accordance with the provisions of Health and Safety Code Section 130140
8 (a)(1)(C)(i) through (iv), as may be amended from time to time.
- 9 D. To conduct at least one public hearing on its proposed Strategic Plan before
10 the plan is adopted.
- 11 E. To conduct at least one public hearing on its periodic review of the Strategic
12 Plan before any revisions to the plan are adopted.
- 13 F. To submit its adopted County Strategic Plan, and any subsequent revisions
14 thereto, to the Board of Superiors for review and comment, and then to the
15 State Commission.
- 16 G. To prepare and adopt an annual audit and report pursuant to Health and
17 Safety Code Section 130150. The Commission shall conduct at least one
18 public hearing prior to adopting any annual audit and report.
- 19 H. To conduct at least one public hearing on each annual report by the State
20 Commission prepared pursuant to Health and Safety Code Section
21 130150(b).
- 22 I. Make copies of its annual audits and reports available to the general public
23 on request at no cost.
- 24 J. To exercise all powers, duties and functions as prescribed by statute, the
25 Board of Supervisors and the Commission.
- 26 K. To prepare and submit to the Board of Supervisors for review and comment,
27 an annual budget.
- 28 L. To prepare and submit to the Board of Supervisors for review and comment,

1 its by-laws and subsequent amendments.

2 Section 14. ESTABLISHMENT OF THE ADVISORY COMMITTEE.

3 A. An advisory committee is established to provide technical and professional
4 expertise and support for any purpose that will be beneficial to
5 accomplishing the purpose of the Act. Upon request of the Commission, the
6 advisory committee shall make recommendations and reports to the
7 Commission.

8 B. Membership of the advisory committee shall consist of representation of
9 diverse interests, geographical regions, economic backgrounds, cultural and
10 ethnic heritage of County residents with technical expertise or experience
11 specific to children 0 through 5 years of age.

12 C. The number of members of the advisory committee will be a maximum of
13 ten (10) persons, two appointments from each supervisorial district.

14 D. The individual term of the advisory committee members will be two years
15 beginning with the date of appointment. There will be no limit to the
16 number of terms an individual can serve on the committee, so long as the
17 member actively participates in committee activities.

18 E. The advisory committee will annually elect a chair and vice chair.

19 Section 15. DUTIES OF THE ADVISORY COMMITTEE.

20 A. The purpose of the advisory committee is to:

21 1. Provide technical and professional expertise as well as ongoing
22 support to the Commission for any purpose that will contribute to
23 accomplishing the purpose of the Act and the local strategic plan.

24 2. Enhance the reputation and credibility of the Commission through
25 increased engagement and communication with relevant
26 stakeholders and the community at large as directed by the
27 Commission.

28 B. The members of the advisory committee serve without compensation but

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may receive actual and necessary expenses as incurred in carrying out their duties.

C. The members of the advisory committee have no authority to make, change, or implement policy, unless formal action is taken by the Commission.

Section 16. SEVERABILITY. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid, such section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance. The Board of Supervisors hereby declares that it would have passed this Ordinance and every section, subsection, clause or phrase thereof, irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections sentences, clauses or phrases be declared unconstitutional or invalid.

Section 17. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Ordinance shall take effect thirty (30) days after its adoption.”



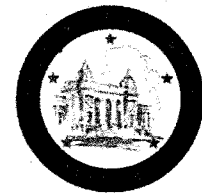

BACKGROUND:

Summary

Riverside County Children and Families Commission/First 5 Riverside (RCCFC/F5R) implements the provisions of Proposition 10, which provides tobacco tax funds to facilitate the creation and implementation of an integrated, comprehensive, and collaborative system of information and services to enhance optimal early childhood development and to ensure children are ready to learn and embrace lifelong learning.

The RCCFC/F5R was established by the Board of Supervisors as an independent agency through adoption of Ordinance No. 784, enacted on January 22, 1999, and was subsequently reorganized by the Board through adoption of Ordinance 784.9 enacted on June 9, 2009. On April 6, 2009, the Board of Supervisors designated RCCFC/F5R as a division within the Department of Public Social Services, effective July 1, 2009.

Staff Recommendations:

California Health and Safety Code section 130100 et seq allows the Commission to be designated as a direct agency of the county, while allowing the commission to retain independent authority over the commission's strategic plan and trust fund. RCCFC/F5R is a key partner for county-wide systems change and innovation. Staff recommends that RCCFC/F5R be designated as an independent County Department effective September 1, 2019. As an independent County Department, the Executive Director will report to the County Executive Office.

Statewide, the composition of various commissions' memberships, excluding the required appointees, varies both in number and the categories represented. It is recommended that the Commission remain at nine commission members, to be selected and appointed as permitted by California Health and Safety Code, Ordinance No. 784, and Board Policy A-21. Staff is introducing and at the following meeting recommending adoption of Ordinance No. 784.11 to change the composition of the Commission to designate membership to align with the Riverside County 2030 Vision, and to reduce term limits to 2 years with a maximum of 2 consecutive terms.

Proposed Membership: 9 members

Retain sitting members and reduce membership to 2-year terms for new members subject to term limits.

- A. One member shall be a member of the Board of Supervisors and will not have a term limit.
- B. Three (3) members shall be from among persons responsible for management of County functions specializing in children prenatal thorough age 5 as follows:

One member shall be from within Human Services Portfolio; one member shall be from among the Health Officer or Riverside University Health System (i.e., Public Health, Behavioral Health or Medical Center and Clinics); one member shall be from Riverside County Office of Education.

These four members shall not be subject to the term limits specified in Section 6.

- C. The Board of Supervisors shall also appoint the remaining five members of the Commission. Each member of the Board of Supervisors shall nominate one member from among categories described in the Children and Families Act Health and Safety Code 130140 (A)(iii). These remaining members shall be any of the following: (1) recipients of project services included in the County Strategic Plan; (2) educators specializing in early childhood development; (3) representatives of a local child care resource or referral agency, or a local child care coordinating group; (4) representatives of a local organization for prevention or early intervention for families at risk; (5) representatives of community-based organizations that have the goal of promoting nurturing and early childhood development; (6) representatives of local school districts; and (7) representatives of local medical, pediatric, or obstetric associations or societies. Although a member from each of the above-referenced categories is not required, it is desirable that members from as many categories as possible serve on the Commission at all times. Any member appointed to the Commission pursuant to this subsection shall reside and/or work in Riverside County at the time of appointment and for the duration of his or her term.
- D. One member of the Board of Supervisors shall serve as an alternate member of the Commission

Composition of the proposed membership strengthens the creation of an integrated coordinated system for children and families by including experts from county departments while retaining a majority of members from the public in compliance with the Act.


