On motion of Supervisor Jeffries, seconded by Supervisor Perez, and duly carried by unanimous vote, IT WAS ORDERED that the meeting of Tuesday, September 10, 2019 be adjourned in memory of Sparrow Marlene Marie Greene, a beloved resident of Canyon Lake, California, passed away at her home on August 29, 2019, after a battle with cancer.

Born on May 14, 1947. Sparrow grew up in Whittier California. She attended parochial school through 8th grade, and went on to graduate from Cal High School in Whittier. Sparrow completed a nursing program, having attended Cypress College and Fullerton Junior College.

She was an emergency room nurse for 36 years at St. Jude Hospital in Fullerton. Sparrow received an Emergency Room Nurse of the Year award in the late 1990's. She taught first aid, CPR and disaster preparedness.

In 2018, the County of Riverside Emergency Management Department presented Sparrow with the Community Service Award for her 10 years of leadership in the Riverside County Medical Reserve Corps, and her community work to increase emergency preparedness efforts. Her work over the years includes FEMA terrorism response training, working with Doctors Without Borders, and a collaborative disaster response training with Ventura County.

Sparrow was a resident of the City of Canyon Lake since 1987, and contributed to the City of Canyon Lake by serving on the Canyon Lake Emergency Preparedness Committee along with her husband, former Canyon Lake Mayor, Larry Greene. She assisted in teaching and training the City's CERT (Community Emergency Response Training) program.

Sparrow will be best remembered for her passion for taking care of others, and her commitment to the community. She is survived by four adult children, five grandchildren, and her loving husband.

Sparrow's memory and passionate spirit will live forever in the hearts of those who knew and loved her. She will be dearly missed but never forgotten.
