BACKGROUND:

Project Description

SPECIFIC PLAN NO. 339 is a proposal to establish a Specific Plan which would allow for a maximum of 8,490 dwelling units and up to 1.38 million square feet of non-residential uses within an approximately 1,848-acre development footprint divided between 6 Villages within an overall 5,000-acre Specific Plan area. Land use designations proposed by the Specific Plan include Residential, Commercial Retail, Mixed Use, Public Facilities, Open Space-Recreation, and Open Space-Conservation Habitat.

The Specific Plan area is located east of the greater Coachella Valley on either side of Interstate-10 in an area known as Shavers Valley, generally located 8 miles east of the City of Coachella (generally 15 miles from the closest interchange in Coachella at Dillon Road to the project's interchange) and 10 miles west of Chiriaco Summit. The project abuts the southern boundary of the Joshua Tree National Park. The Mecca Hills bound the site on the south and west and the Orocopia Mountains are located to the southeast.

Access from Interstate-10 to the project site is provided by an existing interchange with Frontage Road with on- and off-ramps.

The project site is located within the Desert Tortoise and Linkage Conservation Area of the Coachella Valley Multiple Species Habitat Conservation Plan.

The majority of the site, approximately 3,100 acres, is to be left as natural open space and designated as Open Space-Conservation.

The project is intended to be a largely self-sustaining community whereby future residents will have significant access to employment, retail and commercial, industrial uses, recreation, school, health care, and other supporting amenities within the project limits, limiting the need to commute out of the project area for these services.

The residentially designated areas within the Specific Plan include a range of residential categories from Medium Density Residential to Highest Density Residential with an overall density range of 2 to 20+ dwelling units per acre.

Of the 4 Mixed Use Planning Areas totaling approximately 177 acres, 3 Mixed Use Planning Areas could accommodate either residential or commercial development or a combination of residential and commercial and the other 1 Mixed Use Planning Area could accommodate either commercial or business park/industrial development.

A total of approximately 54.9 acres is designated for larger park areas throughout the development area, while additional smaller parks are anticipated to be developed within some of the planning areas as outlined in the Specific Plan.

Of the Public Facilities areas, 5 future school sites are conceptually designated and the remaining Public Facilities areas are anticipated to accommodate infrastructure for drainage, water wells, and electrical substations.

GENERAL PLAN AMENDMENT NO. 686 is a proposal for a General Plan Foundation Component Amendment and General Plan Entitlement/Policy Amendment.

The General Plan Foundation Component Amendment is a proposal to change the Foundation of the site in the Eastern Coachella Valley Area Plan from Open Space to Community Development and Open Space.

The General Plan Entitlement/Policy Amendment is a proposal to change the underlying land use designation in the Eastern Coachella Valley Area Plan from Open Space: Rural (OS:RUR) to the following land use designations: Open Space: Conservation Habitat as reflected on the Land Use Plan for Specific Plan No. 339 (OS:CH), Open Space: Recreation as reflected on the Land Use Plan for Specific Plan No. 339 (OS:R), Community Development: Mixed Use as reflected on the Land Use Plan for Specific Plan No. 339 (CD:MU), Community Development: Commercial Retail as reflected on the Land Use Plan for Specific Plan No. 339 (CD:CR), Community Development: Medium Density Residential as reflected on the Land Use Plan for Specific Plan No. 339 (CD:MDR), Community Development: High Density Residential as reflected on the Land Use Plan for Specific Plan No. 339 (CD:MHDR), Community Development: High Density Residential as reflected on the Land Use Plan for Specific Plan No. 339 (CD:HDR), Community Development: High Density Residential as reflected on the Land Use Plan for Specific Plan No. 339 (CD:HDR), Community Development: Highest Density Residential as reflected on the Land

Use Plan for Specific Plan No. 339 (CD:HHDR), and Community Development: Public Facilities as reflected on the Land Use Plan for Specific Plan No. 339 (CD:PF).

CHANGE OF ZONE NO. 6915 is a proposal to change the zoning classification of the subject site from a mix of Controlled Development Areas, ten-acre minimum (W-2-10) and Natural Assets (N-A) to Specific Plan (SP) and adopt a Specific Plan zoning ordinance to establish the permitted uses and development standards for the Specific Plan Planning Areas.

All of the above discretionary legislative actions are hereinafter referred to as the "Project."

ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT REPORT NO. 506 studies the impacts of the project.

Project History

Specific Plan No. 339 was first submitted to the County of Riverside on January 6, 2004. The project site is comprised of approximately 5,000 acres. When first submitted, the Specific Plan consisted of approximately 12,000 units and 2.8 million square feet of non-residential buildings on a developable area of approximately 3,000 acres.

Subsequently, in 2008 the Coachella Valley Multi-Species Habitat Conservation Plan (CVMSHCP) became effective. The CVMSHCP designates the project site nearly entirely within the Desert Tortoise and Linkage Conservation Area of the CVMSHCP with the remainder (approximately 112 acres) included within the Joshua Tree National Park Conservation Area. The CVMSHCP necessitated the project to be redesigned to accommodate greater area to be designated for conservation within the Specific Plan boundaries. The result is the Specific Plan as described above in the project description, and attached in its entirety to the staff report, which now includes a maximum of 8,490 dwelling units and up to 1.38 million square feet of non-residential uses within a development footprint of 1,848 developable acres.

The Paradise Valley Specific Plan No. 339 includes a General Plan Amendment (GPA No. 686) and a Change of Zone (CZ No. 6915). The impacts of the project were studied via Environmental Impact Report No. 506, a Programmatic EIR. Project-level EIR's generally focus on the environmental changes caused by a development project, including planning, construction, and operation. A Programmatic EIR, on the other hand, generally looks at the broad policy of a planning document, i.e., a general plan, and anticipates that further CEQA analysis may be performed when implementing projects are submitted.

Environmental Impact Report No. 506 was circulated for public review in January 2018. Forty-seven comments were received during the 45-day public review period, and 2 comments were received following the close of the public review period. These comments were reviewed and detailed responses for each comment were included in the Final EIR, which was posted on November 1, 2018. Mailed notices to commenters were sent on October 26, 2018 and noted Final EIR availability of November 1, 2018.

Agency and Entity Meetings and Comments

Several meetings have been held with the applicant, staff from the Coachella Valley Conservation Commission (CVCC), the California Department of Fish & Wildlife (CDFW), and the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service (USFWS), and correspondence has been received from these agencies, as well as responses from the applicant to the agency comments. Meetings have also been held with members of the Sierra Club, Center for Biological Diversity, National Parks Conservation Association, California Native Plant Society, and Eastern Coachella Valley Leadership Council.

Planning Commission

Six noticed public hearings were held before the Planning Commission: on November 28, 2018; December 5, 2018; January 30, 2019; May 15, 2019; and June 5, 2019, all of which were then continued, and August 21, 2019. The Planning Commission heard public testimony during the six public hearings, presented questions to staff, the applicant, members of the public and other public agencies.

On the basis of all of the comments, testimony, staff reports and deliberations throughout the planning process, on August 21, 2019, the Planning Commission closed the public hearing on the Project and, on a 4-1 vote, recommended that the Board of Supervisors deny the Project and directed staff to prepare findings consistent with the Planning Commission's deliberations and action. Subsequent to this recommendation by the Planning Commission, staff prepared a resolution including findings supporting the recommendation of denial of the Project based on the significant concerns noted in staff reports, testimony and questions raised at the Planning Commission Hearings, and Planning Commission deliberations on the Project, which was considered and acted on by the Planning Commission on October 16, 2019. Each of the Planning Commission staff reports and the memorandums provided to the Planning Commission are included as attachments to this Form 11 for further background and reference for the Board of Supervisors. Staff has prepared the attached findings consistent with the Planning Commission's deliberations and recommendation.

Impact on Residents and Businesses

The impacts of this project have been evaluated through the environmental review and public hearing process by the Board of Supervisors and the Planning Commission.



BACKGROUND:

Project Description

SPECIFIC PLAN NO. 339 is a proposal to establish a Specific Plan which would allow for a maximum of 8,490 dwelling units and up to 1.38 million square feet of non-residential uses within an approximately 1,848-acre development footprint divided between 6 Villages within an overall 5,000-acre Specific Plan area. Land use designations proposed by the Specific Plan include Residential, Commercial Retail, Mixed Use, Public Facilities, Open Space-Recreation, and Open Space-Conservation Habitat.

The Specific Plan area is located east of the greater Coachella Valley on either side of Interstate-10 in an area known as Shavers Valley, generally located 8 miles east of the City of Coachella (generally 15 miles from the closest interchange in Coachella at Dillon Road to the project's interchange) and 10 miles west of Chiriaco Summit. The project abuts the southern boundary of the Joshua Tree National Park. The Mecca Hills bound the site on the south and west and the Orocopia Mountains are located to the southeast.

Access from Interstate-10 to the project site is provided by an existing interchange with Frontage Road with on- and off-ramps.

The project site is located within the Desert Tortoise and Linkage Conservation Area of the Coachella Valley Multiple Species Habitat Conservation Plan.

The majority of the site, approximately 3,100 acres, is to be left as natural open space and designated as Open Space-Conservation.

The project is intended to be a largely self-sustaining community whereby future residents will have significant access to employment, retail and commercial, industrial uses, recreation, school, health care, and other supporting amenities within the project limits, limiting the need to commute out of the project area for these services.

The residentially designated areas within the Specific Plan include a range of residential categories from Medium Density Residential to Highest Density Residential with an overall density range of 2 to 20+ dwelling units per acre.

Of the 4 Mixed Use Planning Areas totaling approximately 177 acres, 3 Mixed Use Planning Areas could accommodate either residential or commercial development or a combination of residential and commercial and the other 1 Mixed Use Planning Area could accommodate either commercial or business park/industrial development.

A total of approximately 54.9 acres is designated for larger park areas throughout the development area, while additional smaller parks are anticipated to be developed within some of the planning areas as outlined in the Specific Plan.

Of the Public Facilities areas, 5 future school sites are conceptually designated and the remaining Public Facilities areas are anticipated to accommodate infrastructure for drainage, water wells, and electrical substations.

GENERAL PLAN AMENDMENT NO. 686 is a proposal for a General Plan Foundation Component Amendment and General Plan Entitlement/Policy Amendment.

The General Plan Foundation Component Amendment is a proposal to change the Foundation of the site in the Eastern Coachella Valley Area Plan from Open Space to Community Development and Open Space.

The General Plan Entitlement/Policy Amendment is a proposal to change the underlying land use designation in the Eastern Coachella Valley Area Plan from Open Space: Rural (OS:RUR) to the following land use designations::: Open Space-: Conservation Habitat as reflected on the Land Use Plan for Specific Plan No. 339 (OS:CH), Open Space: Recreation as reflected on the Land Use Plan for Specific Plan No. 339 (OS:R), Community Development: Mixed Use as reflected on the Land Use Plan for Specific Plan No. 339 (CD:MU), Community Development: Commercial Retail as reflected on the Land Use Plan for Specific Plan No. 339 (CD:CR), Community Development: Medium Density Residential as reflected on the Land Use Plan for Specific Plan No. 339 (CD:MHDR), Community Development: High Density Residential as reflected on the Land Use Plan for Specific Plan No. 339 (CD:HDR), Community Development: High Density Residential as reflected on the Land Use Plan for Specific Plan No. 339 (CD:HDR), Community Development: Highest Density Residential as reflected on the Land Use Plan for Specific Plan No. 339 (CD:HDR), Community Development: Public Facilities as reflected on the Land Use Plan for Specific Plan No. 339 (CD:PF).

CHANGE OF ZONE NO. 6915 is a proposal to change the zoning classification of the subject site from a mix of Controlled Development Areas, ten-acre minimum (W-2-10) and Natural

Assets (N-A) to Specific Plan (SP) and adopt a Specific Plan zoning ordinance to establish the permitted uses and development standards for the Specific Plan Planning Areas.

All of the above discretionary legislative actions are hereinafter referred to as the "Project."

ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT REPORT NO. 506 studies the impacts of the project.

Project History

Specific Plan No. 339 was first submitted to the County of Riverside on January 6, 2004. The project site is comprised of approximately 5,000 acres. When first submitted, the Specific Plan consisted of approximately 12,000 units and 2.8 million square feet of non-residential buildings on a developable area of approximately 3,000 acres.

Subsequently, in 2008 the Coachella Valley Multi-Species Habitat Conservation Plan (CVMSHCP) became effective. The CVMSHCP designates the project site nearly entirely within the Desert Tortoise and Linkage Conservation Area of the CVMSHCP with the remainder (approximately 112 acres) included within the Joshua Tree National Park Conservation Area. The CVMSHCP necessitated the project to be redesigned to accommodate greater area to be designated for conservation within the Specific Plan boundaries. The result is the Specific Plan as described above in the project description, and attached in its entirety to the staff report, which now includes a maximum of 8,490 dwelling units and up to 1.38 million square feet of non-residential uses within a development footprint of 1,848 developable acres.

The Paradise Valley Specific Plan No. 339 includes a General Plan Amendment (GPA No. 686) and a Change of Zone (CZ No. 6915). The impacts of the project were studied via Environmental Impact Report No. 506, a Programmatic EIR. Project-level EIR's generally focus on the environmental changes caused by a development project, including planning, construction, and operation. A Programmatic EIR, on the other hand, generally looks at the broad policy of a planning document, i.e., a general plan, and anticipates that further CEQA analysis may be performed when implementing projects are submitted.

Environmental Impact Report No. 506 was circulated for public review in January 2018. Forty-seven comments were received during the 45-day public review period, and 2 comments were received following the close of the public review period. These comments were reviewed and detailed responses for each comment were included in the Final EIR, which was posted on November 1, 2018. Mailed notices to commenters were sent on October 26, 2018 and noted Final EIR availability of November 1, 2018.

Planning Commission

Six noticed public hearings were held before the Planning Commission: on November 28, 2018; December 5, 2018; January 30, 2019; May 15, 2019; and June 5, 2019, all of which were then

continued, and August 21, 2019. The Planning Commission heard public testimony during the six public hearings, presented questions to staff, the applicant, members of the public and other public agencies. Several meetings have been held with the applicant, staff from the Coachella Valley Conservation Commission (CVCC), the California Department of Fish & Wildlife (CDFW), and the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service (USFWS), and correspondence has been received from these agencies, as well as responses from the applicant to the agency comments. Meetings have also been held with members of the Sierra Club, Center for Biological Diversity, National Parks Conservation Association, California Native Plant Society, and Eastern Coachella Valley Leadership Council.

On the basis of all of the aforementioned comments, testimony, staff reports and deliberations, at the August 21, 2019, the Planning Commission closed the public hearing on the Project and, on a 4-1 vote, recommended that the Board of Supervisors deny the Project and directed staff to prepare findings consistent with the Planning Commission's deliberations and action. Subsequent to this recommendation by the Planning Commission, staff prepared a resolution including findings supporting the recommendation of denial of the Project based on the significant concerns noted in staff reports, testimony and questions raised at the Planning Commission Hearings, and Planning Commission deliberations on the Project, which was considered and acted on by the Planning Commission on October 16, 2019. Each of the Planning Commission staff reports and the memorandums provided to the Planning Commission are included as attachments to this Form 11 for further background and reference for the Board of Supervisors.

Impact on Residents and Businesses

The impacts of this project have been evaluated through the environmental review and public hearing process by the Planning Department and the Planning Commission.





I submit the following comments regarding the above stated proposed project.

I have resided here for over 15 years and know this area very well as I have explored this region by hiking and in my Jeep on the 4x4 trails. I am a hike leader with a local hiking club with over 300 members and lead hikes to some of the most unique slot canyons, grottos, and canyons in the world. Geologist from around the world come here to view and study the geological layers of tortured rocks of the San Andreas fault exposed here. After a wet season this area explodes with desert wildflowers including the rare desert lily.

I urge you to consider these impacts and deny the project as it appears the negative impacts outnumber the positive impacts.

The Environmental Impact Report identifies negative impacts as <u>significant and unavoidable</u> in the following areas:

- 1. Long term water service program identified a pivotal issue for sustainability.
- 2. Environmental sustainability
- 3. Impacts of views of Orocopia Mountains and surrounding desert views
- 4. The location is surrounded by the Cottonwood Mountains, Joshua Tree National Park, Mecca Hills Wilderness and Orocopia Mountains which are unique valuable natural resources and encompasses a biological diverse ecosystem essential to the sustainability of multiple species including the endangered desert tortoise.
- 5. Alteration of visual character
- 6. Freeway views
- 7. Box Can Views
- 8. Trail Views
- 9. Orocopia Mountains views
- 10. Light Pollution
- 11. Cumulative aesthetics impacts
- 12. Biological resources
- 13. Air Quality

- 15. Geology and Soils
- 16. Significance of the San Andreas Fault is understated and does not include sufficient analysis. The San Andreas Fault runs through the Mecca Hills, Orocopia Mountains and crosses the I-10 freeway where the Coachella Canal is located and then bends and turns north west. This is where geologist state that

the fault is stuck at the bend and is building up pressure for a significant break/rupture of a 7.8 or 8 magnitude which is 300 years overdue.

Good Afternoon,

As an avid hiker, camping enthusiast, Wildlife Biologist, land conservationist and National Park supporter, I want to say that I support the Planning Commission's recommendation to DENY the Paradise Valley Project! I grew up in Orange County and learned to camp and rock climb in Joshua Tree National Park. I now work to support endangered species preservation throughout all of California, and my past experience tells me that this development would compound the already existing threats to the special status plant and animal species found in and around the park, including the threatened Desert tortoise, Desert star plant and LeConte's thrasher. In addition, the development does not align with the Western Riverside Multiple Species Habitat Conservation Plan which is set in place to protect 143 sensitive, endangered or threatened species (and habitats) within Western Riverside County. Furthermore, the loss of habitat from the development would extend far beyond the edge of the buildings and roads themselves, because of cumulative impacts and edge effects. Threats include cutting off wildlife corridors for species like the bighorn sheep, increasing trash and pollution in/around the development, increasing likelihood for illegal OHV use in sensitive desert habitat, increasing the number of visitors to the park to potentially threatening levels, attracting non-native plant or animal species such as invasive Argentine ants or those predators specifically targeting desert tortoise young like the common raven or American crow.

In addition, Joshua Tree National Park's dark night skies will be affected by hundreds of thousands of new sources of artificial light. Not only will this eliminate the official designation of Joshua Tree as a Dark Sky Park, but light impact studies on wildlife have shown artificial lights have negative influence on various wildlife species all over the world, with specific focus on disruption to the life cycle of reptiles. Once again, I support the Planning Commission's recommendation to DENY the Paradise Valley Project and I will continue to oppose this development until it is put to rest.

We write in support of Denial of Specific Plan No. 339, of General Plan Amendment No. 686, and of Change of Zone No. 6915.

This land is excellent habitat for the threatened Mojave population of Desert tortoise (*Gopherus agassizii*), is centrally located in a well-connected primarily undisturbed zone and, in our opinion, should not be developed.

Desert tortoise populations have continued to decline since the time of the federal listing 28 years ago. Specifically, declines have been described in the federal listing of the tortoise in 1990 and the first Recovery Plan published in 1994, the USFWS (2015) documented major and significant declines in breeding adults between 2004 and 2014. Protecting habitat from development in a key factor in recovery of tortoise populations throughout their range, in particular within the Chuckwalla Critical Habitat Unit.

The Desert Tortoise Preserve Committee, Inc. (DTPC) is a grass-roots, non-profit organization formed in 1974 and dedicated to protecting the welfare of the threatened desert tortoise and other species that share its habitat. Our organization is involved in species and habitat management in the California deserts through land acquisition and management, scientific research, and educational outreach. We work with the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) and other agencies and partners on these efforts. As an example, the DTPC helped establish the Desert Tortoise Research Natural Area with the BLM, and currently works with the BLM under a cooperative agreement to manage the area. We own several properties in the immediate vicinity of the parcel which is the subject of this letter, as you can see on the attached map.



There are a good number of reasons to not let this project go forward, all based in good science rather than opinion.

One reason is that whenever there are new developments near wild land, fire hazards can spread because of improper planting. Those plantings in residential and commercial areas escape into wild land and parks, infesting them with non native species that disrupt the local ecosystems. Areas not prone to fire become prone to fire because of this and are forever altered.

Another reason is that the preservation of these areas adjacent to (links between areas) our parks are crucial for enabling gene flow through the environment, as well as decreasing local extinction events that can happen with the isolation of park and natural areas.

Friends of Riverside's Hills oppose approval of the Paradise Valley Specific Plan, General Plan Amendment, and the Change of Zone. This is unjustified given the extreme environmental sensitivity of the site of the proposed development, and the lack of adequate study of the project's direct impacts and of the adequacy of the proposed mitigation measures. We recommend that the Specific Plan, General Plan Amendment, and Change of Zone applications be denied.

This proposal has a long history, but it is apparent that over the last 8 years the developers have paid little attention to the requests made by the Federal and State Fish and Wildlife Agencies and the County Coachella Valley Conservation Commission (CVCC) with regard to the environmental sensitivities of the location.

It is of great concern that the CVCC, through the letter of its executive director on May 19th 2019, noted that "it is CVCC's opinion that the disturbed acreage of the project, from a total number of acres and location of disturbance basis, remains little changed from 2011 when CVCC determined that the project was quantitatively and qualitatively inconsistent with the CVMSHCP". This letter highlights how little the developer has responded to the environmental concerns related to the CVMSHCP – a plan specifically designed to facilitate appropriate development, provided that all developers recognize its importance and respond appropriately to concerns raised by the CVCC. For example, the strategy of "Like Exchange" as a mitigation measure is fraught with problems – it is very difficult to replace a developed area within an MSHCP with a region of habitat that is equal or superior in the context of the Plan. Connectivity across the whole plan area must be maintained for all of the species covered. Chipping away at a plan area that was designed specifically for the long-term persistence of the covered species and replacing it with an unplanned mosaic of habitat is likely to lead to plan failure.

This concern is expressed in the California Dept. of Fish and Wildlife letter (Nov. 26th 2018) noting, among other concerns, its concern over "the completeness and adequacy of the County's analysis of direct, indirect, and cumulative impacts (particularly with respect to Desert Tortoise and Linkage conservation Area and vegetation communities such as Dry Wash woodlands); and the adequacy, appropriateness, and enforceability of proposed mitigation measures." These concerns also highlight concern over the County's position that the review is exempt from CEQA. This position is untenable, given the nature of the approvals being requested.

Similar concerns are expressed in the US Fish and Wildlife letter of Nov. 26th 2018, noting the vagueness of the adequacy of off-site mitigation, stating that there was a need for more information regarding: "assurances for future mitigation acquisitions of desert dry wash woodlands" and that there was "no biological analysis of the project's impacts on the long-term persistence of a self-sustaining desert tortoise

population in the Desert Tortoise and Linkage Conservation Area (Conservation Area)." Comments such as these should be fatal to any project, especially one with an MSHCP active in the area to be developed.

I (L. Nunney) further add that my comments on MSHCPs and connectivity are based on expert knowledge. I am a professor of Biology at the University of California Riverside, a member of the Center for Conservation Biology at UCR, and I was a member of the Scientific Advisory Panel during the development and approval of the Western Riverside County MSHCP.

I write to you to ask you to deny the Paradise Valley Development as suggested by the Planning Commission. I am interested in this project from the standpoint of both appropriate development and an environmental perspective.

First, this project represents poor planning in terms of constructing a large sprawl development well east the area of high density growth in the Coachella Valley. The resulting community would be substantially cut off from municipal services and would presumably add substantially to traffic on I-10 given the lack of local amenities. We should be encouraging denser development closer to established population centers rather than creating new city cores far from current development.

Second, we should think twice about substantial new development along the I-10 corridor from an environmental perspective. I have been researching climate and environmental models that address the next 30-80 years in California. The Shaver's Valley area is going to be subjected to substantial increase in the number of excessive heat days in the next 30 years and will require increased electrical usage to offset heat through air conditioning and water use. It makes little sense to continue to develop individual family homes in this kind of setting. Residents will be increasingly exposed to increased health risks from high heat and yet will be distant from established hospitals and other emergency services. The development will presumably also tap into water resources that would be more productively used to increase housing density in established communities.


Desert tortoise populations have continued to decline since the time of the federal listing 28 years ago. Specifically, declines have been described in the federal listing of the tortoise in 1990 and the first Recovery Plan published in 1994, the USFWS (2015) documented major and significant declines in breeding adults between 2004 and 2014. Protecting habitat from development in a key factor in recovery of tortoise populations throughout their range, in particular within the Chuckwalla Critical Habitat Unit.

The Desert Tortoise Preserve Committee, Inc. (DTPC) is a grass-roots, non-profit organization formed in 1974 and dedicated to protecting the welfare of the threatened desert tortoise and other species that share its habitat. Our organization is involved in species and habitat management in the California deserts through land acquisition and management, scientific research, and educational outreach. We work with the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) and other agencies and partners on these efforts. As an example, the DTPC helped establish the Desert Tortoise Research Natural Area with the BLM, and currently works with the BLM under a cooperative agreement to manage the area. We own several properties in the immediate vicinity of the parcel which is the subject of this letter, as you can see on the attached map.



The following Transportation Department conditions of approval have been modified:

90.TRANS.4, RCTD - Dedication now reads as follows:

Sky Canyon Road along the project boundary is considered an INDUSTRIAL COLLECTOR Road and shall be realigned (from Sparkman Way to south project boundary) and improved with 56 foot full-width AC Pavement immediately south of Sparkman Way until it ties in with the existing alignment of said street. Sky Canyon shall then be improved 28 foot project side (from westerly construction centerline), 6 inch concrete curb and gutter, and match up to the existing asphalt concrete paving along the easterly construction centerline as determined by the Director of Transportation within the 68 foot modified full-width (39 foot project side and 29 feet on the other side of the construction centerline) dedicated right-of-way in accordance with Standard No. 111, Ordinance 461. Refer County Standard No. 114, Ordinance No. 114, Ordinance for INDUSTRIAL COLLECTOR Road radii). (Modified to reduce full-width right-of-way from 78 feet to 68 feet). NOTE:

- 1. A driveway(s) shall be improved per County Standard No. 207(A), Ordinance 461.
- 2. A cul-de-sac shall be improved per County Standard No. 800(A), Ordinance 461.

90.TRANS.5 RCTD - Existing "Caltrans" Maintained now reads as follows:

SH-79 (Winchester Road) from northerly of project driveway to Borel Road is a paved Caltrans maintained road designated as an Expressway Way and shall be improved with 8 inch curb and gutter & AC Berm, concrete raised median, and 22 foot to 65 foot AC pavement (per the Amended Exhibit dated 8/22/2019), and match up asphalt concrete paving as determine by the Caltrans within the 92 foot half-width Caltrans dedicated right-of-way per County Standard No. 83, Ordinance 461 and as approved by Caltrans.

Note:

- 1. A transition AC tapering and AC Berm shall be improved as directed by Caltrans.
- 2. The proposed project driveway on SR-79 shall be restricted right-in and right-out turning movements only. Left-turns shall be prohibited and enforced through raised median or other appropriate channelization as approved by Caltrans
- 3. Street improvement plan shall be submitted to Caltrans review and approval.
- 4. Encroachment permit shall be obtained from Caltrans prior to do any work within the SH-79 (Winchester Road)
- 5. Parkway improvement plan along SH-79 (Winchester Road) shall be submitted to County Transportation Department for review and approval.
- 6. Street improvements plan along Sky Canyon Road and project driveway and drive aisle shall be submitted to County Transportation Department for review and approval.

The modifications were necessary to clarify the limits of roadway improvements to be provided by the development project.


Desert tortoise populations have continued to decline since the time of the federal listing 28 years ago. Specifically, declines have been described in the federal listing of the tortoise in 1990 and the first Recovery Plan published in 1994, the USFWS (2015) documented major and significant declines in breeding adults between 2004 and 2014. Protecting habitat from development in a key factor in recovery of tortoise populations throughout their range, in particular within the Chuckwalla Critical Habitat Unit.

The Desert Tortoise Preserve Committee, Inc. (DTPC) is a grass-roots, non-profit organization formed in 1974 and dedicated to protecting the welfare of the threatened desert tortoise and other species that share its habitat. Our organization is involved in species and habitat management in the California deserts through land acquisition and management, scientific research, and educational outreach. We work with the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) and other agencies and partners on these efforts. As an example, the DTPC helped establish the Desert Tortoise Research Natural Area with the BLM, and currently works with the BLM under a cooperative agreement to manage the area. We own several properties in the immediate vicinity of the parcel which is the subject of this letter, as you can see on the attached map.



Carbon Sequestration in Undisturbed Desert

The Project site is undisturbed creosote scrub and dry wash woodland habitat. The plants in the mature creosote scrub are connected underground by a jungle of mycorrhizae which absorbs and stores carbon dioxide.

This complex biological web is described by Robin Kobaly in the March 2019 Desert Report where she synthesizes 29 scientific peer reviewed research projects. Carbon sequestration and storage happens in the desert. But how much?

Over a ten-year timeframe, researchers in the Mojave Desert exposed University of Nevada study plots to elevated carbon dioxide levels similar to those expected in 2050. R.D. Evans, the project lead, stated (in an interview Washington State University News Post) that "overall, rising CO2 levels may increase the uptake by arid lands enough to account for 4 to 8 percent of current emissions".

This research provided the data the United States Geological Survey (USGS) used in calculating Terrestrial Carbon Sequestration in National Parks. Their report gives the Metric Tons of Carbon per Hectare being sequestered as well as the Ecosystem Service Value in millions of dollars. This dollar amount considers the land area covered and reveals that the lead National Park (NP) for Ecosystem Service Value is Great Smoky Mountains NP. However, within the top 15 parks are the 4 desert parks (Death Valley NP, Mojave Preserve, Joshua Tree NP, and Lake Mead NRA). The desert environments have relatively low sequestration per hectare but lots of undisturbed hectares sequestering CO2 whenever the ground is wet, and storing CO2 during the dry periods.

The creosote scrub of the Cottonwood Mountains in JTNP flows seamlessly through the proposed project area of Paradise Valley. Research shows that Joshua Tree NP sequesters 1.3 Metric Tons of CO2 per hectare per year.

The Paradise Valley development footprint is approximately 770 hectares, which equates to nearly 1,000 Metric Tons of CO2 that will no longer be sequestered every year.

What does 1,000 Metric Tons mean? The Environmental Protection Agency has an equivalency calculator that provides the answer: https://www.epa.gov/energy/greenhouse-gas-equivalencies-calculator

2,444,988 Miles driven by an average passenger vehicle

Put another way, based on the idealized inhabitants of Paradise Valley, this equates to:

40,880 propane cylinders used for home barbecues, or

127,512,318 number of smartphones charged

And, the Mojave Desert has been around for thousands of years performing this sequestration. By the numbers: every thousand years approximately 1,000,000 Metric Tons of CO2 has been stored underground in caliche (fossilized carbon). Grading during construction of PV will break up this caliche and release the CO2. What are the equivalencies for the released CO2?

112,523,911 gallons of gasoline consumed

212,314 passenger vehicles driven for one year

The Project EIR must account for the future loss of the ability of the land to sequester CO2, and the release of the stored CO2.





Figure 1: Regional Location Map




Figure 3: Box Canyon washout through the Mecca Hills 10/13/18 https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=Xd3K6MKFBH4
