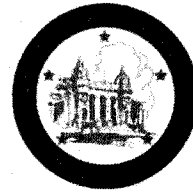



BACKGROUND: Community Improvement Designation funds will be given to the following organizations:
