On motion of Supervisor Washington, seconded by Supervisor Spiegel, and duly carried by unanimous vote, IT WAS ORDERED that the meeting of Tuesday, January 14, 2020 be adjourned in memory of Melba L. Dunlap, an 88-year-old former Riverside County Supervisor who passed away on January 13, 2020, and will always be remembered as “one of our great Supervisors.”

Born March 9, 1931, in Higgins, Texas. Melba moved to Riverside County in 1958 after her husband, Eugene Dunlap Jr., was stationed at what is now March Air Reserve Base. The couple were married for 63 years and lived in Riverside.

She served on the Citizens Transportation Advisory Committee, which became the Riverside County Transportation Commission. Melba has been accredited with launching the first public bus system in Riverside County’s west side, later to become RTA (Riverside Transit Agency). Throughout the 60’s and 70’s Melba was an environmental activist who was passionate about improving the quality of life of the people she served. She helped push for cleanup of toxic waste dumps in what is now Jurupa Valley. Melba was the second woman elected to the county’s governing board. She was a District 2 County Supervisor from January 1983 until January 1995.

In 2012 Melba was awarded the Patricia Ann Wilson Outstanding Community Service Award recognizing her good work as one of the founding members of Western Riverside Council of Governments. Her impact is widely felt by the 2.4 million people who call Riverside County home. She is recognized by many as a leader who consistently did what was right for her district.

Melba’s memory and passionate spirit will live forever in the hearts of those who knew and loved her. She is survived by three of her four children: James Dunlap, Melena Bigbee and David Dunlap. One son Richard Dunlap, died in 1971. She also is survived by three grandchildren and two great grandchildren.

The Board of Supervisors commemorates her service to the County of Riverside.


