In addition to "Colors of the Mountain," Chen also wrote a number of other books, including "Sounds of the River," "Brothers: A Novel," "Girl Under a Red Moon" and "Wandering Warrior."

Da Chen is survived by his wife, Dr. Sun-Ling Chen; his daughter, Victoria; his son, Michael and four siblings.

On motion of Supervisor Jeffries, seconded by Supervisor Hewitt and duly carried by unanimous vote, IT WAS ORDERED that the meeting of Tuesday, January 28, 2020 be adjourned in memory of Endina Celiz Rapan, a Coachella resident, farmworker and a great leader and co-founder of an organization that fights for the right of women farmworkers, passed away on January 9, 2020, at the age of 94 years old.

Enedina was born in Manzanillo, Colima, México. She attended nursing school in Manzanillo and was a nurse before immigrating to the United States. She and her husband, Jacinto Rondolos Rapan, were part of a farm laborer family that followed the grape harvest from Yuma, Arizona to California's fruitful Central Valley. She later became a certified nutritionist and worked in that profession with Campesinos Unidos and the Coachella Senior Center.

Enedina was a tireless advocate for human rights. She worked with the United Farm Workers and Cesar Chavez from the 1960's into the late 1980's. In 1988, alongside Milly Treviño and strong farmworker women leaders, she co-founded Líderes Campesinas. Líderes Campesinas advocates for the rights, education and health of farmworkers throughout the nation. Through her activism, she promoted awareness of human rights, taught English, and assisted with legal and legalization processes and other basic skills for those in need. She worked diligently to improve conditions for farmworkers, fighting to bring restrooms to the fields and organizing and cooking meals for senior citizens in the community so they could have dinner to eat. In 2003, Enedina earned recognition for her work as a recipient of the Senior Inspiration Award. She is honored in the City of Coachella as on the city's "Hometown Heroes."

In her 45 years in the Coachella Valley, Enedina was an active member of our Lady of Soledad Parish. She served as a lector, catechism teacher, youth group leader and leader in the Guadalupanas group. Enedina was a woman of great and unwavering faith. She lived a life of service to others. We honor her exceptional contributions to our community.

Enedina's memory and passionate spirit will live forever in the hearts of those who knew and loved her.
