On motion of Supervisor Perez, seconded by Supervisor Spiegel, and duly carried by unanimous vote, IT WAS ORDERED that the meeting of Tuesday, February 25, 2020 be adjourned in memory of Fred Dominguez, a longtime resident, business owner and councilman in Lake Elsinore, California, who passed away on January 22, 2020.

Fred was a U.S. Marine during the Korean War. A post-World War II housing shortage on Camp Pendleton and cheap rent led Fred to live in the town, then called Elsinore. In 1954, he began working as an apprentice barber, and later owned and operated Elsinore Barber and Beauty for over sixty years.

In 2017, Fred decided to relinquish his shop at 115 N. Main Street to fellow barber and current Temecula City Councilman – James “Stew” Stewart. The two have been friends for years. He plans to retain the shop’s name, personnel and mid-20th-century ambiance, while making a few enhancements. There are two toy pony chairs that were made in 1927, in which several generations of tots have experienced their first haircuts, and the adult chairs date back to the 1940’s. There’s a poster in the shop dated 1955 with pictures of the styles of the day such as “butch,” “flat top,” “crew cut” and “Ivy League.”

Fred Dominguez has left his imprint on the town of Lake Elsinore in many ways. He began a boxing program for boys, put up a building for charity work at St. Frances of Rome church and headed a drive to clean up downtown’s City Park. As a councilman from 1986 to 1994, Fred supported a renovation of downtown Main Street, providing the quaint charm that continues to surprise previously unacquainted visitors. He also voted in favor of building the city-owned minor league stadium, The Diamond, which opened in the mid-1990’s and has become a regional attraction.

Fred’s memory and passionate spirit will live forever in the hearts of those who knew and loved him. He will be missed but never forgotten.

On motion of Supervisor Perez, seconded by Supervisor Spiegel, and duly carried by unanimous vote, IT WAS ORDERED that the meeting of Tuesday, February 25, 2020 be adjourned in memory of Ron Hartley, who passed away on January 27, 2020, at the age of 81.

Ron was born in Toronto, Ontario, Canada on March 1, 1938. His family moved to California when he was six, and he graduated from Montebello High School in 1957. Through high school, Ron trained thoroughbred horses with his father. He was involved in nearly every aspect of horse racing. Since starting his career at the age of 19, he became one of the youngest trainers on the Southern California circuit. After graduation, he joined the Air National Guard and served from 1956 to 1963. While in high school, Ron met the love of his life, Jeryl Barillaro, and they married in 1960.

Ron and his family moved to Canyon Lake in 1976. He was working as a racing secretary for various horse racing tracks and fairs at the time, making quite a name for himself. Although nationally, Ron is most known for his involvement in the racehorse industry, it's Ron's involvement in the commercial properties within Canyon Lake community that will keep his name in the area history books forever. HUB Enterprises was founded by Ron, his father-in-law Alfred Barillaro and his brother-in-law Larry Uebersetzig, after the three partnered in Canyon Lake Realty in the 1970's. Ron saw Canyon Lake's commercial potential and left his horse racing career to focus on commercial developments. Ron was the go to person for anything commercial in Canyon Lake and was often called upon by city officials, local business owners, commercial property owners and anyone who needed questions answered or problems solved.

Ron was named Canyon Lake's Citizen of the Year and was instrumental in the creation of the Veterans Memorial Park in the Canyon Lake Town Center. Much like his life shifted to commercial development in the 1970's because of a single offer to purchase property, in 1990 Ron began owning and racing Quarter Horses, although still active in his Canyon Lake and Menifee business. Ron owned Quarter Horses and had substantial success. Ron was selected for the Frank Vessels award, and said it was a huge honor and one of his greatest moments in Quarter Horse racing.

Ron's memory and passionate spirit will live forever in the hearts of those who knew and loved him. He was a true Canyon Lake pioneer and legend. He will be missed but never forgotten.
