

BACKGROUND:

Summary

The X-Series Zoll Automatic Electronic Defibrillator (AED) monitor is used on most emergency responses to read patients' cardiovascular vital signs and provide urgent information to First Responders. The asset was lost on July 26, 2019, at approximately 8:55 p.m. on Cajalco Road between Robinson Street and Tyler Street in the community of Mead Valley. The specified Fire Engine responded to a pedestrian that was struck by a vehicle. After its use, the asset was not secured to the fire engine properly and thus was lost upon departure from the scene. A formal investigation has been activated by Cal Fire to investigate the loss of the asset and to identify all types of preventative measures that can be taken to ensure this does not occur in the future.

In the meantime, every Zoll AED monitor in the field has a twin backup monitor in the case of damage or loss of the primary monitor. This is to ensure continuity of services for the fire engine. The backup is currently in service. A replacement monitor will be procured utilizing proper purchasing procedures.

Impact on Residents and Businesses

The current backup AED is ensuring continuity of services are being provided to the citizens and businesses of Riverside County.

Additional Fiscal Information

The lost asset #1903 was purchased on November 27, 2017, at a cost of \$25,075. A replacement asset will be an X-Series Zoll AED monitor at a cost of \$27,956. The average life of a monitor is seven (7) years.
