

BACKGROUND:

Summary

The Cooperative Agreement sets forth the terms and conditions by which certain flood control facilities, required as a condition of approval for Plot Plan No. 180023 are to be constructed by the Developer and inspected, operated and maintained by the District, the County (acting through the County's Transportation Department) and the Developer.

The Agreement is necessary to provide for the District's construction inspection and subsequent ownership and maintenance of the Perris Valley MDP Lateral H-11.1, Stage 2 facility. Upon completion of construction, and acceptance by the District, the District will assume ownership, operation and maintenance of District facilities in accordance with the terms and conditions as set forth in the Agreement. The County (acting through its Transportation Department) will assume ownership and responsibility for the operation and maintenance of the project's associated catch basins, inlets, curbs and gutters, concrete collar and connector pipes and laterals that are 36 inches or less in diameter located within County rights of way. The Developer will retain ownership, operation and maintenance of the detention basin located within its rights of way.

County Counsel has approved the Agreement as to legal form and the Developer has executed the Agreement. A companion item appears on the Riverside County Flood Control and Water Conservation District Agenda this same date.

Impact on Residents and Businesses

Construction of these drainage improvements is a requirement for the development of Plot Plan No. 180023. The principal beneficiaries are the future tenants. Ancillary benefits will accrue to the public who will utilize the roadways.

Additional Fiscal Information

The Developer is funding all construction and construction inspection costs. Future operation and maintenance costs of the District maintained storm drain facilities will accrue to the District. Future operation and maintenance costs of the County maintained storm drain facilities located within the County right of way will accrue to the Transportation Department.

COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT

This Cooperative Agreement ("Agreement"), dated as of _____, 2020, is entered into by and between the Riverside County Flood Control and Water Conservation District, a body politic ("DISTRICT"), the County of Riverside, a political subdivision of the State of California ("COUNTY"), and Rider Commerce, L.L.C., a Delaware limited liability company ("DEVELOPER"), (together, the "Parties"). The Parties hereto agree as follows:

RECITALS

A. DEVELOPER is the legal owner of record of certain real property located within the County of Riverside. DEVELOPER has submitted for approval Plot Plan No. 180023 located in an unincorporated area of western Riverside County. As a condition of approval for Plot Plan No. 180023, DEVELOPER must construct certain flood control facilities in order to provide flood protection and drainage for DEVELOPER's planned development; and

B. The legal description of Plot Plan No. 180023 is provided in Exhibit "A" attached hereto and made a part hereof; and

C. The required flood control facilities and drainage improvements, are identified in DISTRICT's Perris Valley Master Drainage Plan ("MDP"), as shown on DISTRICT's Drawing No. 4-1147, and as shown in concept in blue on Exhibit "B", attached hereto and made a part hereof and includes the construction of:

(i) Approximately 1,362 lineal feet of underground storm drain system including its transition structure ("STAGE 2"). At its downstream terminus, STAGE 2 will connect to the proposed Perris Valley MDP Lateral H-11.1, Stage 1 facility;

(ii) All safety devices requested by DISTRICT staff during the course of PROJECT construction, including but not limited to concrete pads, slope protection barriers, signage and fencing, ("SAFETY DEVICES").

SAFETY DEVICES shall be purchased and installed by DEVELOPER, and subject to the DISTRICT's inspection and approval. STAGE 2 and SAFETY DEVICES are hereinafter called "DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES"; and

D. Associated with the construction of DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES is the construction of certain catch basins, curbs and gutters, concrete collar, connector pipes, inlets, and various lateral storm drains that are thirty-six inches (36") or less in diameter that are located within COUNTY held easements or rights of way ("APPURTENANCES"); and

E. Also associated with the construction of DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES is the construction of a detention basin located within DEVELOPER held rights of way or easements ("DEVELOPER BASIN"), to be initially owned and maintained by DEVELOPER and subsequently owned and maintained by the Property Owners' for Plot Plan 180023; and

F. Together, DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES, APPURTENANCES and DEVELOPER BASIN are hereinafter called "PROJECT"; and

G. STAGE 2 includes a segment of DISTRICT's Perris Valley MDP Lateral H-11.1 ("ADP FACILITY"), which is an identified segment of COUNTY's Perris Valley Area Drainage Plan (ADP); and

H. The ADP Fee obligation for Plot Plan 180023 ("OBLIGATION"), is calculated based on the current fee at the time of issuance of building permits; and

I. If DISTRICT estimates that upon constructing STAGE 2, DEVELOPER would earn ADP Fee credit ("CREDIT"), the estimated difference between OBLIGATION and CREDIT will result in an excess ADP Fee credit ("EXCESS CREDIT"); and

J. Pursuant to the "Rules and Regulations for Administration of Area Drainage Plans", dated June 10, 1980, as amended, ("RULES"), and the provisions of this Agreement, CREDIT earned by DEVELOPER for the construction of ADP FACILITY may be used to satisfy OBLIGATION; and

K. Pursuant to RULES and this Agreement, EXCESS CREDIT may be used to satisfy the requirement to pay ADP Fees for certain properties located within the boundaries of the Perris Valley ADP, hereinafter called "ELIGIBLE PROPERTIES"; and

L. DEVELOPER and the owner(s) of other ELIGIBLE PROPERTIES may desire to transfer some or all of DEVELOPER's EXCESS CREDIT to ELIGIBLE PROPERTIES. In such event, DEVELOPER and owner(s) will enter into (a) separate agreement(s) concerning the transfer of DEVELOPER's EXCESS CREDIT from DEVELOPER to said owner(s) as set forth herein; and

M. All parties recognize and acknowledge that Perris Valley MDP Lateral H-11.1, Stage 1 "PROPOSED LATERAL H-11.1 STAGE 1", which is currently under construction pursuant to a separate Agreement and at the time of this Cooperative Agreement. DISTRICT will not accept DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES for ownership, operation and maintenance until PROPOSED LATERAL H-11.1 STAGE 1 is completed and accepted for ownership, operation and maintenance; and

N. DEVELOPER and COUNTY desire DISTRICT to accept ownership and responsibility for the operation and maintenance of DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES. Therefore, DISTRICT must review and approve DEVELOPER's plans and specifications for

PROJECT and subsequently inspect the construction of DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES;
and

O. DEVELOPER and DISTRICT desire COUNTY to accept ownership and responsibility for the operation and maintenance of APPURTENANCES. Therefore, COUNTY must review and approve DEVELOPER's plans and specifications for PROJECT and subsequently inspect and approve the construction of APPURTENANCES; and

P. DEVELOPER is willing to assume ownership, operation and maintenance responsibilities of DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES on an interim basis as set forth herein, with the recognition and understanding that the actual acceptance of DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES for ownership, operation and maintenance responsibilities by DISTRICT is entirely dependent upon: (i) the construction of PROPOSED LATERAL H-11.1 STAGE 1 being complete; (ii) DISTRICT acceptance of ownership and responsibility for the operation and maintenance of PROPOSED LATERAL H-11.1 STAGE 1; (iii) DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES being constructed in accordance with plans and specifications approved by DISTRICT and as set forth herein; (iv) DISTRICT's sole determination that DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES are in a satisfactorily maintained condition, and (v) DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES are fully functioning as a flood control drainage system as solely determined by DISTRICT; and

Q. DISTRICT is willing to: (i) review and approve DEVELOPER's plans and specifications for PROJECT, (ii) inspect the construction of DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES, and (iii) accept ownership and responsibility for the operation and maintenance of DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES, provided DEVELOPER (a) complies with this Agreement, (b) constructs PROJECT in accordance with DISTRICT and COUNTY approved plans and specifications, and (c) accepts ownership and responsibility for the operation and

maintenance of PROJECT following completion of PROJECT construction until such time as DISTRICT accepts ownership and responsibility for the operation and maintenance of DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES; and

R. COUNTY is willing to (i) review and approve DEVELOPER's plans and specifications for PROJECT, (ii) inspect the construction of PROJECT, (iii) accept and hold faithful performance and payment bonds submitted by DEVELOPER for DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES and APPURTENANCES, (iv) grant DISTRICT the right to inspect, operate and maintain DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES within COUNTY rights of way, and (v) accept ownership and responsibility for the operation and maintenance of APPURTENANCES, provided PROJECT is constructed in accordance with plans and specifications approved by DISTRICT and COUNTY.

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties hereto mutually agree as follows:

SECTION I

DEVELOPER shall:

1. Prepare PROJECT plans and specifications, hereinafter called "IMPROVEMENT PLANS", in accordance with applicable DISTRICT and COUNTY standards, and submit to DISTRICT and COUNTY for their review and approval.
2. Continue to pay DISTRICT, within thirty (30) days after receipt of periodic billings from DISTRICT, any and all such amounts as are deemed reasonably necessary by DISTRICT to cover DISTRICT's costs associated with the review of IMPROVEMENT PLANS, review and approval of rights of way and conveyance documents, and with the processing and administration of this Cooperative Agreement.
3. Deposit with DISTRICT (Attention: Business Office - Accounts Receivable), at the time of providing written notice to DISTRICT of the start of PROJECT

construction as set forth in Section I.8., the estimated cost of providing construction inspection for DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES, in an amount as determined and approved by DISTRICT in accordance with Ordinance Nos. 671 and 749 of the County of Riverside, including any amendments thereto, based upon the bonded value of DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES. If at any time the costs exceed the deposit or are anticipated by DISTRICT to exceed the deposit with DISTRICT, DEVELOPER shall pay such additional amount(s), as deemed reasonably necessary by DISTRICT to complete inspection of PROJECT, within thirty (30) days after receipt of billing from DISTRICT.

4. Secure, at its sole cost and expense, all necessary licenses, agreements, permits and rights of entry as may be needed for the construction, inspection, operation and maintenance of PROJECT. DEVELOPER shall furnish DISTRICT and COUNTY, at the time of providing written notice to DISTRICT of the start of construction as set forth in Section I.8., or not less than twenty (20) days prior to recordation of the final map for Plot Plan No. 180023 or any phase thereof, whichever occurs first, with sufficient evidence of DEVELOPER having secured such necessary licenses, agreements, permits and rights of entry, as determined and approved by DISTRICT and COUNTY.

5. Prior to commencing construction, furnish DISTRICT and COUNTY with copies of all permits, approvals or agreements required by any federal, state or local resource and/or regulatory agency for the construction, operation and maintenance of PROJECT. Such documents include but are not limited to those issued by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, California Regional Water Quality Control Board, California State Department of Fish and Wildlife, State Water Resources Control Board, and Western Riverside County Regional Conservation Authority ("REGULATORY PERMITS").

6. Grant DISTRICT and COUNTY, by execution of this Agreement, the right to enter upon DEVELOPER's property where necessary and convenient for the purpose of gaining access to and performing inspection service for the construction of PROJECT as set forth herein.

7. Provide COUNTY, at the time of providing written notice to DISTRICT of the start of construction as set forth in Section I.8. or not less than twenty (20) days prior to recordation of the final map for Plot Plan No. 180023 or any phase thereof, whichever occurs first, with faithful performance and payment bonds, each in the amount of one hundred percent (100%) of the estimated cost for construction of DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES as determined by DISTRICT and of APPURTENANCES as determined by COUNTY. The surety, amount and form of the bonds, shall be subject to approval of DISTRICT and COUNTY. The bonds shall remain in full force and effect until DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES are accepted by DISTRICT and COUNTY as complete; at which time the bond amount may be reduced to five percent (5%) for a period of one (1) year to guarantee against any defective work, labor or materials.

8. Notify DISTRICT in writing (Attention: Contract Services Section) at least twenty (20) days prior to the start of construction of PROJECT. Construction shall not begin on any element of PROJECT, for any reason whatsoever, until DISTRICT and COUNTY have issued to DEVELOPER a written Notice to Proceed authorizing DEVELOPER to commence construction of PROJECT.

9. [INTENTIONALLY DELETED]

10. [INTENTIONALLY DELETED]

11. Furnish DISTRICT, at the time of providing written notice to DISTRICT and COUNTY of the start of construction as set forth in Section I.8., with a complete list of all

contractors and subcontractors to be performing work on PROJECT, including the corresponding license number and license classification of each. At such time, DEVELOPER shall further identify in writing its designated superintendent for PROJECT construction.

12. Furnish DISTRICT, at the time of providing written notice to DISTRICT and COUNTY of the start of construction as set forth in Section I.8., a construction schedule which shall show the order and dates in which DEVELOPER or DEVELOPER's contractor proposes to carry out the various parts of work, including estimated start and completion dates. As construction of PROJECT progresses, DEVELOPER shall update said construction schedule as requested by DISTRICT and/or COUNTY.

13. Furnish DISTRICT with final mylar plans for DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES, and assign their ownership to DISTRICT prior to the start on any portion of PROJECT construction.

14. Not permit any change to, or modification of, DISTRICT and COUNTY approved IMPROVEMENT PLANS without the prior written permission and consent of DISTRICT and COUNTY.

15. Comply with all Cal/OSHA safety regulations including, but not limited to, regulations concerning confined space and maintain a safe working environment for DEVELOPER, DISTRICT and COUNTY employees on the site.

16. Furnish DISTRICT, at the time of providing written notice to DISTRICT of the start of construction as set forth in Section I.8., a confined space entry procedure specific to PROJECT. The procedure shall comply with requirements contained in California Code of Regulations, Title 8, Section 5158, Other Confined Space Operations, Section 5157, Permit Required Confined Space and District Confined Space Procedures, SOM-18. The procedure shall be reviewed and approved by DISTRICT prior to the issuance of a Notice to Proceed.

17. DEVELOPER shall not commence operations until DISTRICT and COUNTY have been furnished with original certificate(s) of insurance and original certified copies of endorsements and if requested, certified original policies of insurance including all endorsements and any and all other attachments. Prior to DISTRICT issuing a Notice to Proceed to its construction contractor(s) to begin construction of PROJECT, an original certificate of insurance evidencing the required insurance coverage shall be provided to DISTRICT. At minimum, the procured insurance coverages should adhere to DISTRICT's required insurance provided in Exhibit "C", attached hereto and made a part hereof. Failure to maintain the insurance required by this paragraph shall be deemed a material breach of this Agreement and shall authorize and constitute authority for DISTRICT, at its sole discretion, to provide written notice to DEVELOPER that DISTRICT is unable to perform its obligations hereunder, nor to accept responsibility for ownership, operation and maintenance of DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES due, either in whole or in part, to said breach of this Agreement.

18. Construct or cause to be constructed, PROJECT at DEVELOPER's sole cost and expense in accordance with DISTRICT and COUNTY approved IMPROVEMENT PLANS.

19. Within two (2) weeks of completing PROJECT construction, provide DISTRICT (Attention: Construction Management Section) and COUNTY with written notice that PROJECT construction is substantially complete and requesting that DISTRICT conduct a final inspection of DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES and COUNTY conduct a final inspection of APPURTENANCES. It is mutually understood that, prior to DISTRICT acceptance of ownership and responsibility for the operation and maintenance of DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES, DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES shall be in a satisfactorily maintained condition as solely determined by DISTRICT.

20. [INTENTIONALLY DELETED]

21. [INTENTIONALLY DELETED]

22. Accept ownership and sole responsibility for the operation and maintenance of PROJECT until such time as DISTRICT accepts ownership and responsibility for operation and maintenance of DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES and PROPOSED LATERAL H-11.1 STAGE 1, COUNTY accepts ownership and responsibility for operation and maintenance of APPURTENANCES, and the Property Owner's accepts ownership and responsibility for the operation and maintenance of DEVELOPER BASIN.

23. Accept all liability whatsoever associated with the ownership, operation and maintenance of DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES until such time as DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES are formally accepted by DISTRICT for ownership, operation and maintenance.

24. Pay, if suit is brought upon this Agreement or any bond guaranteeing the completion of PROJECT, all costs and reasonable expenses and fees, including reasonable attorneys' fees, and acknowledge that, upon entry of judgment, all such costs, expenses and fees shall be computed as costs and included in any judgment rendered.

25. Upon completion of PROJECT construction, but prior to DISTRICT acceptance of DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES for ownership, operation and maintenance, provide or cause its civil engineer of record or construction civil engineer of record, duly registered in the State of California, to provide DISTRICT with a redlined "record drawings" copy of PROJECT plans. After DISTRICT approval of the redlined "record drawings", DEVELOPER's engineer shall schedule with DISTRICT a time to transfer the redlined changes onto DISTRICT's original mylars at DISTRICT's office, after which the engineer shall review, stamp and sign the original PROJECT engineering plans "record drawings".

26. Ensure that all work performed pursuant to this Agreement by DEVELOPER, its agents or contractors is done in accordance with all applicable laws and regulations, including but not limited to all applicable provisions of the Labor Code, Business and Professions Code, and Water Code. DEVELOPER shall be solely responsible for all costs associated with compliance with applicable laws and regulations.

SECTION II

DISTRICT shall:

1. Review IMPROVEMENT PLANS and approve when DISTRICT has determined that such plans meet DISTRICT standards and are found acceptable to DISTRICT prior to the start of PROJECT construction.
2. Provide COUNTY an opportunity to review and approve IMPROVEMENT PLANS prior to DISTRICT's final approval.
3. Upon execution of this Agreement, record or cause to be recorded, a copy of this Agreement in the Official Records of the Riverside County Recorder.
4. [INTENTIONALLY DELETED]
5. Inspect construction of DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES.
6. Keep an accurate accounting of all DISTRICT costs associated with the review and approval of IMPROVEMENT PLANS, the review and approval of right of way and conveyance documents, and the processing and administration of this Agreement.
7. Keep an accurate accounting of all DISTRICT construction inspection costs, and within forty-five (45) days after DISTRICT acceptance of DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES as being complete, submit a final cost statement to DEVELOPER. If the deposit, as set forth in Section I.3., exceeds such costs, DISTRICT shall reimburse DEVELOPER the

excess amount within sixty (60) days after DISTRICT acceptance of DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES as being complete.

8. Accept ownership and sole responsibility for the operation and maintenance of DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES upon (i) the completion of PROPOSED LATERAL H-11.1 STAGE 1 construction, (ii) DISTRICT acceptance of PROPOSED LATERAL H-11.1 STAGE 1 for ownership, operation and maintenance, (iii) DISTRICT inspection of DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES in accordance with Section I.19., (iv) DISTRICT acceptance of PROJECT construction as being complete, (v) DISTRICT receipt of stamped and signed "record drawings" of PROJECT plans, as set forth in Section I.25., (vi) COUNTY acceptance of APPURTENANCES for ownership, operation, and maintenance, and (vii) DISTRICT's sole determination that DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES are in a satisfactorily maintained condition.

9. Provide COUNTY with a reproducible duplicate copy of the "record drawings" of PROJECT plans upon DISTRICT acceptance of DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES as being complete.

SECTION III

COUNTY shall:

1. Review IMPROVEMENT PLANS and approve when COUNTY has determined that such plans meet County standards and are found acceptable to COUNTY prior to the start of PROJECT construction.

2. Accept COUNTY and DISTRICT approved faithful performance and payment bonds submitted by DEVELOPER as set forth in Section I.7., and hold said bonds as provided herein.

3. Inspect PROJECT construction.

4. [INTENTIONALLY DELETED]
5. [INTENTIONALLY DELETED]
6. Grant DISTRICT, by execution of this Agreement, the right to construct, inspect, operate and maintain DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES within COUNTY rights of way.
7. Accept ownership and sole responsibility for the operation and maintenance of APPURTENANCES.
8. Release occupancy permits in accordance with the approved conditions of approval.
9. Upon DISTRICT and COUNTY acceptance of PROJECT construction as being complete, accept sole responsibility for the adjustment of all PROJECT manhole rings and covers located within COUNTY rights of way which must be performed at such time(s) that the finished grade along and above the underground portions of DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES are improved, repaired, replaced or changed. It being further understood and agreed that any such adjustments shall be performed at no cost to DISTRICT.

SECTION IV

It is further mutually agreed:

1. All work involved with PROJECT shall be inspected by DISTRICT and COUNTY, and shall not be deemed complete until DISTRICT and COUNTY mutually agree in writing that construction is completed in accordance with DISTRICT and COUNTY approved IMPROVEMENT PLANS.
2. COUNTY and DEVELOPER personnel may observe and inspect all work being done on PROJECT but shall provide any comments to DISTRICT personnel who shall be

solely responsible for all quality control communications with DEVELOPER's contractor(s) during the construction of PROJECT.

3. DISTRICT acceptance of ownership and responsibility for the operation and maintenance of DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES shall be in a satisfactorily maintained condition as solely determined by DISTRICT. If, subsequent to the inspection and, in the sole discretion of DISTRICT, DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES are not in an acceptable condition, corrections shall be made at sole expense of DEVELOPER.

4. DEVELOPER shall complete construction of PROJECT within twenty-four (24) consecutive months after execution of this Agreement and within one hundred twenty (120) consecutive calendar days after commencing work on PROJECT. It is expressly understood that since time is of the essence in this Agreement, failure of DEVELOPER to perform the work within the agreed upon time shall constitute authority for DISTRICT to perform the remaining work and require DEVELOPER's surety to pay to COUNTY the penal sum of any and all bonds. In which case, COUNTY shall subsequently reimburse DISTRICT for DISTRICT costs incurred.

5. If DEVELOPER fails to commence construction of PROJECT within nine (9) months after execution of this Cooperative Agreement, then DISTRICT reserves the right to withhold issuance of the Notice to Proceed pending a review of the existing site conditions as they exist at the time DEVELOPER provides written notification to DISTRICT of the start of construction as set forth in Section I.8. In the event of a change in the existing site conditions that materially affects PROJECT function or DISTRICT's ability to operate and maintain DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES, DISTRICT may require DEVELOPER to modify IMPROVEMENT PLANS as deemed necessary by DISTRICT.

6. DISTRICT shall endeavor to issue DEVELOPER a Notice to Proceed within twenty (20) days of receipt of DEVELOPER's complete written notice, as set forth in

Section I.8.; however, DISTRICT's construction inspection staff is limited and, therefore, the issuance of a Notice to Proceed is subject to staff availability.

In the event DEVELOPER wishes to expedite issuance of a Notice to Proceed, DEVELOPER may elect to furnish an independent qualified construction inspector at DEVELOPER's sole cost and expense. DEVELOPER shall furnish appropriate documentation of the individual's credentials and experience to DISTRICT for review and, if appropriate, approval. DISTRICT shall review the individual's qualifications and experience and, upon approval thereof, said individual, hereinafter called "DEPUTY INSPECTOR", shall be authorized to act on DISTRICT's behalf on all PROJECT construction and quality control matters. If DEVELOPER's initial construction inspection deposit furnished pursuant to Section I.3. exceeds ten thousand dollars (\$10,000), DISTRICT shall refund to DEVELOPER up to eighty percent (80%) of DEVELOPER's initial inspection deposit within forty-five (45) days of DISTRICT's approval of DEPUTY INSPECTOR; however, a minimum balance of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) shall be retained on account.

7. PROJECT construction work shall be on a five (5) day, forty (40) hour work week with no work on Saturdays, Sundays or DISTRICT designated legal holidays, unless otherwise approved in writing by DISTRICT. If DEVELOPER feels it is necessary to work more than the normal forty (40) hour work week or on holidays, DEVELOPER shall make a written request for permission from DISTRICT and COUNTY to work the additional hours. The request shall be submitted to DISTRICT and COUNTY at least seventy-two (72) hours prior to the requested additional work hours and state the reasons for the overtime and the specific time frames required. The decision of granting permission for overtime work shall be made by DISTRICT at its sole discretion and shall be final. If permission is granted by DISTRICT, DEVELOPER will be charged the cost incurred at the overtime rates for additional inspection

time required in connection with the overtime work in accordance with Ordinance Nos. 671 and 749, including any amendments thereto, of the County of Riverside.

8. DEVELOPER shall indemnify and hold harmless DISTRICT and COUNTY (including their agencies, districts, special districts and departments, their respective directors, officers, Board of Supervisors, elected and appointed officials, employees, agents and representatives) from any liability, claim, damage, proceeding or action, present or future, based upon, arising out of or in any way relating to DEVELOPER's (including its officers, employees, subcontractors and agents) actual or alleged acts or omissions related to this Agreement, performance under this Agreement, or failure to comply with the requirements of this Agreement, including but not limited to: (a) property damage; (b) bodily injury or death; (c) liability or damage pursuant to Article I, Section 19 of the California Constitution, the Fifth Amendment of the United States Constitution or any other law, ordinance or regulation caused by the diversion of waters from the natural drainage patterns or the discharge of drainage within or from PROJECT; or (d) any other element of any kind or nature whatsoever.

DEVELOPER shall defend, at its sole expense, including all costs and fees (including but not limited to attorney fees, cost of investigation, defense and settlements or awards), DISTRICT and COUNTY (including their agencies, districts, special districts and departments, their respective directors, officers, Board of Supervisors, elected and appointed officials, employees, agents and representatives) in any claim, proceeding or action for which indemnification is required.

With respect to any of DEVELOPER's indemnification requirements, DEVELOPER shall, at its sole cost, have the right to use counsel of their own choice and shall have the right to adjust, settle, compromise any such claim, proceeding or action without the prior consent of DISTRICT and COUNTY; provided, however, that any such adjustment, settlement

or compromise in no manner whatsoever limits or circumscribes DEVELOPER's indemnification obligations to DISTRICT or COUNTY.

DEVELOPER's indemnification obligations shall be satisfied when DEVELOPER has provided to DISTRICT and COUNTY the appropriate form of dismissal (or similar document) relieving DISTRICT or COUNTY from any liability for the claim, proceeding or action involved.

The specified insurance limits required in this Cooperative Agreement shall in no way limit or circumscribe DEVELOPER's obligations to indemnify and hold harmless DISTRICT and COUNTY from third party claims.

In the event there is conflict between this section and California Civil Code Section 2782, this section shall be interpreted to comply with California Civil Code Section 2782. Such interpretation shall not relieve DEVELOPER from indemnifying DISTRICT or COUNTY to the fullest extent allowed by law.

9. DEVELOPER for itself, its successors and assigns hereby releases DISTRICT and COUNTY, their respective officers, agents, and employees from any and all claims, demands, actions, or suits of any kind arising out of any liability, known or unknown, present or future, including, but not limited to any claim or liability, based or asserted, pursuant to Article I, Section 19 of the California Constitution, the Fifth Amendment of the United States Constitution, or any other law or ordinance which seeks to impose any other liability or damage, whatsoever, for damage caused by the discharge of drainage within or from PROJECT. Nothing contained herein shall constitute a release by DEVELOPER of DISTRICT or COUNTY, their officers, agents and employees from any and all claims, demands, actions or suits of any kind arising out of any liability, known or unknown, present or future, for the negligent maintenance of DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES and APPURTENANCES, after the acceptance of

DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES and APPURTENANCES by DISTRICT and COUNTY, respectively.

10. Any waiver by DISTRICT or by COUNTY of any breach of any one or more of the terms of this Agreement shall not be construed to be a waiver of any subsequent or other breach of the same or of any other term hereof. Failure on the part of DISTRICT or COUNTY to require exact, full and complete compliance with any terms of this Agreement shall not be construed as, in any manner, changing the terms hereof, or estopping DISTRICT or COUNTY from enforcement hereof.

11. This Agreement is to be construed in accordance with the laws of the State of California. If any provision in this Agreement is held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, void, or unenforceable, the remaining provisions shall remain in full force and effect without being impaired or invalidated in any way.

12. Any and all notices sent or required to be sent to the parties of this Agreement will be mailed by first class mail, postage prepaid, to the following addresses:

13. Any action at law or in equity brought by any of the parties hereto for the purpose of enforcing a right or rights provided for by the Agreement, shall be tried in a court of competent jurisdiction in the County of Riverside, State of California, and the parties hereto

waive all provisions of law providing for a change of venue in such proceedings to any other county.

14. This Agreement is the result of negotiations between the parties hereto, and the advice and assistance of their respective counsel. The fact that this Agreement was prepared as a matter of convenience by DISTRICT shall have no import or significance. Any uncertainty or ambiguity in this Agreement shall not be construed against DISTRICT because DISTRICT prepared this Agreement in its final form.

15. The rights and obligations of DEVELOPER shall inure to and be binding upon all heirs, successors and assignees.

16. DEVELOPER shall not assign or otherwise transfer any of its rights, duties or obligations hereunder to any person or entity without the written consent of the other parties hereto being first obtained. In the event of any such transfer or assignment, DEVELOPER expressly understands and agrees that it shall remain liable with respect to any and all of the obligations and duties contained in this Agreement.

17. The individual(s) executing this Agreement on behalf of DEVELOPER certify that they have the authority within their respective company(ies) to enter into and execute this Agreement, and have been authorized to do so by all boards of directors, legal counsel, and/or any other board, committee or other entity within their respective company(ies) which have the authority to authorize or deny entering into this Agreement.

18. This Agreement may be executed in one or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original but all of which taken together shall constitute one and the same instrument.

19. This Agreement is intended by the parties hereto as a final expression of their understanding with respect to the subject matter hereof and as a complete and exclusive

statement of the terms and conditions thereof and supersedes any and all prior and contemporaneous agreements and understandings, oral or written, in connection therewith. This Agreement may be changed or modified only upon the written consent of the parties hereto.

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



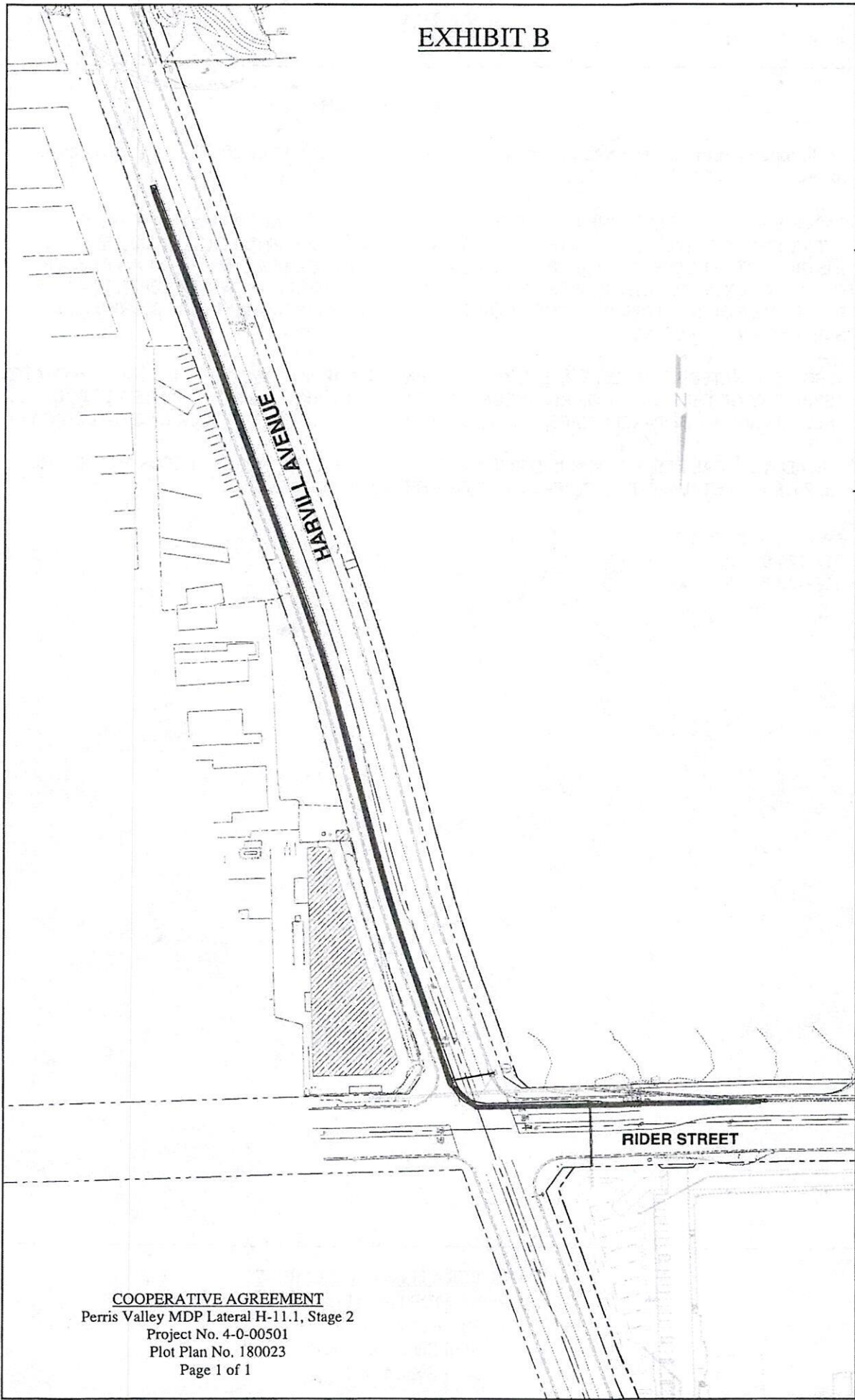

DISTRICT's Insurance Requirements is as follows:

Without limiting or diminishing DEVELOPER's obligation to indemnify or hold DISTRICT harmless, DEVELOPER shall procure and maintain or cause to be maintained, at its sole cost and expense, the following insurance coverage's during the term of this Agreement. As respects to the insurance section only, the DISTRICT herein refers to the Riverside County Flood Control and Water Conservation District, the County of Riverside, its Agencies, Districts, Special Districts, and Departments, their respective directors, officers, Board of Supervisors, employees, elected or appointed officials, agents or representatives as Additional Insureds.

A. Workers' Compensation:

If DEVELOPER has employees as defined by the State of California, DEVELOPER shall maintain statutory Workers' Compensation Insurance (Coverage A) as prescribed by the laws of the State of California. Policy shall include Employers' Liability (Coverage B) including Occupational Disease with limits not less than \$1,000,000 per person per accident. Policy shall be endorsed to waive subrogation in favor of DISTRICT.

B. Commercial General Liability:

Commercial General Liability insurance coverage, including but not limited to, premises liability, unmodified contractual liability, products and completed operations liability, personal and advertising injury, and cross liability coverage, covering claims which may arise from or out of

DEVELOPER's performance of its obligations hereunder. Policy shall name the DISTRICT as Additional Insured. Policy's limit of liability shall not be less than \$2,000,000 per occurrence combined single limit. If such insurance contains a general aggregate limit, it shall apply separately to this Agreement or be no less than two (2) times the occurrence limit.

C. Vehicle Liability:

If DEVELOPER's vehicles or mobile equipment are used in the performance of the obligations under this Agreement, then DEVELOPER shall maintain liability insurance for all owned, non-owned or hired vehicles so used in an amount not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence combined single limit. If such insurance contains a general aggregate limit, it shall apply separately to this Agreement or be no less than two (2) times the occurrence limit. Policy shall name the DISTRICT as Additional Insureds.

D. Professional Liability:

DEVELOPER shall cause any architect or engineer retained by DEVELOPER in connection with the performance of DEVELOPER's obligations under this Agreement to maintain Professional Liability Insurance providing coverage for the performance of their work included within this Agreement, with a limit of liability of not less than \$2,000,000 per occurrence and \$4,000,000 annual aggregate. DEVELOPER shall require that, if such Professional Liability Insurance is written on a claims made basis rather than an occurrence basis, such insurance shall continue through the term of this Agreement and that such architect or engineer shall purchase at such architect

or engineer's sole expense either 1) an Extended Reporting Endorsement (also known as Tail Coverage); or 2) Prior Dates Coverage from a new insurer with a retroactive date back to the date of, or prior to, the inception of this Agreement; or 3) demonstrate through Certificates of Insurance that such architect or engineer has maintained continuous coverage with the same or original insurer. Coverage provided under items: 1), 2) or 3) shall continue for the term specified in the insurance policy as long as the law allows.

E. Pollution and Asbestos Liability:

DEVELOPER or its construction contractor(s) shall obtain, at its sole expense and keep in effect during the term of the contract, Pollution Legal Liability and/or Asbestos Legal Liability and/or Errors and Omissions (if project involves environmental hazards) covering DEVELOPER's or its construction contractor(s) liability for a third party bodily injury and property damage arising from pollution conditions caused by the DEVELOPER or its construction contractor(s) while performing their operations under the contract. The insurance coverage shall apply to sudden and accidental pollution events. Any coverage restriction as to time limit for discovery of a pollution incident and/or a time limit for notice to the insurer must be accepted by the DISTRICT. The insurance coverage shall also respond to cleanup cost. This coverage may be written in combination with the commercial general liability insurance or professional liability insurance.

DEVELOPER or its construction contractor(s) shall maintain Pollution Legal Liability and/or Asbestos Legal Liability and/or Errors and Omissions with

limits no less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence or claim, and \$2,000,000 policy aggregate. The policy shall be endorsed to state that the general aggregate limit of liability shall apply separately to this contract. Any self-insured retention/deductible amount shall be submitted to the DISTRICT for review and approval. If DEVELOPER or its construction contractor(s) maintains broader coverage and/or higher limits than the minimums shown above, the DISTRICT requires and shall be entitled to the broader coverage and/or higher limits maintained by DEVELOPER or its construction contractor(s). Any available insurance proceeds in excess of the specified minimum limits of insurance and coverage shall be available to the DISTRICT.

In the event, DEVELOPER or its construction contractor(s) encounters materials on the site that is believed to be asbestos or polychlorinated biphenyl (PCB) which has not been rendered harmless, DEVELOPER or its construction contractor(s) shall immediately stop work in the area affected and report the condition to the DISTRICT in writing. The work in the affected area shall not thereafter be resumed except by written agreement of the DISTRICT and DEVELOPER, if in fact the material is asbestos or polychlorinated biphenyl (PCB) and has not been rendered harmless. The work in the affected area shall be resumed in the absence of asbestos or polychlorinated biphenyl (PCB), or when it has been rendered harmless, by written agreement of the DISTRICT and DEVELOPER.

DEVELOPER or its construction contractor(s) shall not be required to perform without consent any work relating to asbestos or polychlorinated biphenyl (PCB).

F. General Insurance Provisions – All Lines:

- a. Any insurance carrier providing insurance coverage hereunder shall be admitted to the State of California and have an A.M. BEST rating of not less than an A: VIII (A: 8) unless such requirements are waived, in writing, by the DISTRICT Risk Manager. If the DISTRICT's Risk Manager waives a requirement for a particular insurer such waiver is only valid for that specific insurer and only for one policy term.
- b. The DEVELOPER must declare its insurance self-insured retention for each coverage required herein. If any such self-insured retention exceeds \$500,000 per occurrence each such retention shall have the prior written consent of the DISTRICT Risk Manager before the commencement of operations under this Agreement. Upon notification of self-insured retention deemed unacceptable to the DISTRICT, and at the election of the DISTRICT's Risk Manager, DEVELOPER's carriers shall either: 1) reduce or eliminate such self-insured retention with respect to this Agreement with DISTRICT, or 2) procure a bond which guarantees payment of losses and related investigations, claims administration, and defense costs and expenses.
- c. DEVELOPER shall cause their insurance carrier(s) or its contractor's insurance carrier(s), to furnish DISTRICT with 1) a properly executed

original certificate(s) of insurance and certified original copies of endorsements effecting coverage as required herein; and 2) if requested to do so orally or in writing by the DISTRICT Risk Manager, provide original certified copies of policies including all endorsements and all attachments thereto, showing such insurance is in full force and effect. Further, said certificate(s) and policies of insurance shall contain the covenant of the insurance carrier(s) that a minimum of thirty (30) days written notice shall be given to the DISTRICT prior to any material modification, cancellation, expiration or reduction in coverage of such insurance. If DEVELOPER insurance carrier(s) policies does not meet the minimum notice requirement found herein, DEVELOPER shall cause DEVELOPER's insurance carrier(s) to furnish a 30 day Notice of Cancellation Endorsement.

- d. In the event of a material modification, cancellation, expiration or reduction in coverage, this Agreement shall terminate forthwith, unless DISTRICT receives, prior to such effective date, another properly executed original certificate of insurance and original copies of endorsements or certified original policies, including all endorsements and attachments thereto, evidencing coverages set forth herein and the insurance required herein is in full force and effect. An individual authorized by the insurance carrier to do so on its behalf shall sign the original endorsements for each policy and the certificate of insurance.

- e. It is understood and agreed by the parties hereto that DEVELOPER's insurance shall be construed as primary insurance, and DISTRICT's insurance and/or deductibles and/or self-insured retentions or self-insured programs shall not be construed as contributory.
- f. If, during the term of this Agreement or any extension thereof, there is a material change in the scope of services or there is a material change in the equipment to be used in the performance of the scope of work which will add additional exposures (such as the use of aircraft, watercraft, cranes, etc.); or the term of this Agreement, including any extensions thereof, exceeds five (5) years, DISTRICT reserves the right to adjust the types of insurance required under this Agreement and the monetary limits of liability for the insurance coverages currently required herein, if, in the DISTRICT Risk Manager's reasonable judgment, the amount or type of insurance carried by DEVELOPER has become inadequate.
- g. DEVELOPER shall pass down the insurance obligations contained herein to all tiers of subcontractors working under this Agreement.
- h. The insurance requirements contained in this Agreement may be met with a program(s) of self-insurance acceptable to DISTRICT.
- i. DEVELOPER agrees to notify DISTRICT of any claim by a third party or any incident or event that may give rise to a claim arising from the performance of this Agreement.
