LaRieta Mae O'Mealey Hayes was born on December 31, 1929 at home, in the Continental Camp known as Thomas Field, southwest of Tonkawa, Oklahoma. She was the daughter of Elmer Wallace O'Mealey and La Freda Dove (Jones) O'Mealey. In 1936 the family moved to Lyons, Kansas, where her father was working for Conoco Oil Company. In 1942 the family returned to Tonkawa, living on a small farm southwest of Tonkawa.

Mrs. Hayes attended high school in Tonkawa for two years and graduated from Lamont, Oklahoma High School in 1947. On August 10, 1947 she was united in marriage to William "Bill" Eldon Hayes. The couple lived in the Tonkawa and Blackwell, Oklahoma areas before moving to Riverside, California in July 1957.

Mrs. Hayes was a member of the Magnolia Avenue Baptist Church in Riverside.
