

**SUBMITTAL TO THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE,
STATE OF CALIFORNIA**

BACKGROUND:

The Advisory Committee for County Service Area 38 Pine Cove was established on February 3, 1976, by Resolution 76-19, for the purpose of advising the Board of Supervisors on County Service Area 38 Pine Cove budgetary matters as well as service levels related to structural fire protection, the Pine Cove Volunteer Fire Department, and enhanced ambulance services as authorized under Government Code Section 25212.4.

Board of Supervisors Policy No. A-21 provides that the Board of Supervisors may, in its sole discretion, dissolve an advisory committee if the Board determines that the advisory committee is no longer functioning consistent with Government Code section 25212.4 and Board of Supervisors Policy Nos. A-21 and A-48

Since the Pine Cove Advisory Committee was established in 1976, there have been significant changes in the services provided within County Service Area No. 38, most notably the elimination of the Volunteer Fire Company program and the adoption of a County-wide ambulance service contract. It is now desired by the Third Supervisorial District to dissolve the Advisory Committee for County Service Area 38 Pine Cove.

7 DISSOLVING THE ADVISORY COMMITTEE COUNTY SERVICE AREA NO. 38 (PINE COVE)

8 WHEREAS, the Advisory Committee for County Service Area No. 38 (hereinafter referred to as “Pine Cove
9 Advisory Committee”) was established on February 3, 1976, by Resolution No. 76-19, for the purpose of
10 advising the Board of Supervisors on County Service Area 38 budgetary matters as well as service levels
11 related to structural fire protection, the Pine Cove Volunteer Fire Department, and enhanced ambulance
12 service; and

13 WHEREAS, the formation of an advisory committee to give the Board of Supervisors advice
14 regarding a County Service Area’s services and facilities is discretionary under Government Code section
15 25212.4; and

16 WHEREAS, while the County currently has 59 County Service Areas, only 8 have advisory
17 committees; and

18 WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors has previously changed the structure of the Pine Cove
19 Advisory Committee under Resolution Nos. 91-195, and 97-068 in an effort to better suit the needs of the
20 County Service Area No. 38; and

21 WHEREAS, Board of Supervisors Policy No. A-21 provides that the Board of Supervisors may, in
22 its sole discretion, dissolve an advisory committee if the Board determines that the advisory committee is no
23 longer functioning consistent with Government Code section 25212.4 and Board of Supervisors Policy Nos.
24 A-21 and A-48; and

25 WHEREAS, since the Pine Cove Advisory Committee was established in 1976, there have been
26 significant changes in the services provided within County Service Area No. 38, most notable change being
27 that the fire protection services in the area are no longer provided by a volunteer fire department; and

28 WHEREAS, the needs that existed when the Pine Cove Advisory Committee was established have
since diminished considerably, thereby diminishing the need for the Pine Cove Advisory Committee; and
