I am but one member of one family in Riverside County and I ask you all to please lift the overreaching restrictions on the citizens of Riverside County. People need to work. We need to be able to pay bills, mortgages, buy food, make repairs, and yes, even pay taxes. The ongoing lockdown, while probably well-intended at first, is now destroying the very lives it was meant to protect. People are losing everything. Mostly we are losing HOPE. We can only take so many walks, and do just so much yard work before it becomes clear that this is more like internment, rather than "for the public good" "Alone, Together" simply doesn't ring true, and it should just say "Alone and Miserable"

People are suffering, not because of the virus, but because of the continued loss of wages, businesses, and any resemblance of a normal life. For example, my Son, a fine 18 y/o young man, that along with his classmates had looked forward to walking to get his HS Diploma. They looked forward to seeing each other one last time, to Grad Nite. He worked (past tense b/c of the lock down) after school and on weekends, to buy his car, register it to the tune of nearly 500.00, and pays the 100.00/month insurance. Now that car sits in the driveway. You know why? Because the week before he was due to take his Driver's Test, all of the DMVs were shut down. Now here sits this great kid, stuck at home with his parents, and nothing to look forward to. Summer recreation obliterated, trip to Big Bear is gone, beaches closed, park courts closed, theaters closed, car sits empty, and all of his hopes for his Senior Summer like so many...destroyed.

Full disclosure he is "at risk" because of asthma. I am also at "HIGH risk" because of a weakened immune system and lung disease.

However, we would never want our medical concerns or worries to stop others from making a living, having a business, or enjoying summer plans. We have a choice, my Son and I, to take precautions or to stay home. We do not choose that for others, because it is not our right to ask that of those that are healthy. Or anyone for that matter.

The mortality rate in California is LESS THAN 1%. That doesn't diminish the pain of those affected by the loss. I feel terrible for their families. But it does not make sense to shut down an entire economy and to DESTROY LIVES over that statistic.

People need to feel good about themselves, to feel useful. People need to be able to

provide for themselves and their families. Right now, the continued shut down in Riverside County is costing people financially, mentally, emotionally and physically. Let's put Riverside back to work. Let's be smart, of course, but let's get it done. Masks if need be (if one's health allows it , very hard for people with breathing issues) limit capacity in stores, restaurants, salons, barbers etc. Reopen much needed recreational areas like skate parks , courts, picnic areas for which the taxpayers pay. Not everyone can earn a living with their laptop. Not everyone wants to. Even those that do, are tired of the continued internment, and isolation. I ask you most respectfully and with all my heart, Please, lets get Riverside County back to working, playing and living. For everyone's sakes.

**Comments:** Despite the false sense of security, or perhaps especially because of it, given the relatively low increase in cases the past few days, it is important to remain vigilant against the epidemic. A significant portion of the American population lives pay check to paycheck, which makes the lockdown financially painful. However, the potential consequences "opening the economy," can have much more dire consequences on the physical and financial health of the population. Opening up the county could lead us to enter a pattern of open-close-open-close-open-close, thereby potentially elongating what would've been a few more weeks of disruption to a months long spiral.

Covid19, the disease caused by coronavirus SARS-CoV-2, has the potential to wipe out entire households, including the young and healthy. Given the incremental nature of science, there is still a lot we don't know about the virus.

Its understood that most of the carriers are asymptomatic and respiratory symptoms usually take 2-14 days to manifest. This implies that despite the relatively high (leading the state) number of tests conducted in Riverside county, testing 1.9 percent of the population is still not enough as there are likely to be many asymptomatic carriers who have not been tested and may not think about getting tested.

Those who are symptomatic but survive, face potentially permanent damage to their lungs and reduced breathing capacity. That is not counting the reports of potential reproductive system damage, heart damage, strokes, frost bites, lost sense of taste and smell, etc. To use a hyperbolic but not impossible example an unfortunate multi-generational household of say 8 people, this can mean the loss of grandma, grandpa, damaged health for the near retirement father and a young aunt and no symptoms for the rest. This would mean increased healthcare costs and reduced earning potential for the father and aunt and a new comorbidity when the next epidemic or pandemic after covid19 strikes (that is, if being infected during the first wave precludes infection during the second wave). The cost of losing a family member and potentially reduced earning potential far outweighs a few more weeks of reduced earnings. A quick google search will show news articles on many families who have lost 2-3 members with



others struggling with the virus. The worst part of the virus is that people suffer and some pass away without their loved ones by their side. I doubt the people protesting would be willing to pay for the funerals, the future healthcare costs, living expenses of those who have lost their breadwinners or even visit the patients to comfort them in this time of need.

Members of the working class, who do not have the luxury of working from home are more likely to interact with others and in turn get infected. For a population, of which a large part already lives paycheck to paycheck, the costs are even higher.

As the virus ravages the country, minorities, due to myriad reasons, especially black and latino populations, are becoming infected and dying at a much higher rate. Latinos are the county's highest ethnic group at over 45% of the population.

It is challenging to restrict movement between counties and I don't think there are currently any plans to do so. Seeing how many of the visitors to Newport beach were not from Orange County, members of neighboring counties may want to visit the county due to lower restrictions. The second Spring wave of the virus in China occurred near the northeastern border with Russia despite limited international entry. Based on <https://coronavirus.jhu.edu/us-map>, the nearby Los Angeles county has half of the state's cases, the eighth highest number of cases nationwide and the tenth highest number of deaths in the nation (county level).

During World War II, Americans had to deal with the draft (fight or go to jail), food restrictions, curfews, and they did it for the good of the nation. We need to do that now. Regarding agenda item 3.40, in which several of the Riverside County Public Health Official's orders to reduce the spread of COVID-19 may be rescinded, I have two points to make:

Just wait. I recently advised my city council to wait for two weeks to reopen businesses and public spaces while we judge the effect of Orange County's decision to flout the state of California and reopen public spaces in their county. We do not have to reinvent the wheel on governance; we can watch Orange County and how the virus interacts with residents in order to customize our approach to reopening in a data-driven and informed way. Failing to utilize this golden opportunity to "work smarter, not harder" will only display how little the Board of Supervisors cares about making informed decisions. It will show that the Board is willing to act without the full picture of possible consequences for their decisions. Let's be smart about this and bide our time while learning from Orange County's mistakes and adopting their successes. We can afford two more weeks.

There were no replacement safety measures outlined in item 3.40. It makes no sense to rescind the order about mask-wearing and social distancing because those measures cost us nothing. Capriciously threatening to rescind health orders without replacing them with appropriate precautions will endanger lives. If you "pull the rug out" from under Dr. Kaiser, essential workers will be forced to have direct contact with residents who are not wearing masks, which increases risk of infection for both parties. The elderly will be forced to have increased contact with individuals who may be asymptomatic carriers in public spaces and grocery stores, without PPE. Parents will be forced to choose between exposing their children to the virus or further retarding their education. There will also be an untold number of other

issues and complications that may arise because of this hasty and poorly thought-out action on your part. Are you willing to be responsible for a spike of COVID-19- related deaths because of this?

Additionally, do not get the County of Riverside entangled in a protracted legal dispute with Attorney General Javier Beccerra. It is VERY possible that giving directions to our county which may be construed as a defiance of state orders will be met with a lawsuit. You are currently exploring the possibility of opening several types of business because they need the revenue, no doubt because their owners have approached you with hat in hand; it would be counterproductive to then spend that revenue on legal fees. The Board of Supervisors claims, yearly, that we are barely keeping our heads above water when it comes to funding. We have already experienced a funding deficit this year because of the shut down. Do not exacerbate the problem by disregarding state health orders and creating the possibility for a lawsuit.

In conclusion, this is not the leadership we need in Riverside County. We can reopen business and public spaces after we have the data and the case studies to guide our actions and decisions, which is coming sooner rather than later. I advise the Board to be patient and create something that resembles an actual plan to achieve reopening.

Good afternoon Cameron, Kim and Jennifer: In watching Governor Newsom's press conference at noon today, as well as the City of Riverside's press conference this morning, and knowing that the Board of Supervisors' are meeting tomorrow, I wanted to again provide you with RCMA's position on re-opening Riverside County. Please see attached.

As you are aware Riverside County Medical Association (RCMA) represents over 1,800 practicing physicians, medical residents and medical students in Riverside County. RCMA's position aligns well with the State of CA and we have been very supportive of Riverside County's guidelines. However, at this point one of the biggest concerns continues to be the lack of PPEs for our medical practices. RCMA has been turning over every rock to find PPEs for physicians and we have been able to distribute small supplies as we are able to obtain them, but nowhere near what is needed currently, especially as we consider moving to the next phase.

We recognize that the priority of the EOC has been to source PPEs for hospitals, first responders, prisons and nursing homes. Physician offices have not been included in this priority supply chain. However, before Riverside County moves to phase 2 of the Governor's plan we must insure physician offices have adequate PPEs to protect their patients, their staff and themselves.

Supervisor Spiegel stated on the City of Riverside's press conference this morning that there are adequate PPEs in Riverside County. We do not believe this is the case for all healthcare providers and the medical office PPE shortages must be addressed before requesting that Riverside County moves to phase 2.

Thank you again for all your hard work in protecting our communities during this crisis. The RCMA stands ready to assist in any way possible.

## Riverside County Medical Association's Position Regarding Re-Opening Riverside County During COVID-19

As the COVID-19 pandemic spread throughout the world, Riverside County, the State of California and the United States took steps to limit the transmission and impact of the virus by implementing the Stay-at-Home orders currently in place which have supported the flattening of the curve in California.

Even though current evidence shows progress in suppressing the virus, there is much to consider for the future of Riverside County to protect against a surge once Stay-at-Home orders are modified. As of Sunday, May 3<sup>rd</sup>, Riverside County had 4,180 confirmed cases of COVID-19 and 161 deaths. Our numbers are not yet decreasing but Riverside County is already preparing for Phase 2 of Governor Newsom's re-opening plan.

That said, RCMA believes corona virus protocols should be guided by science and public health, and should include the:

- Ability to have widespread expansion of coronavirus testing
- Ability to expand testing to identify and isolate patients
- Ability to manage surges at hospitals
- Ability to enable development of infrastructure and distribution of personal protective equipment (PPE) – which continues to be a major shortage issue.
- Ability to maintain vigilance to protect seniors and high-risk people
- Ability to meet future surges in hospitals with a myriad of protective gear
- Ability to continue to collaborate with academia on therapies and treatments
- Ability to redraw regulations to ensure continued physical distancing at private businesses and schools
- Ability to develop new enforcement mechanisms to allow the state and county to pull back and reinstate stay-at-home orders.

RCMA believes Governor Newsom's phased re-opening plan should be the roadmap for Riverside County. Rushing to re-open without the above mentioned protocols in place could reverse the heroic efforts by our citizens, our health care community and our businesses to flatten the curve and not be like New York and other parts of the Country who are experiencing what we have fortunately avoided by taking the precautions we have all endured.

I am writing you today as entrepreneur, small business owner, restaurateur, and residents of Riverside County to express my grave concern for the County's economic predicament as a result of the 'shelter in' and 'non essential' business shutdown orders from the State and County.

*Hoag Hospital in Orange County was the first hospital to treat a COVID-19 patient. During an April 15 video update, Dr. Brant-Zawadzki, Senior Physician Executive at Hoag Hospital, explained, "the numbers are now stabilizing and going down [in fact] it's not that the curve has flattened- we're on the other side of the curve and heading down." Dr. Martin Fee, Chief Clinical Officer and Head of Infection Control at Hoag Hospital, also added, "definitely in Orange County it has [flattened]." Orange County's daily COVID-19 infections peaked on April 1 at 104 and has averaged 55 per day since April 22. This successful slowing of the spread of COVID-19 can be largely attributed to the actions of the State and Orange County Board of Supervisors. We thank the OC Board of Supervisors for its hard work and leadership to protect our community during this crisis.*

In Riverside County, the largest case increase was back on the 13<sup>th</sup> of April with a 195 rise in cases in a single day. Since then, it has remained lower with the last ten day average being just 84 cases, over a 50% decrease. Likewise, deaths in Riverside County with the largest daily rise on the 13<sup>th</sup> of April of 7 new COVID-19 deaths to now seeing a ten day average of just 3.8. The successful slowing can be partially attributed to actions by both the State and County Board of Supervisors along with the responsibility of local citizens and residents. We thank the Supervisors for their actions to keep as many safe as possible along with residents for helping the process of not overloading our hospitals.

But it has become clear that the status quo is not economically or socially sustainable, even in the short term. The stress of economic devastation and curtailed civil liberties could one day soon become untenable. State unemployment claims exceed 2.7 million while Riverside County claims are in the tens of thousands. As long as we remain in lockdown, these numbers are projected to climb to catastrophic levels.

It is time for the Riverside County Supervisors to help lead the County and State in economic recovery.

I understand that the Board of Supervisors formed a task force to formulate a safe and responsible plan for reopening the Orange County economy and urge the Board to move with the greatest urgency and develop this plan in no more than 10 days. I expect the Board will work with the State where possible, but where necessary I urge you to move faster and more broadly as our County statistics dictate. I understand these decisions are not without health and political risks, but believe the business community and the citizens of the County will offer broad and sustained support.

I believe it is possible to protect the health and safety of our communities without bankrupting them as well. *Hoag Hospital in Orange County was the first hospital to treat a COVID-19 patient. During an April 15 video update, Dr. Brant-Zawadzki, Senior Physician Executive at Hoag Hospital, explained, "the numbers are now stabilizing and going down [in fact.] it's not that the curve has flattened- we're on the other side of the curve and heading down." Dr. Martin Fee, Chief Clinical Officer and Head of Infection Control at Hoag Hospital, also added, "definitely in Orange County it has [flattened]." Orange County's daily COVID-19 infections peaked on April 1 at 104 and has averaged 55 per day since April 22. This successful slowing of the spread of COVID-19 can be largely attributed to the actions of the State and Orange County Board of Supervisors. We thank the OC Board of Supervisors for its hard work and leadership to protect our community during this crisis.*

In Riverside County, the largest case increase was back on the 13<sup>th</sup> of April with a 195 rise in cases in a single day. Since then, it has remained lower with the last ten day average being just 84 cases, over a 50% decrease. Likewise, deaths in Riverside County with the largest daily rise on the 13<sup>th</sup> of April of 7 new COVID-19 deaths to now seeing a ten day average of just 3.8. The successful slowing can be partially attributed to actions by both the State and County Board of Supervisors along with the responsibility of local citizens and residents. We thank the Supervisors for their actions to keep as many safe as possible along with residents for helping the process of not overloading our hospitals.

But it has become clear that the status quo is not economically or socially sustainable, even in the short term. The stress of economic devastation and curtailed civil liberties could one day soon become untenable. State unemployment claims exceed 2.7 million while Riverside County claims are in the tens of thousands. As long as we remain in lockdown, these numbers are projected to climb to catastrophic levels.

It is time for the Riverside County Supervisors to help lead the County and State in economic recovery.

I understand that the Board of Supervisors formed a task force to formulate a safe and responsible plan for reopening the Orange County economy and urge the Board to move with the greatest urgency and develop this plan in no more than 10 days. I expect the Board will work with the State where possible, but where necessary I urge you to move faster and more broadly as our County statistics dictate. I understand these decisions are not without health and political risks, but believe the business community and the citizens of the County will offer broad and sustained support.

I believe it is possible to protect the health and safety of our communities without bankrupting them as well. 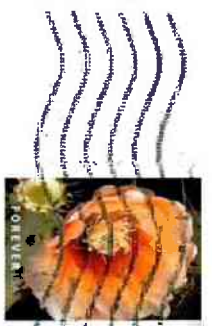

## The Risks - Know Them - Avoid Them

It seems many people are breathing some relief, and I'm not sure why. An epidemic curve has a relatively predictable upslope and once the peak is reached, the back slope can also be predicted. We have robust data from the outbreaks in China and Italy, that shows the backside of the mortality curve declines slowly, with deaths persisting for months. Assuming we have just crested in deaths at 70k, it is possible that we lose another 70,000 people over the next 6 weeks as we come off that peak. That's what's going to happen with a lockdown.

As states reopen, and we give the virus more fuel, all bets are off. I understand the reasons for reopening the economy, but I've said before, if you don't solve the biology, the economy won't recover.

There are very few states that have demonstrated a sustained decline in numbers of new infections. Indeed, as of May 3rd the majority are still increasing and reopening. As a simple example of the USA trend, when you take out the data from New York and just look at the rest of the USA, daily case numbers are increasing. Bottom line: the only reason the total USA new case numbers look flat right now is because the New York City epidemic was so large and now it is being contained.

I am therefore directing the Assistant Attorney General for Civil Rights, Eric Dreiband,... to oversee and coordinate our efforts to monitor state and local policies and, if necessary, take action to correct them. They should work not only with all Department of Justice offices and other federal agencies, but with state and local officials as well... the Constitution is not suspended in times of crisis.

**Comments:** Dear Supervisors,

First of all, I want to acknowledge the difficult choice that you are in. You are under enormous pressure to reopen our economy and reopen businesses that are struggling.

To the small business owners, I sympathize completely with your situation. You must be absolutely terrified. I want you to know that I hear your concerns and your fears about your livelihood and your income. We are all so terrified by this virus, and how it impacts our lives, and our families. I know that we will fight to keep our families safe, and do all that it takes to protect our way of life, because we are Americans: that's what we do.

I am also scared. I am terrified, actually. My fiancé is a frontline worker at a state-run childcare facility. Every day he goes to work to care for more than 80 vulnerable foster youth. Children. Their home is at the STRTP (Short Term Residential Treatment Program). They can't shelter in place in the homes of their families; the STRTP -is- their home.

This population is vulnerable. There are more than 280 staff, therapists, and administrators who come and go from this facility every day. So far, the distancing guidelines have been effective at communicating to staff, therapists, and administrators that it is imperative that they keep their exposure risk low, so that they don't transmit it to the kids.

But if distancing guidelines are relaxed, then what is to stop these 280+ workers who leave the campus each day from circulating in the community, and coming into contact with the virus? If they become infected, they bring the virus to the campus of 80+ children.

If the virus were to reach the campus, it would spread like wildfire. The STRTP has managed to secure limited PPE in case a kid gets sick - but they don't have the facilities to care for

dozens of sick children, and they don't have the resources to call in back-up staff if their staff gets sick.

My heart goes out to those members of the community who are terrified right now, and whose incomes and livelihoods are threatened. I hear your concerns and I cannot imagine what you are facing right now. I hope that you are finding the help that you need to file for financial assistance and support.

However I am also terrified that a reopening would cause a spike in cases, and community spread could reach beyond our abilities to contain it - and we need to remember that our county serves incredibly vulnerable populations. Those populations who cannot go home and who depend on us for support must remain foremost in our minds in any decisions that we make.

I also want to calm fears. Let's look to China - they are a month ahead of us, and they are already beginning to reopen. I feel like there is pressure to reopen now precisely because social distancing has worked. I feel like if we just hold out a little longer, we will be in a far better position to know what to do - and we would have a much broader consensus, and the support of health officials, on our side.

I am terrified that my partner will be exposed through his essential work, and he is my whole heart - he is my family, and I don't know what I would do if he got sick, or if something worse happened. He is asthmatic; we are both hundreds of miles from our own families in northern California. I can't convince him to stay home, or press for teletherapy; I can't get him better PPE or better masks. I am powerless to keep him from being exposed, and that feeling deeply scares me. I know that this is how we are likely all feeling right now.

That feeling should unite us, and help us through - because we really are in this together. Now is not the time for division - it is the time for working together, and hearing one another. I am listening to the concerns of my fellow community members, and in adding my voice to this chorus I can see the ways in which we are very similar in the challenges we face, and the emotions we're working through.

My position is that we exercise caution for the good of public health. This is not to say that we ignore the voices of business owners or those who feel that their freedoms are being taken away. To those individuals, I hear you, and I sympathize with you.

However I implore you: if we can hold out a little longer - if we can just try to wait a little bit, I know that our distancing will pay off. There has already been an enormous amount of effort made to enact distancing guidelines, and it's working! We just need to hold out a little longer, until the health officials are with us. We can do it - I know in my heart of hearts that we can, because we are American - and we are fighters.

The Southern California Coalition for Safety & Health (SoCalCOSH) are writing to you concerning your motion to remove the Riverside County Public Health Orders during this time of uncertainty. As a health & safety organization, representing over 50 unions and worker centers across Southern California, we never operate in fear, but we do operate in the best interest of health & safety on behalf of all low-wage workers in the region.

Your latest action is a clear example of putting profits before people and a clear disrespect to our community and frontline workers like First Responders, Healthcare Workers, Grocery Workers, Homecare Providers, Construction Workers and your Employees that work for the County. It is appalling that you have buckled to pressure by the Chamber of Commerce and are willing to ignore the health experts, thereby, making this a political issue instead of a humanity issue.

In terms of total COVID-19 infections, Riverside County ranks 2<sup>nd</sup> in California. Hello,

Since there's no flexibility or philosophical diversity on our Board, recall that you're supposed to protect health and safety before seeing to the economy. Otherwise, *every time* there's an economic downturn, the Board is setting a *precedent* to DO SOMETHING to help business owners? For example, could the board be opening itself up to an expectation of frequent, costly sustainability programs based on the very wording of this resolution? Doesn't this expand the role of government?

Most on this Board believe government isn't responsible for the health, existence beyond subsistence and equal access to opportunity of individuals. Why should the very same government be responsible for disproportionately helping businesses at the individual's expense? We shouldn't need a score-card to follow the vision and 'mission' of this Board. It should be consistent, based on best practice, as well as a sense of faith and commitment. Nowhere in the sacred writings does it say prioritize the shop-keeper over the individual. Talk about an Activist Board.

The main reason for my writing again is that I believe, if the resolution is approved, there are firm grounds for to request an immediate injunction.

1. The County Board is being **arbitrary**. There's been little to no change in conditions since the order was issued (LAST WEEK?) If anything, conditions have worsened, based on illness incidence and severity. There have been indications of decreased incubation periods (from 14 days to less than 7) in places like Orange County. This strongly suggests a more severe strain of the virus. Additionally, their similar legislative efforts have led to unnecessary illness or increased risk, as well as the potential for a further strain on public resources. That is the opposite of the Oath they took and the trust placed in them by the populace.

A major, national hospital chain has limited the use of N95 masks to nurses and doctors, including *only when they are doing high risk procedures* like intubation. This hospital chain owns a hospital in Riverside. Hence, this may be information the Board would be expected to consider. Whether or not we have sufficient beds, we **don't have** sufficient supplies to keep OT, PT, SLP, social workers and other allied healthcare workers safe, much less doctors and nurses. This is not the time to put the hammock out and fly the 'Mission Accomplished' banner. We all know how accurate that was and that Administration heard about it for a decade. (Don't we still have combat troops there? I guess its wrong to incorrectly assess a situation and immediately act on that assessment. Some of us can learn from the past and the actions of other Counties, not making our residents guinea pigs. You have a mandate to learn from the past and implement best practice. To not stand in the way of progress.)

In *Lewis v Chicago*, the U.S. Supreme Court decisively ruled that government criteria can't be *arbitrary, random* or fail to serve a *rational purpose* in favor of the people. <https://www.supremecourt.gov/opinions/09pdf/08-974.pdf> I do remind the Board that although it is a governmental entity, it does *still* fall under the jurisdiction of the State and federal government, including, though not limited to, the US Supreme Court.

Prioritizing vague economic principles doesn't serve the public interest and this isn't well enough defined to meet this standard. I haven't seen verbiage in the resolution reflecting, "Now that 20% fewer people are testing positive," "hospital stays are 10% shorter," or even, "That we have more supplies." There are no tangible criteria. Just something akin to a wish list; possibly a party platform?\*

I haven't seen verbiage reflecting that since 95% of the population are adhering to the mandates, the Board estimates that switching to encouragement would only decrease participation by 10-15%. Conversely, encouragement would lead to a drastic decrease in participation and County wellness such that it exceeds County resources.

2. The Board is over-stepping. IF you don't like what Dr. Kaiser did - contrary to your statements, you can ask for his resignation. I'm not a County law expert, though I would presume there are ordinances, a charter or similar that grants Dr. Kaiser certain authority, without question or interference. Therefore, the Board's actions make the Office of Chief Public Health Officer moot. You can't say you're completely satisfied with Dr. Kaiser while usurping authority and standing in opposition to what he RECENTLY required.

Some of you don't know me well. However, I don't make idle threats. I'm former public official and agree with Lincoln that you can't please all the people all the time. However, in times of crisis, true leaders know that its not a popularity contest. Its about making crucial decisions based on data, informatics. Not based on who has the biggest mouth, largest voice, or who you seem to personally agree with. You are representing the citizenry in what can be described as a fiduciary capacity. Fiduciaries aren't just representatives. They are held to a higher standard. Do you want to invest the County's money with a registered representative or a fiduciary, all things being equal?

As I've stated, those voting in Wisconsin (in a group activity for less than an hour) GOT SICK. Those going to the beach in Newport Beach, despite COUNTY ENCOURAGEMENT not to do so or to socially distance themselves got sick due to close 'quarters.' Thus, the Board demonstrates a wanton disregard for public health, County sustainability, and best practice. They make the County look like the proverbial Keystone Kops where one supposedly expert and prudent Department contradicts the other.

It is a sad state of affairs in that, as aforementioned, there is no philosophical diversity on this Board and that the Board fails to recognize the following:

1. We were headed for an economic downturn this year, before the pandemic.
2. One County cannot make the difference for the State and Nation, especially in the face of failed national public policy and failed similar County efforts near and far.
3. As i said before, what publication by the health department would carry any weight or validity going forward? We may as well disband any and all County primary care, public health, or environmental health functions. The Board is **obviously** superior to anyone in said departments, having the requisite experience to make all necessary inspections. It goes without saying that once this occurs, the Board will fail to cite or fine any restaurant or chemical processing plant, because, "That gets in the way of the economy."
4. As mentioned above, if the Board was interested in the economy, it wouldn't have approved a jail without in-person visiting facilities or would have striven harder to prove that a jail was necessary. If the Board was concerned about the economy, it may not have continued a contract with a private library operations firm. (The newly remodeled woodcrest library is 5-10 minutes from Riverside's Orange Terrace Library.) If the Board was concerned about the economy, it would demonstrate better priorities like a greater investment in public safety measures. Just why isn't the Board considering limitations on guns and related supplies to take a strain off RCSO and RCFD? Wouldn't that have more of a social and economic impact on our residents? As crime increases, people will look to San Diego and Eastern LA County. So much for your economic concerns.

Additionally, when referencing the Governor's executive orders, one of you fine Board Member's staff people referred to them in writing as having **nuisances**

This is in clear violation of the state or local equivalent of the Hatch Act. Government employees, using government resources, serving in an official capacity, cannot take a position or stance on a candidate, initiative or law/legislation. This is per the California State Department of Human Resources.

## Riverside County Medical Association's Position Regarding Re-Opening Riverside County During COVID-19

As the COVID-19 pandemic spread throughout the world, Riverside County, the State of California and the United States took steps to limit the transmission and impact of the virus by implementing the Stay-at-Home orders currently in place which have supported the flattening of the curve in California.

Even though current evidence shows progress in suppressing the virus, there is much to consider for the future of Riverside County to protect against a surge once Stay-at-Home orders are modified. As of Sunday, May 3<sup>rd</sup>, Riverside County had 4,180 confirmed cases of COVID-19 and 161 deaths. Our numbers are not yet decreasing but Riverside County is already preparing for Phase 2 of Governor Newsom's re-opening plan.

That said, RCMA believes corona virus protocols should be guided by science and public health, and should include the:

- Ability to have widespread expansion of coronavirus testing
- Ability to expand testing to identify and isolate patients
- Ability to manage surges at hospitals
- Ability to enable development of infrastructure and distribution of personal protective equipment (PPE) – which continues to be a major shortage issue.
- Ability to maintain vigilance to protect seniors and high-risk people
- Ability to meet future surges in hospitals with a myriad of protective gear
- Ability to continue to collaborate with academia on therapies and treatments
- Ability to redraw regulations to ensure continued physical distancing at private businesses and schools
- Ability to develop new enforcement mechanisms to allow the state and county to pull back and reinstate stay-at-home orders.

RCMA believes Governor Newsom's phased re-opening plan should be the roadmap for Riverside County. Rushing to re-open without the above mentioned protocols in place could reverse the heroic efforts by our citizens, our health care community and our businesses to flatten the curve and not be like New York and other parts of the Country who are experiencing what we have fortunately avoided by taking the precautions we have all endured.

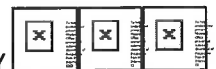

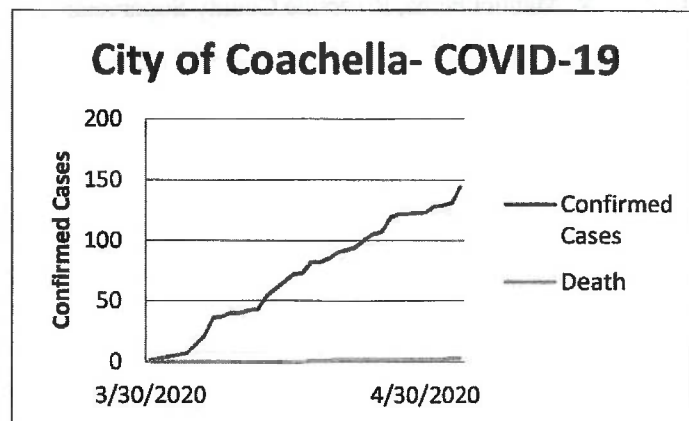
On behalf of the City of Coachella, I want to respectfully express that I am not in support of the following recommended orders:

- a) April 1, 2020, Amended Order of the Health Officer Closing All Schools, Community Colleges, Colleges, and Universities from March 16, 2020 through June 19, 2020; and,
- b) April 2, 2020, Amended Order of the Health Officer Related to Short Term Lodging Facilities through June 19, 2020; and,
- c) April 29, 2020, Amended Order of the Health Officer for the County of Riverside and the Director of Emergency Services Placing Restrictions on Golf Course Use; and,
- d) April 29, 2020, Amended Order of the Health Officer for the County of Riverside and the Director of Emergency Services requiring the use of face coverings and practice of social distancing.

As of today, the City of Coachella leads the Coachella Valley in confirmed cases with 144 in total; and rank 6<sup>th</sup> in deaths with a total of 3. Our neighbor, the City of Indio, ranks 2<sup>nd</sup> in confirmed cases with 138, and 4<sup>th</sup> in deaths with 5. Flattening the curve may be occurring in parts of Riverside County, but here in the Eastern Coachella Valley we are seeing things much differently.

Once we include Eastern Coachella Valley (ECV) unincorporated Riverside County communities of Mecca, North Shore, Oasis and Thermal, with a combined population total of 21,809, it adds 70 additional confirmed cases and 1 death to this area.

The ECV area may have been last to contract confirmed COVID-19 cases in the Coachella Valley but we are now disproportionately contracting cases on a daily basis. With the lack of retail, grocery stores, and gas stations, the City of Coachella is the



unincorporated communities' retail hub. We, as a City, must consider these numbers because these residents interact and are part of our community.

Our residents in the Eastern Coachella Valley are the heart of the 'Essential Workforce'. We are the nurses, fire fighters, police officers, teachers, agricultural farm workers, chefs, food deliverers, food preparers, grocery store clerks, bank tellers, construction workers, landscapers, gig job workers, housekeepers, custodians, and childcare providers. If we contract COVID-19 the Coachella Valley will continue to contract it as well.

We may not have the densities of those in the Inland Empire, but some of our residents find themselves with three generations of their family within a home; where a grandmother or grandfather may receive care from family members. The 9 deaths within our communities have been very unfortunate, but given the health related issues our residents have whether it is diabetes, obesity, high blood pressure, asthma or other lung related ailments due to the Salton Sea; we have been very fortunate not to be leading the Coachella Valley in deaths too.

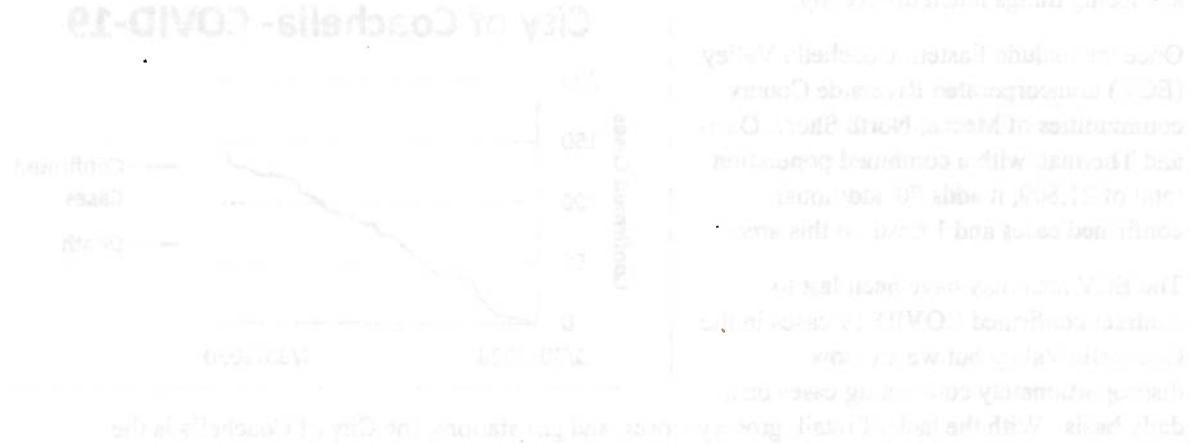
I support the eventual reopening of the county businesses and services, but I do not agree with the County's proposal to decrease safety precautions in order to haste a reopening. As you can see in the chart above, the City is not experiencing the "flattening of the curve", but neither is the Coachella Valley nor Riverside County. The County needs a well thought out plan where schools can be reopened without parents' fear of their children contracting the virus and bringing it home. Per Congressman Raul Ruiz M.D., we do not have safeguards in place to protect against flare-up of COVID-19. These safe-guards include: PPE, contact tracers, don't have individuals to help isolate/quarantine residents who need to stay away from their families, rules or policies in place to protect workers where employers provide PPEs and other precautions.

What we are looking for is a balanced approach where public health is the primary concern, because without it our economy will continue to be hurt by prolonging the pandemic with cycles of infection.

I fear that you are putting sales and profits before public health and welfare. This, to me, is a misguided and potentially dangerous miscalculation.

Riverside County should *not* open for business or make an early attempt to “return to normal” without fully ensuring the safety and health of its both its transit employees and the general public. I believe any other action—like a premature “re-opening”—would be dangerous in both the short and long run. *People’s health must come first, before profits and business interests!*

I propose that representatives from ATU Local 1277 and the Board of Supervisors meet and confer on this literally life-saving matter. I fully support “re-opening” Riverside County, *but only when it is medically safe to do so.*

I urge you, in the strongest way, to put your constituents’ health and safety ahead of any special interest. We are ready to meet with you at any time to discuss this critical situation.

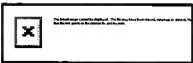

Dear Riverside County Board of Supervisors,

I am writing to you concerning your motion to remove the Riverside County Public Health Orders during this time of uncertainty. As Labor, we never operate in Fear, but we do operate in the best interest of health & safety on behalf of all our Members in the Public, Private, and Building Trades sectors.

It was only two weeks ago that we, as Labor, applauded the efforts by the County to protect the heroes on the front lines and our community with the measures you took as a board. The leadership you showed as a board has now been diminished by your latest action to put us all in harm's way. This move is a clear example of putting profits before people and a clear disrespect to our community and frontline workers like First Responders, Healthcare Workers, Grocery Workers, Homecare Providers, Construction Workers and your Employees that work for the County. It is appalling that you have buckled to pressure by the Chamber of Commerce and are willing to ignore the health experts, thereby, making this a political issue instead of a humanity issue.

In terms of total COVID-19 infections, Riverside County ranks 2<sup>nd</sup> in California. We have experienced a continuous strain in the ability to provide Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) to our Essential Workers and we have not seen 14 consecutive days of declining new infections to justify rescinding the public health orders. In actuality, there are an increasingly large number of workers testing positive for COVID-19 in the retail, meat packing, and logistic industries. Carelessly re-opening businesses and schools so soon puts workers, children, and other vulnerable people in our communities at much higher risk in contracting COVID-19. Under your watch, it is unacceptable to unnecessarily increase the risk of having a surge as a result of ignoring our County's senior public health officer, the lack adequate PPE and the lack of a proper safety plan.

I do not understand how rescinding the four orders issued by our Public Health Officer will restore the economy. None of us wants to endure another Great Recession and none of us wants to lose our life or the lives of our family and friends to the novel coronavirus.

Concerning the economy, you have created an Economic Recovery Task Force and appointed an impressive committee comprised of county business leaders. Besides putting together a tentative recovery plan, there is nothing more you can do for the economy until the governor opens the state.

On the other hand, with COVID-19, there is more that must be done. Our Public Health Director, Public Health Officer and all those associated with the Public Health Department have done remarkable work in flattening the curve, thus assuring sufficient medical facilities and equipment are available. With that goal met, the effort must be continued, not curtailed. Until a vaccine is found, people will continue to be stricken and more will die.

I do not view the county's public health orders as a "campaign of fear," although fearful people are usually careful people. But, rather, the orders are an integral piece of a campaign to save lives – exactly what we expect our public health officials to do.

Your action will send a false message to people that masks and social distancing are no longer required. In fact, as an administrator of an 8,100 social media group, people are touting your vote to rescind the orders as a vote to reopen the county. Celebrations are being planned.

My name is Ignacio Lujan and I'm the owner of Universal Training Center located in the city of Indio. Like many other small businesses, my gym was not considered essential and we have been closed for over 45 days now following the county's stay at home order. Before the order took place we were diligently following guidance and best practices from the CDC and local government's office. We quickly implemented and adapted to new rules; no more than 10 people in the gym rooms, washing hands upon arrival, no contact check-in, increased cleaning routines and cleaning supplies available for our staff and members to wipe down equipment before and after using it.

My gym is very different from commercial gyms, with 10,000sq. ft. divided into two separate areas, and four large warehouse doors, I know we would be able to stay in compliance with the social distancing orders. Both our trainers and members love their gym and we need to provide them with answers. Please take us small gyms into consideration when allowing businesses to re-open their doors. The gym is an essential part of life for our members and helps them stay healthy both physically and mentally during these difficult and stressful times.

## RESCISION OF RIVERSIDE COUNTY HEALTH OFFICER'S COVID-19 MANDATES

I am writing to voice and express my support of rescinding the mandates put in place by Health Officer Cameron Kaiser.

In order to transition to economic and social recovery, we need to relax the strict safety measures that were put in place weeks ago. Original modeling has changed and data does not support the current actions. The collateral damage being suffered by the citizens of Riverside County far outweighs the risk from Covid-19 – unemployment; financial hardship; small business collapse; family turmoil (including domestic violence and child abuse) mental and physical decline; fearful, uneducated children; isolation and depression. Hospitals are sitting empty – the opposite of being overwhelmed. Note: You should have seen the line of cars this morning at the Feed America food pantry.

As the county health officer, his sole focus is minimizing and eradicating Covid-19. Your job, as county supervisors, is to weigh all aspects of this situation, balance risk, harm and benefit. The harm from these endless "safety" measures far outweighs the benefit. I reject the "New Normal."

As such, I fully support the proposal being presented by Riverside County Board Chair V. Manuel Perez and Vice Chair Karen Spiegel.


*b) April 2, 2020, Amended Order of the Health Officer Related to Short Term Lodging Facilities through June 19, 2020; and,*
