#### **BACKGROUND:**

#### Summary

The Public Safety Enterprise Communications System (PSEC) is operated by Riverside County Information Technology (RCIT) and governed by the PSEC Executive Steering Committee composed of the Sheriff, Fire, District Attorney, RCIT, Executive Office and "At-large" member representing local Police departments. It has been the vision of the Board of Supervisors to bring all cities in the county onto the PSEC system to achieve full interoperability between cities' and the county's public safety groups. To date, that goal has been unrealized as many of the agencies cannot afford the Board Approved PSEC rate. Recently, the Board was contacted by several agencies around the county expressing their desire to move to PSEC if a solution was developed. (Menifee, Hemet, Blythe, and the ERICA Agencies-Beaumont, Cathedral City, Indio, Palm Springs and Desert Hot Springs). Included with this item are signed "Letter of Intent" to join PSEC from several of these agencies.

As a result, the PSEC Steering Committee met on March 10, 2020 and voted unanimously to increase interoperability and public safety by proposing an "on-boarding" incentive program with a fixed 5-year timeframe starting in FY 20/21 and concluding in FY 24/25. Another consideration by the committee was increasing the number of users on PSEC has the benefit of reducing costs for existing agencies (including county departments) over time.

The program is for net new customers and will establish a tiered pricing model based on paying a set percent of the Board Approved Rate. Customers will pay the tiered percent/rate indicated in the year they sign and commit to the new Service Agreement. (For example, if they wait until FY 22/23, they start at paying 50% of the Board Approved Rate)

#### **History**

In 2010 the Eastern Riverside Interoperable Communications Authority (ERICA) radio system went live with users in the cities of Beaumont, Cathedral City, Palm Desert, Indio, and Desert Hot Springs. Hemet and Blythe operate and maintain their own systems independent from the PSEC. These multiple disparate systems create significant interoperability challenges between these agencies and PSEC. Potentially compounding the issue are new agencies such as Menifee who are in the process of standing up their own public safety departments and are trying to find the most efficient and effective way to do so. Menifee PD is set to go live with their new police department on July 1, 2020.

#### Impact on Residents and Businesses

PSEC enables a regional radio system offering and significant financial savings by avoiding build-out of separate radio infrastructure by member cities/agencies. The ability for all public safety agencies to be able to interoperate on one robust system, with Countywide coverage will improve public safety communications, resulting in better service to residents and businesses throughout the County of Riverside.

#### **Additional Fiscal Information**

The current Board approved rate for FY 19/20 is \$183.34 per radio per month. The proposed "on-boarding" incentive program, after the 5-year period, will result in a user rate of approximately \$128.87 per user per month for all member agencies. This rate reduction applies to all users including those supported by NCC funds thus saving the County millions of dollars in the long term.
