#### BACKGROUND:

#### Summary

Waste Collection Franchise Agreements covering most unincorporated portions of Riverside County were phased in between 1997 and 1998. Within each of the existing eleven Franchise Agreements is a provision for an annual adjustment of the rates effective each July 1<sup>st</sup>. The franchise areas (Areas) are spread throughout the entire county unincorporated area and are present within each Supervisor's District.

This adjustment allows a pass through for any changes to landfill costs including the Alternative Daily Cover surcharge or transfer station fees, plus an increase based on Consumer Price Index (CPI) for the balance of the rate. Costs are adjusted by the CPI for the Riverside/San Bernardino/Ontario, CA, as published by the United States Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics. The proposed rates were adjusted as delineated in the franchise agreement using a CPI of 3.0% for the twelve (12) month period January 2019 through December 2019.

The detailed rate calculation worksheets factoring in the CPI increase have been reviewed for accuracy and the updated rate sheets are maintained by the Department of Environmental Health.

#### Impact on Residents and Businesses

The current typical residential account pays between \$23.04 to \$25.70 a month. The approval of the proposed 3.0% CPI increase and recycling processing fee would result in an increased rate ranging from \$23.82 to \$26.56 per month. Commercial customers rates vary based on the size of bins and frequency of services provided. Waste service would increase by 3.0% of the base rate.

The approval of this change will result in no cost to the County; implementation expenses are borne by the franchisee.

# A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE ESTABLISHING WASTE HAULER FEES FOR WASTE MANAGEMENT OF INLAND EMPIRE, A DIVISION OF USA WASTE OF CALIFORNIA, INC. WASTE MANAGEMENT COLLECTION AND RECYCLING, INC., IN FRANCHISE AREAS 1, 3 AND 4

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors recognizes the benefits of entering into Waste Hauler Franchise Agreements for the efficiency of solid waste management; and

WHEREAS, the County of Riverside has entered into Waste Hauler Franchise Agreements with Waste Management of Inland Empire, A Division of USA Waste of California, Inc. Waste Management Collections and Recycling, Inc. (WMI) to cover Franchise Areas 1, 3 and 4; and

WHEREAS, the Waste Collection Franchise Agreements covering Franchise Areas 1, 3 and 4, contain a provision for an annual adjustment of the rates customers are charged based on the consumer price index ("CPI");

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors acknowledges the need for the CPI increase of the hauler fees to provide a cost of living increase to address the costs of providing these services; and

BE IT RESOLVED AND ORDERED that the Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside, State of California, in regular session assembled on June 9, 2020 finds that the waste hauler fees in Franchise Areas

- 1 | 1, 3 and 4 shall receive an increase, based on the CPI of 3.0% to the service component of their fees for fiscal
- 2 year 2020-2021.

Dear Mr. Thomas:

I represent David Ryan King ("David" and/or "Mr. King"), the husband of Bonnie Lee Ahlberg, aka Bonnie Lee Ahlberg King, ("Bonnie") in connection with the tax sale of that certain property located at 81641 Avenue 48, #99, Indio, California; APN 616-222-016-2 (the "Property"). The County of Riverside ("County") apparently completed the sale on or about May 1, 2018, which was apparently recorded the on or about June 26, 2018.

This letter is in response to the May 28, 2016 letter sent from Deputy Miriam Marquez for Jon Christensen, Treasurer-Tax Collector for the County of Riverside. It is requested that it be given to the Riverside County Board of Supervisors for its June 9, 2020 meeting.

The crux of the matter is two-fold: (1) the improper tax sale of the Property; and (2) an improper proposed determination and apportionment of the excess proceeds from the sale of the Property.

# Improper Tax Sale Of The Property

The impetus of the May 1, 2018 tax sale was due to the failure to pay the real property taxes for the following periods: 2009 2<sup>nd</sup> installment, 2010, and 2012. **See Attachment A** (email chain from Elizabeth Balderas of the County). The disturbing fact, however, is that all taxes were paid for 2013 through April 2018, right up to the May 1, 2018 tax sale, and that the County failed to: (i) apply any of those payments towards the oldest tax payments due, which would have averted the tax sale as well as minimize any accrued interest on the back taxes; and (ii) notify on the 2013 to 2018 tax bills and/or in the tax payment portal that any such back taxes were due.

Had the late Bonnie Ahlberg and/or her husband, David King, known that the back taxes were due, Bonne and/or David would have first paid off the back taxes. For example, on April 20, 2018, Mr. King paid \$2008.09, believing that was the only amount due as that was what was listed in the 2018 tax information as set forth in the County's website at www.countytreasurer.org. In fact. The County's website for real property taxes showed that for each of the years 2013-2018 that the taxes were paid in full. So, in the example cited above, the County accepted the April 2018 payment as it did for all prior payments, but failed to apply it towards the oldest back taxes.

The County knew or should have known that by failing to apply current payments against past due payments that: (i) unnecessary accrued interest on those back payments would continue; and (ii) those back taxes would continue to be outstanding, which could lead to the 5-year trigger point of then having a tax sale. See Cal. Rev. & Tax. Code § 3691.

Stated differently, the County knew or should have known that applying the taxes paid in 2013 through 2018 towards the back taxes for 2009, 2010, and 2012 would have resulted in those back taxes being paid in full in less than 5-years, and thus there would have been no tax sale of the Property on or about May 1, 2018. That is, the outstanding balance would never have reached a 5-year delinquency period and thus the County would not have been empowered to sell the Property. See Cal. Rev. & Tax. Code § 3691.

Moreover, prior to the May 1, 2018 tax sale of the Property, Mr. King offered to pay the entire back taxes immediately, and the County did not accept the offer. Specifically, Mr. King notified Matt Jennings of the County regarding the couple's prior medical and financial issues. Mr. Jennings directed Mr. King to contact Sandra Finley of the County. Mrs. Finley offered no assistance, even though Mr. King offered to pay the back dues due. Such failure to allow Mr. King to pay off the entire back taxes due violated his right to redeem the Property up until the close of business on the last business day prior to the tax sale date. See Cal. Rev. & Tax. Code § 3706.

After the May 1, 2018 tax sale, on July 9, 2018, the County sent Mr. King a letter indicating that it was in receipt of his Petition to Rescind Tax Sale of the Property ("Petition to Rescind Sale"), and that he would be notified of the hearing date on such Petition. **See Attachment B** (Letter from Lisa Wagner). The Petition to Rescind Sale was done in the one-year period from the date of tax sale per Cal. Rev. & Tax. Code §§ 3725, 3731. However, there was no hearing for on such Petition and that was a clear violation of his right to rescind the sale.

Instead, the County improperly and shockingly steered Mr. King away from his right on following-up on the City's failure to have a hearing on his Petition to Rescind Sale and misled him to believe that his only path was to focus on his claim excess proceeds. Specifically, there are numerous emails from the County regarding filing a claim for excess proceeds, but there are no emails inquiring about Mr. King's Petition to Rescind Sale. More lamentable is the fact that the County knew of Bonnie's poor health that resulted in her death in 2015, the health issues of Mr. King, and the history of the Property.

It is appalling that the County's response was completely devoid of compassion and any effort to assist Mr. King with his Petition to Rescind Sale given all the tax payments made that could easily have satisfied the defaulted payments that gave rise to the tax sale. Rather, it is as if the County wanted to avoid rescinding the tax sale as it obviously would be more work as opposed to going through a claimant process for excess proceeds. In other words, the County's action or lack of action resulted in misleading Mr. King that his only remaining path is the claimant process for excess proceeds, when he clearly could have pursued his right to rescind the tax sale.

Mr. King basically had no choice but to pursue both a Petition to Rescind Sale and file a claim for excess proceeds at the same time as both those avenues must be do one within one year of the tax sale. See Cal. Rev. & Tax. Code §§ 3625, 3631, 4675. Mr. King did so, and yet the County completely ignored his Petition to Rescind Sale and led him to believe that he simply must wait "18 months from May 1, 2018" and then such time frame was correct to say 18 months from June 26, 2018, the date the deed was recorded. See Attachment C (email chain from Melissa Johnson).

Thus, the County's actions and inactions, including but not limited to the failure of applying tax payments towards to oldest amount of back property taxes, the failure to properly process the Petition to Rescind Sale were at best negligence, and at worst intentional deception and fraud that resulted in the improper sale of Property.

# Improper Proposed Determination And Apportionment Of The Excess Proceeds

The claimant Global Discoveries, LTD ("Global Discoveries") consists of a fraudulent statement made under penalty of perjury. Specifically, the Affidavit of Ronald Alhberg submitted as part of Global Discoveries' claim states: "I am the biological sibling to Bonnie Lee E. Ahlberg". Such statement is blatantly false as Bonnie was born as "Baby Girl Canell" and subsequently adopted by Phillip and Georgie Ahlberg. **See Attachment D** (Adoption Decree). Given such false statement, the truth and veracity of the entire claim Global Discoveries is

suspect. Additionally, the birth certificate for Ronald Ahlberg is clearly marked "Informational/Not for Legal Identification". Upon information and belief Ronald Ahlberg was born Ronald O Bradford and was later adopted by Phillip and Georgie Ahlberg.

Moreover, Bonnie Ahlberg has a living natural half-blooded sister named Margo Canell (i.e., they both have the same biological mother). Global Discoveries' claim emanates from Ronald Ahlberg who was a resident of Illinois and died on July 4, 2019. It is unclear what laws govern any inheritance rights Ronald Ahlberg has as there has yet been no probate filed in connection with Bonnie Ahlberg and/or Ronald Ahlberg (e.g., does Illinois law apply, and if so, what does Illinois law state as to a situation where there are two adopted children from different biological parents and a half-blooded biological sibling?). This issue should be resolved by a probate court of law.

Secondly, the proposed apportionment completely ignores Mr. King's right to an offset. Specifically, Mr. King has made eleven (11) tax payments of roughly \$1800.00 each for the periods of 2013 through April 2018, which total more than \$19,800.00. Mr. King also expended his personal funds to maintain and repair the Property, including but not limited to HOA dues of over \$7,500.00 (i.e., \$225/mo. from 2015 to April 2018), home insurance of over \$3,282.00 (i.e., \$1,094/yr. from 2015 to April 2018), and utility bills and other repairs made from Bonnie's death in 2015). Thus, the total excess proceeds of \$40,681.48 should be offset by the above-mentioned payments (which total at least \$30,582.00) and paid directly to Mr. King. All such amounts would have been thus treated in probate of Bonnie's estate. However, for the reasons mentioned above, Mr. King was misled to believe that probating Bonnie's estate was necessary to protect his interest in the proceeds of the improper tax sale of the Property.

Under the extenuating circumstance, it is hereby requested that the County should exercise its discretion to extend the period of filing a claim of the subject excess proceeds so that a probate of Bonnie's Estate can be started and make a claim for the excess proceeds, which would then be disbursed via the probate process. Mr. King does reserve all of his rights and remedies at law against the County and expressly does not waive any of his claims against the County.

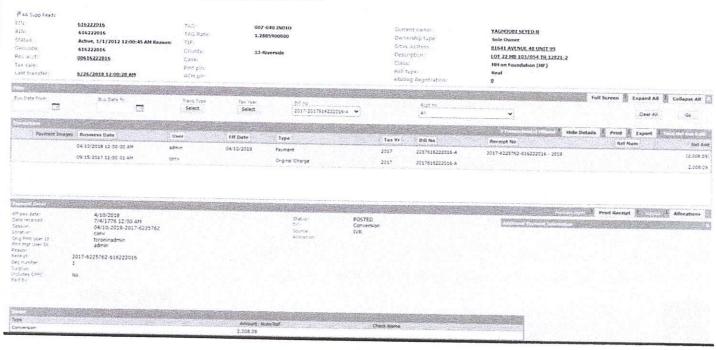
