

BACKGROUND:

Summary

Over recent days conditions of disaster or extreme peril to the safety of persons and property have occurred throughout the State of California, including within the cities of Los Angeles, Long Beach, and Santa Monica, as a result of civil unrest, violence, looting, arson, and the destruction of personal and real property. On June 1, 2020, the Director of Emergency Services proclaimed a Local Emergency in order to protect against such conditions of extreme peril arising within the County of Riverside ("County"). The Board of Supervisors must ratify the Proclamation of Local Emergency to be eligible for state and federal assistance. The declaration of a Local Emergency begins the process to receive resources from State and Federal agencies as may be necessary to assist with the local emergency and any civil unrest that may arise.

Impact on Residents and Businesses:

Residents and businesses will benefit from the preparation and mitigation efforts and the additional available resources to combat conditions of extreme peril which may arise from incidents of civil unrest.

RESOLUTION NO. 2020-157

**A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE
RATIFYING THE DECLARATION OF A LOCAL EMERGENCY**

WHEREAS, Riverside County Ordinance No. 533 empowers the Director of Emergency Services to proclaim the existence of a Local Emergency when the County Board of Supervisors is not in session, and

WHEREAS, on June 1, 2020, the Director of Emergency Services for the County of Riverside ("County") proclaimed a Local Emergency based upon the following findings:

- (1) That at the time of the proclamation the County Board of Supervisors was not is session;
- (2) That over recent days conditions of disaster or extreme peril to the safety of persons and property have occurred throughout the State of California, including within the cities of Los Angeles, Long Beach, and Santa Monica, as a result of civil unrest, violence, looting, arson, and the destruction of personal and real property;
- (3) That such conditions of extreme peril to the safety of persons and property may arise within the County of Riverside; and
- (4) That the aforesaid conditions of extreme peril may arise, warrant, and necessitate the proclamation of a Local Emergency.

WHEREAS the local state of emergency shall not remain in effect after seven (7) days from the date of proclamation unless it has been ratified by the Riverside County Board of Supervisors; and

NOW THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY PROCLAIMED AND ORDERED that the Proclamation of a Local Emergency issued by the Director of Emergency Services on June 1, 2020 is hereby ratified for the period June 1 through June 8, 2020, and that said Local Emergency is deemed terminated by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside.

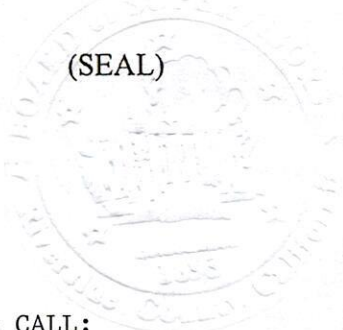

**FINDINGS AND DETERMINATION THAT AN ITEM MAY BE SUBSEQUENTLY
ADDED TO THE AGENDA OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS**



DATE: June 1, 2020

The BOARD OF SUPERVISORS of Riverside County hereby finds:

- That there is a need to place an item on the agenda for action by the Board of Supervisors.
 - An emergency situation exists as defined in Government Code Section 54956.5 in that:
 - (a) Work stoppage or other activity which severely impairs public health, safety, or both, as determined by a majority of the members of the legislative body.
 - (b) Crippling disaster which severely impairs public health, safety or both as determined by a majority of the members of the legislative body.
 - The item on which the action is to be taken came to the attention of the County subsequent to the agenda being posted and there is need to take immediate action on the item.
 - The item was continued for no more than five calendar days from a prior meeting for which the item was posted.

JUSTIFICATION:

The item came to the attention of the County subsequent to the agenda being posted and requires Board action by June 2, 2020. This item is brought by the Director of Emergency Services and the Director of the Emergency Management Department in furtherance of both the June 1, 2020 Proclamation of a Local Emergency for the County of Riverside and the June 1, 2020 Proclamation of the Director of Emergency Services for the County of Riverside Imposing a Curfew. It is necessary that for the safety of persons and property within the County of Riverside, the Board of Supervisors adopt a resolution ratifying and extending the Proclamation of Local Emergency.
