

BACKGROUND:

Summary

The Riverside County Advisory Council on Aging (“Council”) is the local official Area Advisory Council on Aging, as mandated by the Federal Older Americans Act and the Older Californians Act. The Council is a volunteer leadership body whose purpose is to advise the Office on Aging and the Board of Supervisors on all matters related to the development of the Office on Aging Strategic Plan (“Plan”), the administration of the Plan, and operations conducted under the Plan.

Pursuant to the Council’s bylaws, Council membership shall consist of seventeen (17) members and be composed of: (1) a majority of persons sixty (60) years of age or older, (2) service providers, (3) members who reflect the Districts established by the Board of Supervisors or the geographic, racial, economic, and social complexities of the planning and service area, (4) at least one member who represents the interests of the disabled, and (5) the Director of the Office on Aging, or his/her designee, who shall serve as an ex officio member. Each member shall be a resident of Riverside County or be employed within the county. The term of office of members shall be for a three (3) year period, commencing on the first day of July, or if appointed at any other time than July 1 to fill a vacancy, the term shall be considered as a full three-year term if appointed prior to the mid-point of the vacancy to which the member is appointed. If the appointment is after the mid-point, the term shall not be considered a full term and the member shall be eligible to serve one full term following this appointment to fill a vacancy.

The Council has reviewed the qualifications of the candidates and approved the reappointments. In accordance with Board Policy A-21, Resolution No. 2005-148, Uniform Rules and Procedures for Advisory Committees, Boards and Commissions of the County of Riverside, and the Council’s bylaws, the Office on Aging and the Advisory Council on Aging respectfully request the Board of Supervisors reappoint to the Riverside County Advisory Council on Aging, Cynthia Lemus and Steve Mehlman for terms of three (3) years, commencing on July 1, 2020, and terminating on June 30, 2023..

Impact on Residents and Businesses

The Riverside County Advisory Council on Aging is a diverse group of seasoned community leaders who are committed to each other and to the process of consensus building to meet the needs of older adults, persons with disabilities, and caregivers within Riverside County.

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As advocates, the Council Members are the eyes, ears, and voice for older adults and persons with disabilities within their communities. With this important role, Council Members carry the responsibility to raise issues, recommend changes and advocate for those changes. These effective volunteer leaders, in partnership with government and community liaisons, will continue to make a difference for older adults and persons with disabilities.
