Avis enlisted in the Navy (WAVES) during WWII. After the war, she continued to work for the Department of Defense as an Executive Secretary for over 30 years. In 1945 Avis married her husband of 54 years, Bill Henderson. Avis and Bill lived in various parts of the country due to Bill's military career. In the mid 1950's Bill and Avis moved to Tustin, California when Bill became permanently stationed at MCAS-Santa Ana. They moved to Corona, California in 1975.

Avis served as a volunteer docent for more than 25 years at the Heritage House and Riverside Metropolitan Museum. In addition to her career and community volunteerism, Avis enjoyed her hobbies which included painting, music, miniature and antique collecting, attending concerts and musical theater events. She loved going to museums, reading and playing bridge. Avis also loved to cook and entertain with family and friends, especially during the holidays. On motion of Supervisor Perez, seconded by Supervisor Spiegel, and duly carried by unanimous vote, IT WAS ORDERED that the meeting of Tuesday, July 14, 2020, be adjourned in memory of Albert "Obby" Agins, who passed away peacefully, on June 27, 2020 at the age of 91.

Obby was born to Harry and Yetta Agins in Corona, California, on July 21, 1928. He attended Jefferson Elementary, Corona Jr. High and Corona Senior High. He served in the U.S. Merchant Marines briefly at the end of WWII. He served as a corporal during the Korean War in Europe. He married Donna Hennes shortly after, and together they raised two children.

Obby became active in local clubs and civic organizations and ran for Corona City Council. During the 50's and 60's Obby partnered with his younger brother Ron to purchase the small junk yard owned by their father and established Agins Auto, growing the auto salvage business along with towing services, auto sales and a radiator shop. By the late 60's the Agins brothers ventured into the mobile home business with the construction of Buena Vista Mobile Manor in 1969. The brothers went on to partner in establishing several mobile home parks in the southern California area as well as Nevada and Arizona. There was further expansion of various businesses under the Agins Development Corp. Auto dealerships, banking, apartment buildings and many other types of retail commercial properties.

Obby always made sure to enjoy life to the fullest. He was an avid civil aviator. He earned his pilot's license soloing in a Piper Cub, in 1944 and remained flying, and a regular at Corona Airport for the remainder of his life. In 1968, Obby, along with a couple of other local Corona families, established Temple Beth Shalom (now Congregation Beth Shalom) as a fully thriving Jewish community, and he continued to be instrumental in their growth and development.

Obby became involved with several philanthropic activities and organizations including City of Hope, Salvation Army as well as on of his favorites in later years, Guide Dogs of the Desert. He loved fresh water and deep-sea fishing as well as hunting, boating and travel. Obby was much loved and respected. He had a big smile and razor-sharp wit. He made friends very easily, and in the process he changed and influenced many lives over the years.

Obby's memory and passionate spirit will live forever in the hearts of those who knew and loved him. He will be greatly missed but never forgotten.
