

SUBJECT: SUPERVISOR V. MANUEL PEREZ: Allocation of CARES Funding to the Riverside County Office of Education to Support the All for One Campaign. All Districts [\$10,000,000; 100% Federal CARES Act Funds].

RECOMMENDED MOTION: That the Board of Supervisors:

1. Find that the project is exempt from California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines Section 15061(b)(3);

 Authorize the allocation of \$10,000,000 in federal funding under the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (Section 5001, Public Law 116-136; CARES Act) to the Riverside County Office of Education to support the All for One campaign which will provide computer devices and hotspots to students countywide to facilitate access to online learning and educational support services; and

 Authorize the Director of Housing, Homeless Prevention and Workforce Solutions (HHPWS), or designee, to execute the finalized Agreement, subject to County Counsel approval, and execute any and all related agreements and documents necessary to implement and administer the Project, including but not limited to non-substantive amendments, subject to County Counsel approval.

BACKGROUND:

On July 17th, Governor Newsom announced new statewide rules that will shift most California public schools to full time distance learning to curb the spread of COVID-19. California currently has 10,500 schools operating statewide which serve over 6.1 million students. Riverside County is home to 431,521 of these students which are served by the county's 23 school districts.

These new guidelines will require Riverside County schools, administrators, teachers, parents and students to rapidly adapt to a full-time distance learning format. Distance learning can present significant challenges to low-income students and may disproportionately affect students of color, students with disabilities and those living in rural areas. These challenges, known more commonly as the "digital divide" are being exacerbated during the time of COVID. Simply put, some families have the means to succeed in a remote learning environment, and others do not.

Specific examples of the digital divide affecting students in Riverside County include:

- Large families with multiple students who only have one computer at home for everyone to share;
- In one district, less than 80% of the district's geographic area is covered with traditional Internet services;
- Teachers struggling to connect with students who have unreliable Internet service and/or older computer devices that pose challenges to connecting to daily online learning formats; and
- Students and parents with limited computer skills and knowledge that must quickly acclimate to the world of online learning.

The Riverside County Office of Education (RCOE) is aiming to bridge our local digital divide with the launch of "All for One", a campaign centered on raising funds to provide computers, tablets, and mobile hotspot devices to students and families to ensure that no student is left behind in this rapid shift to online learning. If successful, the All for One campaign will go beyond facilitating distance learning and will serve as a critical link for digital inclusion.

As of July, RCOE, estimates that 84,855 computer devices at an approximate cost of \$29.6 million and 44,730 hotspots at a cost of approximately \$6 million are needed to effectively deliver full-time online learning to students countywide. The Office of Education is working with each school district to meet this need which exceeds current budget capacity. The All for One campaign is designed to leverage other public funding, private funding and support from the community at large to ensure that all students have the basic tools to learn at home.

The Riverside County Office of Education (RCOE) provides specific educational, financial, legislative, and leadership services and support to all K-12 school districts in Riverside County. As an organization, it is comprised of the elected Riverside County Superintendent of Schools

and the array of individuals employed by the County Superintendent to help fulfill their statutory duties and responsibilities. A seven member elected County Board of Education is affiliated with the RCOE. The primary work of the RCOE is divided into the following three areas: 1) providing overarching educational goals, support and services leading to high school graduation, college readiness, and career preparedness of all county students enrolled in public education; 2) providing financial oversight and support of the school districts in the county to ensure fiscal solvency and compliance with statutes; and 3) providing credential oversight and support to ensure all teachers in the county are properly authorized for the subject area(s) they are assigned to teach. With the advent of the pandemic, RCOE has taken a leadership and advocacy role to ensure the safety of all students and the continuity of educational services and supports. The County through its Housing, Homeless Prevention and Workforce Solutions Department (HHPWS) is tasked with working collaboratively with community partners to deliver a highly skilled and educated local workforce which meets the demands of the 21st Century. The K-12 education system is a critical partner in this effort as it prepares students for college and for job opportunities following graduation. The proposed funding allocation aligns with the County's overarching workforce objectives and supports the distance learning goals outlined in the federal CARES funding guidelines.

Staff Recommends that the Board authorize the allocation of \$10,000,000 in CARES Act funding to facilitate distance learning for Riverside County students; and authorize the HHPWS Director, or designee, to execute a finalized Subrecipient Agreement, subject to County Counsel approval.

Pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), the Project and the Agreement were reviewed and determined to be categorically exempt from CEQA under State CEQA Guídelines Section 15061(b)(3), General Rule of "Common Sense" exemption. The Project includes a Subrecipient Agreement which allows for the sharing of current funds among the six community colleges in Riverside County to provide training and development to County residents and small businesses, It can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the Project may have a significant effect on the environment, as the aforementioned activities will have purely financial and social-welfare benefits and will not lead to any direct or reasonably indirect physical environmental impacts.

Impact on Residents and Businesses

The proposed funding allocation will provide digital devices and hotspots to underserved students and will expand access to online service. This will ensure that all students have the necessary tools to continue their education during the COVID-19 pandemic.
