BACKGROUND:

Summary

On May 19, 2020, agenda item 3.3, the Riverside County Board of Supervisors approved the acceptance of the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Acts (CARES Act) funding from the federal government and established a budget to be administered through the Executive Office for COVID-19 expenses related to county-wide response and preparation activities.

In coordination with the County Public Health Officer, the county's Emergency Management Department's Emergency Operations Center (EOC) is serving as the responsible entity for the county's COVID-19-related responses. Some of the activities coordinated through the EOC are: laboratory staffing, administering of county COVID-19 testing, staff surge implementation, coordination between the county's hospitals and public health clinics, other hospitals and health care providers, securing hotel and motel rooms for health care, public safety and homeless individuals, recovery from COVID-19, bulk orders for medical equipment and PPE, detention center health sanitation, information technology related to telework and EOC coordination, maintenance of county facilities and federal medical stations, nursing home assistance and guidance, lab equipment, and communication and outreach. The expenses associated with these activities are reimbursable through the CARES Act.

The Emergency Management Department is requesting a budget transfer of \$69,000,000 for purchases processed through the EOC related to county-wide response and preparation activities. All COVID-19 related expenses are tracked and monitored by the Executive Office.

Impact on Residents and Businesses

Use of CARES Act funding benefits the community by assisting regional hospitals, community health centers and congregate care facilities to care for those affected by COVID-19. CARES Act funding has been a critical component as the county continues essential services to residents in the areas of medical care, public health response, testing, PPE's, social services, public safety and general government services.
