BACKGROUND:

Summary

The County of Riverside (County), in cooperation with the City of Norco (Norco), is proposing to replace the existing Hamner Avenue Bridge over the Santa Ana River with a new, longer and wider bridge to enhance safety and improve traffic circulation. The Hamner Avenue Bridge is located within the jurisdictional boundaries of the City of Norco.

The County, Norco and Riverside County Regional Park and Open-Space District (Parks) would like to take this opportunity to construct two (2) segments of the Santa Ana River Trail adjacent to the Hamner Avenue Bridge. Segment 1 will be constructed on the north-east side of the Hamner Avenue Bridge. Segment 2 will be constructed on the south-east side of the Hamner Avenue Bridge. The proposed trail improvements are for the construction of a 12-foot wide asphalt concrete multipurpose trail. These two (2) segments will adjoin to the 12-foot wide multipurpose trail proposed with the new Hamner Avenue Bridge project.

These two (2) segments are part of the 110-mile Santa Ana River Trail, spanning the Counties of San Bernardino, Riverside and Orange that Parks is planning to construct.

The City of Norco and Parks have requested that the County include the construction of these two (2) segments of the Santa Ana River Trail along with the Hamner Avenue bridge construction contract to provide the least amount of inconvenience to the public and to provide the best coordination with the County's construction project. All the costs under the agreement will be funded by Parks.

The cooperative agreement between the County and Parks provides for the funding and implementation of the following work:

Environmental Findings

The two (2) segments of the Santa Ana River Trail improvements have been environmentally cleared with the Hamner Avenue Bridge Replacement Project.

The City of Norco is the lead agency for the approval of the CEQA document for the Hamner Avenue Bridge Replacement Project. By Minute Order dated April 17, 2019 (Agenda Item 6B), the Norco City Council adopted the Initial Study/Mitigated Negative Declaration for the Hamner Avenue Bridge Replacement Project. The Notice of Determination was posted with the Riverside County Recorder's Office on April 22, 2019.

On May 5, 2020 (Agenda Item 3.29), the County Board of Supervisor adopted Resolution 2020-067 and filed the Notice of Determination to make the County the responsible agency of the CEQA findings associated with the Hamner Avenue Bridge Replacement Project.

Impact on Residents and Businesses

The Hamner Avenue Bridge Replacement Project will improve traffic flow on Hamner Avenue and provide a multipurpose trail for multiple users (hikers, bicyclists and equestrians). By completing the two (2) segments of the Santa Ana River Trail improvements with the bridge replacement project, there will be less impacts to the public.

Construction is scheduled to start in January 2021 and complete in December 2022.

Additional Fiscal Information

The total cost for the construction of the two (2) segments of the Santa Ana River Trail is estimated to be \$2,975,000. Parks will fund 100% of the cost to construct the trail segments.

COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT BY AND BETWEEN

RIVERSIDE COUNTY

AND

RIVERSIDE COUNTY REGIONAL PARK AND OPEN-SPACE DISTRICT FOR THE SANTA ANA RIVER TRAIL IMPROVEMENTS LOCATED WITHIN THE CITY OF NORCO

This Agreement for the Santa Ana River Trail Improvements located within the City of Norco ("Agreement") entered into this 4th day of August, 2020, by and between the County of Riverside, a political subdivision of the State of California, (hereinafter "COUNTY"), and Riverside County Regional Park and Open-Space District, a special district created pursuant to the California Public Resources Code Division 5, Chapter 3, Article 3, (hereinafter "PARKS") for the provisions for Santa Ana River Trail Improvements located within the jurisdictional boundaries of the City of Norco (hereinafter "NORCO").

RECITALS

- A. COUNTY, NORCO and PARKS are proposing to construct two (2) segments of the Santa Ana River Trail (hereinafter "PROJECT") as shown in Exhibit A (Vicinity Map). Segment 1 will be constructed on the north-east side of Hamner Avenue Bridge. Segment 2 will be constructed on the south-east side of the Hamner Avenue Bridge.
- B. The PROJECT will be constructed as part of Hamner Avenue Bridge Replacement Project over the Santa Ana River
- C. The COUNTY in cooperation with NORCO will be completing the environmental and the engineering services to construct this PROJECT as part of the Hamner Avenue Bridge Replacement Project.
- D. Due to the PROJECT being located within the jurisdictional boundaries of the city of NORCO, in accordance with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), NORCO is the Lead Agency to consider and approve any and all environmental documents required by CEQA for the PROJECT as part of the Hamner Avenue Bridge Replacement Project. The COUNTY is

designated as a Responsible Agency for performing the construction and construction management for this PROJECT.

E. COUNTY and PARKS desire to define herein the terms and conditions under which said PROJECT is to be administered, environmentally cleared, engineered, coordinated, constructed, managed, maintained and financed.

AGREEMENT

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises contained herein, the parties hereto agree as follows:

SECTION 1 • PARKS AGREES:

- 1. To fund one-hundred (100) percent of the cost for acquiring the right of way, advertising, awarding and administering a public works construction contract necessary to construct PROJECT improvements. The estimated costs for the construction of the PROJECT are provided in Exhibit "B" attached hereto and incorporated herein. PARKS agrees that should unforeseen circumstances arise which result in an increase of any costs over those shown in Exhibit "B", PARKS will in good faith consider an amendment to this Agreement to include any such costs under this Agreement.
- To provide, at no cost to COUNTY, oversight of PROJECT and to provide prompt reviews and approvals, as appropriate, of submittals by COUNTY, and to cooperate in timely processing of PROJECT.
- To provide a representative to coordinate through the COUNTY's Resident Engineer during
 the construction of PROJECT and to verify facilities are constructed in accordance with the
 approved PS&E documents as required by this Agreement.
- 4. To pay within 30 days of receipt all invoices submitted by COUNTY for services rendered in accordance with this Agreement.

SECTION 2 • COUNTY AGREES:

1. To prepare, or cause to be prepared, detailed PS&E documents for the PROJECT. Final plans for improvements are within NORCO's right of way shall be prepared to NORCO

standards, and signed by a Civil Engineer registered in the State of California. COUNTY shall not solicit construction bids until PARKS has approved the PROJECT PS&E documents.

- 2. To identify and locate all utility facilities within the PROJECT area as part of its PROJECT design responsibility. If any existing public and/or private utility facilities conflict with PROJECT construction, COUNTY shall make all necessary arrangements with the owners of such facilities for their protection, relocation, or removal. All utility facilities shall be identified on the PROJECT plans and specifications, and conflicting utilities shall be denoted.
- As Responsible Agency for purposes of CEQA, to prepare an environmental document and to obtain necessary environmental clearances in accordance with the California Environmental Quality ACT.
- 4. To make written application to NORCO for an encroachment permit authorizing entry into NORCO's right-of-way for the purposes of constructing PROJECT.
- 5. To advertise, award and administer a public works contract for the construction of PROJECT in accordance with all applicable laws, including but not limited to the local Agency Public Construction Code, the California Labor Code, and in accordance with the permit issued by the COUNTY.
- 6. To furnish a representative to perform the function of Resident Engineer during construction of PROJECT.
- 7. To furnish qualified support staff to assist the Resident Engineer in, but not limited to, construction surveys, soils and foundation tests, measurement and computation of quantities, testing of construction materials, checking shop drawings, preparation of estimates and reports, preparation of the as-built drawings, and other inspection and staff services necessary to assure that the construction is performed in accordance with the PS&E documents.
- 8. To construct PROJECT in accordance with approved PS&E documents.
- 9. To provide material testing and quality control conforming to the Caltrans Standard Testing

Methods as provided in Chapter 16 of the Local Assistance Procedures Manual, and to have this testing performed by a certified material tester.

- 10. Submit invoices to PARKS periodically and as applicable, but not more frequent than monthly, for reimbursement of PROJECT costs.
- 11. To submit any contract change orders that cause the construction contract to exceed 10% of the contract bid amount to PARKS for review and approval prior to final authorization by COUNTY.
- 12.To furnish PARKS a complete set of full-sized PROJECT as-built plans, all contract records, including survey documents, within sixty (60) days following the completion and acceptance of the PROJECT construction contract
- 13. To furnish PARKS a final reconciliation of project expenses within ninety (90) days following the completion and acceptance of the PROJECT construction contract.

SECTION 3 • IT IS MUTUALLY AGREED AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. The total cost for acquisition of right of way, construction and construction management for this PROJECT is estimated to be \$2,975,000 as detailed in Exhibit "B".
- If upon opening of bids for construction of PROJECT and if the bids indicate a cost overrun
 of no more than 15% of the construction costs estimate as described in Exhibit "B" will
 occur, COUNTY may award the contract.
- 3. If upon opening of bids, it is found that a cost overrun exceeding fifteen percent (15%) of the Total Estimate Cost will occur, COUNTY and PARKS shall endeavor to agree upon an alternative course of action. If, after thirty (30) calendar days from the date of bid opening, an alternative course of action is not agreed upon, this Agreement shall be deemed to be terminated by mutual consent, with each agency sharing incurred costs in accordance with the cost shares as set forth in Section I, Article (1), Section II, Article (1).
- Construction by PROJECT improvements referred to herein which lie within NORCO rights
 of way shall not be commenced until an Encroachment Permit to COUNTY, or COUNTY's
 contractor, authorizing such work has been issued by NORCO.

- PARKS personnel may observe and inspect all work being done on PROJECT, but shall provide any comments to COUNTY personnel who shall be solely responsible for all communications with COUNTY contractor.
- 6. COUNTY shall cause COUNTY's contractor to maintain in force, until completion and acceptance of the PROJECT construction contract, a policy of Contractual Liability Insurance, including coverage of Bodily Injury Liability and Property Damage Liability, in the amount of \$2,000,000 minimum single limit coverage, and a policy of Automobile Liability Insurance in the amount of \$1,000,000 minimum. Endorsements to each policy shall be required which name of PARKS, its officers, officials, agents and employees as additionally insured. COUNTY shall also require COUNTY's contractor to maintain Worker's Compensation Insurance. COUNTY shall provide Certificates of Insurance and Additional Insured Endorsements which meet the requirements of this section to PARKS prior to the start of construction.
- 7. Ownership and title to all materials, equipment, and appurtenances installed as part of this Agreement will automatically be vested to PARKS and no further agreement will be necessary to transfer ownership.
- 8. PARKS shall be responsible for any maintenance of the Santa Ana River Trail Improvements provided by PROJECT upon completion of the PROJECT.
- 9. No alteration or variation of the terms of this Agreement shall be valid unless made in writing and signed by both parties and no oral understanding or agreement not incorporated herein shall be binding on either party hereto.
- 10. COUNTY and PARKS shall retain or cause to be retained for audit for a period of three (3) years from the date of final payment, all records and accounts relating to PROJECT.
- 11. Neither COUNTY nor any officer or employee thereof shall be responsible for any damage or liability occurring by reason of anything done or omitted to be done by PARKS under or in connection with any work, authority or jurisdiction delegated to PARKS under this Agreement. It is further agreed that pursuant to Government Code Section 895.4, PARKS shall fully indemnify and hold COUNTY harmless from any liability imposed for injury (as

defined by Government Code Section 810.8) occurring by reason of anything done or omitted to be done by PARKS under or in connection with any work, authority or jurisdiction delegated to PARKS under this Agreement.

- 12. Neither PARKS nor any officer or employee thereof shall be responsible for any damage or liability occurring by reason of anything done or omitted to be done by COUNTY under or in connection with any work, authority or jurisdiction delegated to COUNTY under this Agreement. It is further agreed that pursuant to Government Code Section 895.4, COUNTY shall fully indemnify and hold PARKS harmless from any liability imposed for injury (as defined by Government Code Section 810.8) occurring by reason of anything done or omitted to be done by COUNTY under or in connection with any work, authority or jurisdiction delegated to COUNTY under this Agreement.
- 13. This Agreement and the exhibits herein contain the entire agreement between the parties, and is intended by the parties to completely state the agreement in full. Any agreement or representation respecting the matters dealt with herein or the duties of any party in relation thereto, not expressly set forth in this Agreement, is null and void.
- 14. Nothing in the provisions of this Agreement is intended to create duties or obligations to or rights in third parties not parties to this Agreement or affect the legal liability of either party to the Agreement by imposing any standard of care with respect to the maintenance of roads different from the standard of care imposed by law.
- 15. This Agreement may be executed in one or more counterparts and when a counterpart shall have been signed by each party hereto, each shall be deemed an original, but all of which constitute one and the same instrument.
- 16. This Agreement shall terminate upon completion of the PROJECT or upon mutual agreement of the parties.


