BACKGROUND:

Summary

By Minute Order dated April 7, 2020 (Agenda Item 3.60), the Board of Supervisors authorized the Clerk of the Board to advertise for the Integrated Mitigation Project, located Southwest of Briggs Road and Golden Jay Lane, in the French Valley Community in Riverside County.

The Integrated Mitigation Project site is located south of Scott Road and west of Briggs Road. It is owned by the Western Riverside County Regional Conservation Authority (RCA) and consists of roughly 74 acres.

The project will construct a new stream channel and seasonal wetlands, enhance the streambed, and preserve existing habitat for specific habitat losses that resulted from the state Route 79 (Winchester Road) Widening Project, Interstate 15 at Clinton Keith Road Interchange Improvements Project, Clinton Keith Extension Project for the Clinton Keith Road Extension, and the State Route 371 (SR-371) Shoulder Widening project. The environmental permits issued for these projects require implementation of off-site mitigation in accordance with the permit requirements.

During the advertisement period, four addenda were issued to all registered plan holders as a supplement to the plans and specifications. Bidders are required to acknowledge and take into account the issued addendum in their contractor's Bid in order to be considered for award. The addenda are attached as Addendum No. 1 through Addendum No. 4.

The conctract includes the following schedules of work:

Base Bid Schedule A: Briggs Road Channel Construction

Base Bid Schedule B: Briggs Road Landscape, Irrigation and Plant Establishment

Base Bid Schedule C: Clinton Keith Road Restoration and Enhancement

Base Bid Schedule D: Clinton Keith Road Plant Establishment

The contractor is qualified to perform the work as outlined in the bid, has executed the contract, and has provided bond documents which meet the requirements of the Contract.

Impact on Residents and Businesses

The project will restore and enhance the RCA conservation land by:

- Increasing native vegetation and habitat for dependent flora and fauna within the watershed,
- · Increasing soil moisture retention,
- Removing non-native plants;
- · Decreasing erosion; and
- · Reducing downstream flooding.

These improvements will enhance water quality in the watershed and biological efficacy, and ultimately restore and protect the environment for local residents and future generations.

The work is scheduled to begin in Summer 2020 and will take approximately five months to complete. The site vegetation, habitat and plant establishment will be monitored and maintained for a five year period. The Regional Conservation Authority will assume maintenance responsibility following the five year establishment period.

SUPPLEMENTAL:

Additional Fiscal Information

The Transportation Department recommends award of the Contract to Helix Environmental Construction Group, Inc. in the amount of \$1,799,290. The construction contract will be funded with Measure A/Western and Combined Improvement Funds.

The proposed budget as shown on Attachment "A" includes the Contract award amount and other associated costs. There are no General Funds used in this project.

Contract History and Price Reasonableness

Five (5) bids were received ranging from \$1,799,289.73 to \$2,920,654. The basis for the selection of a bid is the lowest responsive and responsible bid.

All received bids were responsive to the bidding requirements set forth for the project. The lowest responsible bid was submitted by Helix Environmental Construction Group, Inc. in the amount of \$1,799,290 which is \$10,967 (0.61%) above the Engineer's Estimate, however it is 31% below the average submitted bid costs.

Recitals:

- Contractor has submitted to County his Contractor's Proposal for the construction of County Project, <u>Integrated Mitigation Project</u>, <u>Located Southwest of Briggs Road and Golden</u> <u>Jay Lane</u>, <u>In the French Valley Community</u>, <u>Project No. C7-0032</u>), in strict accordance with the Contract Documents identified below and County has accepted said Proposal.
- 2. Contractor states that he has reexamined his Contractor's Proposal and found it to be correct, has ascertained that his subcontractors are properly licensed and possess the requisite skill and forces, has reexamined the site and Contract Documents and is of the opinion that he can presently do the work in accordance with the Contract Documents for the money set forth in his Proposal to be paid as provided in the Contract Documents.

Agreement:

It is agreed by the parties as follows:

1. Contract Documents

The entire Contract consists of the following: (a) The Construction Contract, (b) The Notice to Bidders. (c) The Instruction to Bidders, (d) The Bid, (e) The Bid Bond, (f) The Payment Bond, (g) The Performance Bond, (h) The General Conditions, (i) The Special Provisions, (j) The Standard Specifications of the State of California Department of Transportation edition of 2010 as modified in other portions of the Contract Documents and as amended by the State of California Department of Transportation, (k) The Standard Plans of the Department of Transportation identified on the plans or in the Special Provisions, (l) The Plans, (m) Addenda, (n) The Determination of Prevailing Wage Rates for Public Works, (o) Any Change Orders issued, and (p) Any additional or supplemental specifications, notice, instructions and drawings issued in accordance with the provisions of the Contract Documents. All of said Documents presently in existence are by this reference incorporated herein with like effect as if here set forth in full and upon the proper issuance of other documents they shall likewise be deemed incorporated. The Bid Bond is exonerated upon execution of this Contract and the Payment Bond and Performance Bond.

2. The Work

Contractor shall do all tasks necessary to construct the work generally described in Recital No. 1 in accordance with the Contract Documents.

3. Prosecution, Progress and Liquidated Damages

Attention is directed to the provisions in Section 8-1.04, "Start of Job Site Activities", Section 8-1.05, "Time", and in Section 8-1.10 "Liquidated Damages" of the Standard Specifications and these Special Provisions.

Standard Specification Section 8-1.04B, "Standard Start" is modified to read as follows:

The Contractor shall begin work within <u>fifteen (15)</u> calendar days, or as revised in the Special Provisions, of the date stated within the written "Notice to Proceed".

The Contractor shall notify the Engineer, in writing, of the Contractor's intent to begin work at least 72 hours before work is begun. If the project has more than one (1) location of work, Contractor shall submit a separate notice for each location. The notice shall be delivered to the Transportation Department's Construction Engineer and shall specify the date the Contractor intends to start at said location.

Should the Contractor begin work in advance of receiving a written "Notice to Proceed", any work performed by the Contractor in advance of the date stated in the "Notice to Proceed" shall be considered as having been done by the Contractor at his own risk and as a volunteer and subject to the following:

- A. The Contractor shall, on commencing operations, take all precautions required for public safety and shall observe all the provisions in the Specifications and the Special Provisions.
- B. All work done according to the Contract, prior to the issuance of the "Notice to Proceed", will be considered authorized work and will be paid for as provided in the contract.
- C. The Contractor shall not be entitled to any additional compensation or an extension of time for any delay, hindrance or interference caused by or attributable to commencement of work prior to the issuance of the "Notice to Proceed".

4. Compensation

Contractor shall be paid in the manner set forth in the Contract Documents the amount of his Proposal as accepted by County, the above rates, subject to additions and deductions as provided in the Contract Documents. Said Proposal is on file in the Office of the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors of County.

Welded wire fence fabric shall consist of 11-gauge steel wire woven in an open grid, with openings sized as shown on the plans. Wire crossings shall be welded, and the assembled fabric shall be galvanized after welding.

Aggregate used to backfill and stabilize timbers and posts shall be commercial-quality, crushed granitic material, and shall be graded from 1" to fines to allow for dense compaction.

Timber posts shall be set in drilled holes of the diameter and depth shown on the plans to maintain undisturbed, compacted soil adjacent to the footings. Place a 3-inch deep layer of aggregate at the base of each hole, set, plumb and align each post and backfill with additional aggregate, compacting by tamping thoroughly in 6-inch lifts.

Assemble cross pieces and bolt securely. Cut fence fabric to size, trimming wire stubs flush and smooth with cross wires. Fasten fabric to posts a maximum of 8-inch OC using heavy-duty staples minimum 1 ¼-inch long or "U"-shaped brads of similar dimension. Ensure the completed access is free of jagged or sharp edges or protrusions that may cause abrasions to animals or riders utilizing the access.

Equestrian Access will be paid for at the contract unit price per each access required by the plans, and shall include full compensation for furnishing the materials together with all necessary fittings and hardware, clearing the line of the gate and disposing of the resulting material, excavating high points in the existing ground between posts, excavating and doing all the work involved in installing the equestrian access complete in place, and no additional compensation will be made therefore.
