

BACKGROUND:

Summary

In 2019, the Treasurer-Tax Collector went live with a new property tax system. Under the new system, the Treasurer-Tax Collector will have the ability to accept and post partial payments for delinquent taxes when remitted by debtors or trustees. By way of background, federal law allows a debtor to repay delinquent taxes over a period of time in installments in lieu of full payments. The posting of partial payments will allow these monies to be apportioned when collected by the Treasurer-Tax Collector. Acceptance of partial payments will also allow the Treasurer-Tax Collector to quickly provide updated pay-off amounts to debtors, trustees or the Court.

Impact on Residents and Businesses

Acceptance of partial payments for taxes will benefit the taxpayer by providing immediate credit for all payments remitted and in calculating penalties and interest on unpaid balances.

ORDINANCE NO. 959

AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE

The Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside ordains as follows:

Section 1. PURPOSE. The purpose of this section is to establish a fee to recover the reasonable costs of instituting, collecting and maintaining partial tax payments in bankruptcy cases as authorized by 11 U.S.C Section 506(b) and Revenue and Taxation Code sections 2636 and 4143. This fee is a charge as described in paragraph (2) of subdivision (e) of Section 1 of Article XIIC of the California Constitution and is subject to the requirements of Chapter 12.5 of Part 1 of Division 2 of Title 5 of the Government Code.

Scope. This fee shall be collected by the Treasurer-Tax Collector prior to the application of any partial payments. The maximum fees that the Treasurer-Tax Collector may charge shall be authorized by this Ordinance and limited to cost recovery only as set forth in Section 54985 of the Government Code.

Section 3. FEE SCHEDULE. As authorized by Revenue and Taxation Code Sections 2636 and 4143 and 11 U.S.C Section 506(b), along with Government Code Section 54985, the Treasurer-Tax Collector shall collect a partial payment fee of seventeen dollars and ten cents (\$17.10) per partial payment. Said partial payment fee shall be collected upon each individual payment submitted by the taxpayer, or authorized representative of the taxpayer, including, but not limited to, the taxpayer's counsel of record, bankruptcy trustee or other representative, and accepted by the Treasurer-Tax Collector. This partial payment shall subject to review and adjustment as authorized by law to ensure complete cost recovery as authorized by Section 54985 and may be updated through County Ordinance 654.21.

Section 4. LISTING NOT COMPREHENSIVE. This Ordinance is not intended to contain all fees that are or may be charged by the Treasurer-Tax Collector for services and products and to the extent that other fees are customarily charged or are established elsewhere and are not listed below, all such fees, charges and rates shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 5. SEVERABILITY. Should any fee herein established be held to be invalid or otherwise unenforceable, such determination shall not affect the validity of all remaining fee provisions.

Section 6. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Ordinance shall take effect thirty (30) days after its adoption.
