#### **BACKGROUND:**

#### Summary

On November 6, 2018 (agenda item 3.40) the Board of Supervisors entered into an agreement with Beador Construction Company for the construction of the Temescal Canyon Road Widening Projects, Dawson Canyon Segment and Dos Lagos Segment, and for the Temescal Canyon Road Drainage Improvement Project at Coldwater Creek located within the Community of Temescal Valley.

The authorized amount of the contract was \$13,581,730. The combined amount of Contract Change Orders Nos. 9S1 and 12 are \$565,000 (4.2% of the original contract amount) which exceeds the maximum change order amount that can be authorized by the Director of Transportation and requires Board of Supervisors approval in accordance with Resolution No. 2019-035.

Contract Change Order No. 9S1 was necessary to ensure compliance with the California Water Board Construction General Permit. The permit requires the implementation of permanent erosion control measures to be in place prior to the completion of the project. Due to the rocky slope material, the initial erosion control did not germinate successfully. This contract change order will allow for the application of hydroseed with a bonded fiber matrix on the slope which will serve as the permanent erosion control measure.

Temescal Canyon Road is an old state highway with many unmarked underground utilities. Contract Change Order No. 12 compensates the contractor for the relocation of the City of Corona's existing 18" waterline. This waterline was in direct conflict with the storm drain facility and after evaluating various options to avoid having to relocate the waterline no viable alternative solutions could be found. The City of Corona was given the opportunity to conduct the work; however, the City requested the County's contractor to perform this work. This waterline relocation work will be reimbursed by the City of Corona.

Not including these Contract Change Orders, The Transportation Department has issued 12 Contract Change Orders to date totaling \$1,350,808 (9.94% of the original contract amount), which was the result of three (3) major factors:

- Unforeseen utility conflicts and impacts that could not be identified prior to the
  construction of the project. Utility relocations and various items of additional work
  was needed to resolve these utility conflicts at the request of the City of Corona,
  Temescal Valley Water District (TVWD) and Santa Ana Watershed Project Authority
  (SAWPA) (\$787,000).
- Modifications and additions to the traffic signal at Dawson Canyon Drive and storm drain facilities due to conflicts with existing utilities, and compensation to provide temporary power to a local business impacted by the construction of the retaining wall improvements (\$243,679).
- Construction of headwall and retaining wall improvements at Cold Water Creek to facilitate the construction of Riverside County Flood Control District's detention basin project. These improvements will minimize future disruptions to the public (\$170,000).

The total contract change orders, including Change Order Nos. 9S1 and 12 are \$1,915,679 and are detailed in the attached Change Order Report. All work related to utility relocation has been paid for by the respective Utility company, and including Change Order 12, total \$1,202,000.

The roadway was open to full public use in June 2020 and punch list items are remaining for the closeout of construction.

#### Impact on Residents and Businesses

The proposed improvements will increase safety, reduce vehicle emissions, improve access for emergency service responders, and improve the quality of life for residents and commuters along the Temescal Valley corridor.

#### Additional Fiscal Information

The Contract Change Orders brings the total current authorized contract amount to \$15,497,538, which is 14.1% over the originally authorized contract amount of \$13,581,730. The cost increase will be funded by a combination of RCTC Measure A – Regional Arterial, State SB-1 Local Partnership Program funds, the City of Corona, Santa Ana Watershed Project Authority and Temescal Valley Water District.

1	\$170,000	1.25%	Additional concrete headwall/retaining wall, including footing, was needed to accommodate the County of Riverside Flood Control District (RCFC) detention basin project. This additional work eliminated the need for RCFC to impact the culvert Improvements and the traveling public during the construction of their project.
2	\$190,000	1.40%	Santa Ana Water Project Authority (SAWPA) required all of their facilities to be protect in place within the project limits. Due to the existing field conditions and discussions with SAWPA, the protection plan for the SAWPA lines was revised. This work will be reimbursed by SAWPA.
3	\$200,000	1.47%	The City of Corona requested the relocation of water services and appurtenances that are in conflict with the construction of the widening of project. Exploratory potholing was necessary to properly identify utility depths and locations. This work will be reimbursed by the City of Corona.
4	\$197,000	1.45%	During the material submittal process the City of Corona determined that Ductile Iron Pipe (DIP) was prone to leaking over an extended period of time and requested a change in material from DIP to Cement Mortar Lined and Coated pipe. This work will be reimbursed by the City of Corona.
5	\$200,000	1.47%	Existing Temescal Valley Water District (TVWD) lines, blind flanges, blow-off valves and other facilities were not identified or shown on the project plans. Therefore, the contractor performed additional work including potholing and relocating facilities and appurtenances of the existing TVWD lines to accommodate the installation of the new storm drain lines per the approved project plans. This work will be reimbursed by TVWD.
7	\$206,000	1.52%	Utility conflicts within the project limits were not identified prior to construction. The contractor was directed to remove and/or relocate these utility conflicts in order to continue and not the delay the construction of the storm drain systems and other proposed improvements.
8	\$5,000	0.04%	The contractor was compensated for half of the invoiced costs for Alternate Dispute Resolution (DRA). DRA services were required. The project encountered a number of utility conflicts, significant delays were noted, and work was delayed, resulting in unforeseen cost.
