Joe was born February 12, 1917 in St. Louis, Missouri to Joseph J. Lang and Inez Lang. Joe lived his early years in Summitville, Indiana and moved to Santa Monica, California in 1928. After graduating from University of California, Los Angeles, he enlisted in the U.S. Army in 1941. Shortly after Pearl Harbor, he was transferred to the Air Corps. While in flight training at the Thunderbird Field in Phoenix, Arizona, he met the love of his life, Nellie Lassey. They were married November 8, 1942 and lived a long and happy life together until her passing in June 2009.

During World War II, service in the Air Corps took him to India, Burma and China. He took great pride in those years. He maintained contact with his fellow veterans who had served in the CBI theater to the end. After the war, he continued in the Air Force Reserve. He was "called up" during the Korean War and retired as a Lieutenant Colonel in 1977.

Joe and Nellie moved to Hemet in 1980 and became very involved in the Methodist Church. In 1999, the Hemet United Methodist Church named them "Couple of the year." Joe was also past president of the Hemet Kiwanis Club and over the years received numerous awards and recognitions, including the Legion of Honor.



He was stationed in Rhode Island and Florida during his three years of service, and completed a tour of duty in the Mediterranean on a nuclear aircraft carrier. He married his wife Donna Lee on July 19, 1980, and together they raised two children: Ashley and Travis. Dirk worked 35 years for Young's Market Company, routing and driving semi-trucks at various times throughout his career.

Dirk was a dedicated community member, serving on the Winchester Homeowners Association and he was vice chairman of the Winchester/Homeland Municipal Advisory Council for 10 years. He was instrumental in getting the first park in Winchester developed. His commitment to serving others was never more apparent than it was over the last 27 years in his role as chairman of the Domenigoni Ranch Charity Ride for Diabetes. This event began in 1993 and was held biennially to raise funds for the American Diabetes Association and the Camp Conrad Chinnock Diabetes Camping and Educational Services.

Dirk was an adventurous spirit that always kept his family learning and trying new things. Weekends and summers were spent road tripping, camping, sailing and even panning for gold. Dirk and Donna loved long distance bike riding. They rode 544 miles, over two weeks one summer along the Oregon coast, with their bike trailers loaded with camping gear in tow.
