On motion of Supervisor Perez, seconded by Supervisor Spiegel, and duly carried by unanimous vote, IT WAS ORDERED that the meeting of Tuesday, September 22, 2020, be adjourned in memory of Charles Edward Morton, a Big Bear Interagency Hotshot Squad Boss, who tragically died at the age of 39, on September 17, 2020, while fighting the El Dorado fire in the San Bernardino National Forest.

Charlie was born August 7, 1981, in San Diego, California. He graduated from Ocean Shores High, in Oceanside on an accelerated track. Charlie's inquisitive nature drove him to become "a student of fire." He started his career in 2002 as Corpsman with the California Conservation Corps at the Butte Fire Center in Magalia, moving to the 2006 fire season with Firestorm Fire Suppression in Chico.

Charlie's 14-year Forest Service career began in 2006 with the Truckee Interagency Hotshots in the Tahoe National Forest. Charlie joined the San Bernardino National Forest in 2007 and worked on both the Front Country and Mountaintop Ranger Districts, for the Mill Creek Interagency hotshots, Engine 31, Engine 19, and the Big Bear Interagency Hotshots. He strived to be the best, and in 2018, he was recognized as Hotshot of the year with the Mill Creek Hotshots.

Charlie was a highly focused firefighter who worked hard to develop and share expertise, he was a well-respected leader who was always there for his squad and his crew at the toughest times. He demanded hugs instead of handshakes from his fellow crew members. He was fun to work with, and beloved by his community. Charlie was a kind and generous man, he participated in a bicycle drive so underprivileged kids would have wheels, he also gave a car to a coworker who was short of money.

Charlie loved what he did, he loved being a hotshot firefighter, he loved his mountain, he loved fighting fire without water, and he valued the community of the Forest Service. Charlie is survived by his wife and daughter, his parents, two brothers, cousins and friends.

Charlie's memory and passionate spirit will live forever in the hearts of those who knew and loved him, he will be greatly missed but never forgotten.

On motion of Supervisor Perez, seconded by Supervisor Spiegel, and duly carried by unanimous vote, IT WAS ORDERED that the meeting of Tuesday, September 22, 2020, be adjourned in memory of Justice Ruth Bader Ginsberg, who was the second woman to serve on the Supreme Court, passed away on September 18, 2020 at the age of 87.

Justice Ruth Bader Ginsberg spent many years breaking down barriers for women before the 27 years she served on the Supreme Court. She was the first female tenured professor at Columbia Law School and successfully argued a case before the Supreme Court that said, men should not automatically be given preference as estate executors.

While on the Supreme Court, she continued fighting for women and wrote the majority opinion that the Virginia Military Institute could no longer ban women from being admitted. Justice Ruth Bader Ginsberg was an inspiration to the men and women in our nation.

Rosemary was born in Emporia, Kansas, to John Virgil Dobbs and Ester Pauline Shreffler. She grew up in Kansas, Barstow, California, and Albuquerque, New Mexico, as her father worked for Santa Fe Railroad. Rosemary graduated from Albuquerque High School. While attending there, she took drafting, and was so good, the teacher had her become a student teacher and help when a substitute was in charge.

As a sophomore she demonstrated her drafting expertise at the New Mexico State Fair. In June 1944, she applied and tested for a drafting job with the Soil Conservation Service, and was hired at \$150 per month, her very first job. Rosemary met her husband in Albuquerque, after the war, at college. They were married in 1946.

The family moved to Riverside in 1960. Rosemary graduated from college in 1963, the same year her son graduated from junior high school. Then she began a 25-year career of teaching first grade in the Alvord School District. After retiring, she spent the next 25 years volunteering as a classroom aide in the district, helping students get the best education they could.
