

BACKGROUND:

Summary

The Riverside University Health System - Public Health Laboratory (RUHS-PHL) is eliminating a QIAGEN QIAcube instrument. RUHS-PHL is requesting to donate the instrument to the City of Long Beach Public Health Laboratory (CLB-PHL), which is outside the County of Riverside. CLB-PHL is still using manual extraction methods (i.e. QIAcube) for COVID-19 testing. This instrument will enhance CLB-PHL's capacity of COVID-19 molecular testing activities. RUHS-PHL has verified that the donated capital asset does not violate State, Federal or any other entities' agreement/provision/obligation/restrictions on the transfer as it might be the case with federal/state grants.

RUHS-PH proposes to donate a QIAGEN QIAcube (Asset – 634, Tag – 082888, Serial – 51117).

After Board approval and after the QIAGEN QIAcube instrument has been donated, RUHS-PHL will submit asset form and supporting documentation to the Auditor-Controller to remove the ownership.

Impact on Residents and Businesses

There is no impact to the Residents or Businesses in the County of Riverside.

Contract History and Price Reasonableness

RUHS-PH purchased the QIAGEN QIAcube in 2017 for Zika testing and manual extraction. In 2020, RUHS-PHL began using the QIAcube for COVID-19 testing. RUHS-PHL has discontinued using the QIAcube instrument for manual extraction, since moving to newer technology. RUHS-PHL has upgraded to high throughput molecular extraction equipment to improve automation and increase Riverside County testing capacity for COVID-19.

There are no funds involved, and the cost of the maintenance and transfer of the instrument will be the responsibility of the City of Long Beach Public Health Laboratory.
