

BACKGROUND:

The Riverside County Workforce Development Board (WDB) is a private sector led policy and oversight body that supports economic expansion and the development of the regional workforce. The WDB is governed by the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act of 2014 (WIOA) which mandates that 50% of the WDB's members must come from the business community. In addition, WDBs are required to have representation from universities or community colleges and other training providers, as well as economic development and workforce program leaders. This ensures that federal funds for workforce development activities are expended on training and career coaching that meets the needs of the business community. Pursuant to WIOA, the Board of Supervisors, led by the Board Chairman who serves as the Chief Local Elected Official (CLEO), is responsible for appointing the WDB members for two-year terms.

Mr. Jamil Dada, Vice President of Provident Bank and highly distinguished community leader, is a long-time member of the WDB and has served several times as Chairperson. He has also been a Gubernatorial Appointee of the California Workforce Development Board (CWDB) since 2004 and has served as its Chairman for two years. He was awarded the position of Emeritus Board Member of the National Association of Workforce Boards (NAWB) in Washington DC, where he also served as Chairman for two years. In 1997, Mr. Dada was awarded the Citizen of

the Year award for Moreno Valley and most recently in March 2020, was awarded Citizen of the Year award for the City of Riverside.

Mr. Dada currently serves as the President of the March Field Air Museum and Chairman of the Riverside Chamber of Commerce's Military Affairs Council. In addition to supporting our Military, he is also very passionate about Base Joint Use efforts, collaborating to bring good jobs to former Base surplus land. His extensive involvement and connections within the local, statewide and national workforce community have brought recognition to Riverside County and the WDB. His active involvement with Governor Newsom's initiatives has brought business leaders, educators, stakeholders and other organizations together to address employment and training needs of the community. With his guidance, the County and WDB have consistently met local, regional and state plan goals.

Jamil Dada has expressed interest in continuing to serve on the WDB as a Private Sector Representative for District 5. If reappointed he will serve a two-year term commencing October 12, 2020 and expiring October 12, 2022.
