On motion of Supervisor Spiegel, seconded by Supervisor Washington, and duly carried by unanimous vote, IT WAS ORDERED that the meeting of Tuesday, October 20, 2020, be adjourned in memory of Newell E. "Bud" Stone, who passed away, on September 15, 2020, at the age of 91.

Bud was born on February 16, 1929. He was raised on a farm near Golden City, Missouri, and was one of five siblings. He was a farm boy who started working at a very early age. After graduating from Golden City High School in 1947, he and two buddies drove to Idaho in a 1931 Model A Ford, to work on a ranch. As winter approached in 1948, Bud bought an Indian Chief motorcycle and headed south to California seeking warmer weather and opportunity.

Bud started working in the grocery business for Power's Supermarket in Colton in 1949, eventually becoming Regional Manager. He met his future wife Helen Hilliard, who was shopping in the store one day, they married in 1951. Shortly thereafter Bud was drafted into the U.S. Army and was shipped out to fight in Korea with the 24th Infantry during 1951-1952. After returning from the war, Bud and Helen started a family and raised three children, Nancie, Stacy and Bryan.

Bud owned and operated two neighborhood markets in Riverside named Waldos. He was a Groceryman and a Butcher for over 50 years. After Bud retired from the grocery business in the mid 1980's, he managed his real estate properties throughout the Inland Empire. He was also a Riverside Airport Commissioner from 1982 to 1990 actively working on the Airport Master plan, including lobbying efforts in Washington D.C. for funds to improve Riverside Municipal. Bud received the President's Award from the Riverside Chamber of Commerce in 1983.

Bud was a Charter Member of the Riverside East Rotary Club and served as the club's second President in 1988-89. Bud was also a co-founder of the annual Riverside Show & Go Car Show in conjunction with Old Farts Racing Team. This annual fundraiser has raised over a half million dollars that has been donated back to the community over the past 20 years. Bud was a private pilot and flew his Beech Bonanza out of Flabob Airport for over 40 years. He also helped build several homes during the 1990's with Habitat for Humanity. He was an avid quad off-road rider and loved boating as well. Bud was a very successful businessman and Rotarian who oved Riverside.

Colleen was born in Concordia, Kansas on March 20, 1927. She is a mother of five children. She obtained her Bachelor of Arts degree from California Polytechnic University at the age of 55. She was a fine artist who worked at Disneyland in the late 1950's and was known for trying to sell Walt Disney a portrait of himself as he walked through the castle. Her artwork has won numerous awards and has been in the collections of prominent Hollywood movie stars. She has been named numerous times in Who's Who in the World, and Who's Who of America Artists.

Colleen fulfilled her dream of owning an art gallery in Laguna Beach from 1986 to 1993 and created street paintings on her hands and knees at the Temecula Street Painting Festival until the age of 88. She was also a writer and won awards for her two children's books as well as her fine art column, "Art World." She was the publisher of Community Women in Orange County, a monthly publication that highlighted women in business during 1970's and 1980's.

Colleen was an active community volunteer who taught fine art to older adults, organized the annual Veterans Day art show for the City of Lake Elsinore, served as a judge for art shows around southern California, donated her art to numerous fund raising auctions and volunteered at the Temecula Valley Balloon & Wine Festival for many years. Colleen is preceded in death by her husband, Wallace Huber; her sons, Wallace, Shawn and Devron. She is survived by her daughters, Candace (William) Richey and Melody (Calvin) Brunsting.
