Gerry was born April 7, 1930, in the Midwest. He met his wife, Rosie, on a train ride in 1952. They married a year later. The couple moved to Minnesota, and Gerry started working in banking while Rosie worked for a power company.

Gerry and his wife Rosie moved to California in the 1970's, and in 1995, they moved to Temecula, with the intent of starting a winery. They had little experience outside of making the occasional bottle of dandelion and rhubarb wine. Nevertheless, the Wilsons were determined. They relied on local experts in the Temecula Valley, and Gerry and his son, Bill, took winemaking classes. Through hard work and determination, Wilson Creek Winery opened in 2000 and has become a well-beloved fixture in the community.

Wilson Creek Winery has won numerous awards for its wines and has received several humanitarian awards. None of it would have been possible without the vision and dedication of Gerry Wilson. Gerry was widely known for his kindness, compassion, love and graciousness. He is survived by generations of immediate family and thousands of extended family that are thankful for his influence on their lives.

Jeaneen was born on April 26, 1933 in Wenatchee, Washington, she was the eldest daughter of Ezra Elmer Crist and Ruby Piccola (Woods) Crist. She had fond memories of growing up near the orchards of Wenatchee. She loved to tell the story of how she was once an Apple Blossom Princess, for the local Apple Blossom Celebration and Parade.

Jeaneen graduated from La Verne College, now the University of La Verne, where she studied music and elementary education. She met her husband, Daniel Ott, while in college. They married in 1955 and raised their children Carolyn (Ott) Thomas, Dana (Ott) Bailey and David Ott, in Riverside, California. She was a loving, stay-at-home mother while her children were young, teaching them to read words in books and play songs on the piano before they started school. Jeaneen volunteered as a Camp Fire Girl Leader and sang in choir for the La Verne Church of the Brethren and the First United Methodist Church in Riverside. She also learned to love needlepoint as a favorite pastime during her children's swim, music, and tennis lessons.

In 1974 Dan and Jeaneen took their family to live and work in Norway. Jeaneen learned to embrace the food and customs there. She returned home to California with many wonderful recipes that continued to grace family dinner celebrations. She was the ultimate gracious hostess for many large, extended family gatherings.

Jeaneen had a distinguished career as an elementary school teacher for over 25 years, most of that time for Victoria Elementary School, in Riverside. Her students benefited from her ability to integrate curriculum across subject areas, challenging them to think deeply and critically. She connected the performing arts with reading, writing and math content, as she taught students about teddy bears, the rain-forest or the Nutcracker. After she retired from teaching, she continued to work for the Riverside Unified School District as a tester for the Gifted and Talented Education Program.

Jeaneen lived her final years at Agape Cottage Senior Living in Riverside, where she felt safe and comfortable.
