Canyon Lake Library - The Canyon Lake Library has outgrown its current facility, which is currently in the Canyon Lake City Hall. The Board of Supervisors approved the acquisition of a 3,394 square-foot professional office building located within the Canyon Lake Towne Center. The new location allows for a dedicated public library building, increased space for the collection and provision of enhanced educational, cultural and civic related programs.

The Glen Avon Library is currently going through a refresh project to bring some enhancements to the facility. The refresh project will provide new paint, new computer carrels, study spaces, designated teen area and new furniture throughout. Another addition to the project is the Learning Lounge, which has been constructed to support the need for workforce development skills development within the community. The Parent Resource Center has also been established to connect the parenting and educational needs for those with children with learning challenges.
