BACKGROUND:

Summary

The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) requires that all substantial amendments to the County’s Five-Year Consolidated Plan and the One-Year Action Plans are subject to the Citizen Participation Plan and are approved by the Board of Supervisors and HUD. In accordance with the County of Riverside’s Citizen Participation Plan for the 2019-2024 Five Year Consolidated Plan (Citizen Participation Plan), all new activities added to a One-Year Action Plan, any significant increases in funding or changes to an existing project, or other changes or amendments to the 2019-2024 Five-Year Consolidated Plan are considered to be substantial amendments.

The proposed new Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) projects warranting these substantial amendments have been determined by staff to be eligible activities that meet a National Objective of the CDBG program. A description of the proposed amendments to the 2020-2021, One-Year Action Plan are set forth in Attachments A, B, C, and D, attached hereto.

Staff recommends approval of the new CDBG projects listed below as substantial amendments to the 2020-2021 One-Year Action Plan of the 2019-2024 Five Year Consolidated Plan:

City of Canyon Lake ADA Accessibility Project	\$ 48,817	Add New CDBG Activity

The proposed Community and Senior Center COVID-19 Assistance Program will meet a National Objective of the CDBG program through the Urgent Need criteria. This National Objective will allow the community and senior centers to better serve clients and communities during the COVID-19 pandemic without the record keeping burdens of income certification and verification, as well as presumed benefit certification.

The County is required to certify that the proposed Community and Senior Center COVID-19 Assistance Program meets the following Urgent Need National Objective requirements:

- 1) the existing conditions must pose a serious and immediate threat to the health or welfare of the community;
- 2) the existing conditions are of recent origin or recently became urgent (generally, within the past 18 months); and
- 3) the County is unable to finance the activity on its own and other sources of funding are not available.

Staff recommends the Board approve and adopt Resolution No. 2020-256 certifying compliance with the Urgent Need National Objective requirements.

Pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), the Substantial Amendments were reviewed and determined to be categorically exempt from CEQA under State CEQA Guidelines Section 15061(b)(3), General Rule or "Common Sense" exemption. The Substantial Amendments are administrative planning documents that will only have financial and administrative effects. It can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the proposed Substantial Amendments may have a significant effect on the environment and will not lead to any direct or reasonably indirect physical impacts. The projects identified in the Substantial Amendments will be subject to separate CEQA environmental review prior to taking any choice limiting action or discretionary action on that specific project. A Notice of Exemption will be filed by County staff with the County Clerk within five days of the approval of the Substantial Amendments.

Furthermore, the Substantial Amendments were determined to be exempt from the provisions of the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) pursuant to Title 24 Code of Federal Regulations

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Sections 58.34 (a)(1) and (a)(3) since the proposed Substantial Amendments are administrative activities. The projects identified in the Substantial Amendments will be subject to separate NEPA environmental review prior to taking any choice limiting action or discretionary action on that specific project.

Pursuant to 24 CFR Section 91.105 and the Citizen Participation Plan, the Housing, Homelessness Prevention and Workforce Solutions Agency published the required public notice notifying the public of the comment period for the proposed substantial amendments on November 4, 2020. No public comments have been received.

County Counsel has reviewed and approved the Substantial Amendments to the 2020-2021 One-Year Action Plan of the 2019-2024 Five Year Consolidated Plan as to form.

Impact on Residents and Businesses

City of Canyon Lake ADA Accessibility Project: The City of Canyon Lake will use CDBG funds to construct ADA improvements at their new building, located at 31542 Railroad Canyon Road, as outlined in the City's ADA Accessibility Report. The CDBG funds will be used to fund project management, design, equipment and/or materials, construction, compliance monitoring, and inspection costs.

Anza Community Hall ADA Upgrades: Anza Community Building, Inc., will use CDBG funds for project management, architectural/engineering design, and construction services to remove architectural barriers and construct related improvements at Anza Community Hall in order to achieve ADA compliance and provide improved access to the facility. CDBG funds will be used for design, construction, compliance monitoring, and project management.

City of Banning Senior Center ADA Ramp Project: The City of Banning will use CDBG funds for phase II of improvements to the Senior Center reconstruction of one (1) exterior and one (1) interior ramp for accessibility into the center. Then CDBG funds will be used for design, construction, compliance monitoring, and project management.

Community and Senior Center COVID-19 Assistance Program: HHPWS will allocate non-CARES Act CDBG public service funds to community and senior centers serving residents and communities within the County's Urban County CDBG Program boundaries. The grant funds will be used to pay for costs incurred by these centers to prevent, prepare for, and respond to the coronavirus pandemic (COVID19). Eligible expenses will include, but not be limited to: cleaning and disinfectant supplies, personal protective equipment (PPE), shielding, signage, staff training, testing, and other related expenses.

Additional Fiscal Information

There will be no impact upon the County's General Fund.


