BACKGROUND:

Summary

Hamner Avenue is a north-south arterial road in the City of Norco (Norco) and the City of Eastvale (Eastvale). The County of Riverside (County) in cooperation with Norco and Eastvale are proposing to widen two segments of Hamner Avenue from Schleisman Road to Citrus Street, and from Detroit Street to 6th Street/Norco Drive, to six lanes (3 lanes in each direction) in anticipation of the Bridge Replacement Project that will widen the Hamner Avenue Bridge over the Santa Ana River. The limits of the Bridge Replacement Project are from Citrus Street to Detroit Street. Once constructed, these projects will help to meet the current and future traffic demands by improving the traffic operation for this corridor.

The proposed Hamner Avenue widening improvements will add one northbound lane and one southbound lane, sidewalks, and will provide needed infrastructure improvements. The project will be designed to minimize impacts to the existing residents and motorists that regularly use these two segments of Hamner Avenue.

On March 12, 2019 (Agenda item 3.32), the Board of Supervisors approved an Agreement by and between the County of Riverside, City of Eastvale, and City of Norco, to perform and complete the preliminary engineering, conduct the environmental studies, prepare the environmental documentation to secure the CEQA clearance, and complete the final plans, specifications and estimate (PS&E) for the Hamner Widening Project. The total amount authorized under the agreement was \$1,312,539.

Norco, Eastvale, and the County desire to amend the Agreement for the Hamner Avenue Widening Project to authorize the County to proceed with the construction phase. The amended Agreement provides the terms and conditions, a scope of work, the budget, and the funding terms to implement the construction phase.

The Hamner Avenue Widening Improvements Project was incorporated as an alternative bid schedule to the Hamner Avenue Bridge Replacement Project. Based on the favorable bids received, the Hamner Avenue Widening Improvements Project will be constructed as part of the Hamner Bridge replacement project.

Amendment 1 was approved by the City of Norco City Council on November 4, 2020 and by the City of Eastvale City Council on November 18, 2020.

Impact on Residents and Businesses

The proposed improvements will improve safety, enhance operational efficiency for pedestrians and local traffic on Hamner Avenue.

SUPPLEMENTAL:

Additional Fiscal Information

The total amount authorized will be increased by \$4,510,461 from \$1,312,539 to \$5,823,000 to fund the construction and construction management costs for this project.

A separate amendment to an existing Agreement between Norco, Eastvale, and Western Riverside Council of Governments (WRCOG) was approved. It provides for the County to be reimbursed for work directly from WRCOG Transportation Uniform Mitigation Funds (TUMF) in a not-to-exceed amount of \$5,823,000.

This amendment was approved by WRCOG on November 2, 2020, by Norco on November 4, 2020 and by Eastvale on November 18, 2020.

There are no General Funds used for this project.

COUNTY AND CITIES are 20 sometimes collectively referred to hereinafter as PARTIES, and individually as a PARTY. 21 RECITALS A. On March 12, 2019, COUNTY, EASTVALE, and NORCO entered into an agreement entitled "Agreement By 22 23 and Between County of Riverside and the Cities of Norco and Eastvale for the Widening of the Hamner Avenue from Schleisman Road and Hamner Avenue from Detroit Street to Six Street". The Agreement 24 25

provides the terms and conditions, a brief scope of work, the budget, and the funding sources to perform the preliminary engineering, conduct the environmental studies, prepare the environmental documentation to

27 secure the CEQA clearance and complete the final plans, specifications and estimate (PS&E) for the Hamner

B. NORCO was designated the lead agency for the approval of the CEQA document for the PROJECT. By

Cooperative Agreement (Amendment 1)

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Minute Order dated September 2, 2020 (Agenda item 2B), NORCO's City Council adopted the Initial Study/Mitigated Negative Declaration for the Hamner Avenue Widening Project.

- C. COUNTY, EASTVALE, and NORCO have completed the final plans, specifications and estimate (PS&E).
- D. With this AMENDMENT the PARTIES desire to authorize the addition of the construction phase to the PROJECT. This AMENDMENT provides the terms and conditions, a brief scope of work, the budget, and the funding sources to implement the construction phase of the PROJECT.
- E. The project funding allocation provided by Western Riverside Council of Governments (WRCOG) through Transportation Uniform Mitigation Funds (TUMF) in the amount of \$1,312,539 has been amended to \$5,823,000 and approved by a separate amendment between the CITIES and WRCOG. COUNTY will invoice WRCOG directly for reimbursement for services completed under this AMENDMENT.
- F. Except to the extent specifically modified or amended hereunder this AMENDMENT, all of the terms, covenants and conditions of the original Agreement shall remain in full force and effect between the PARTIES hereto.

AGREEMENT

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises contained herein, the PARTIES hereto agree as follows:

1. Section 1 is hereby deleted in its entirety and replaced with (Revise and Replace):

COUNTY will act on behalf of the CITIES as the agency that will perform the preliminary engineering, conduct the environmental studies, prepare the environmental documentation to secure the CEQA clearance, complete the final PS&E package and complete the construction for this PROJECT. All services are dependent on the continued availability of the TUMF funds. COUNTY will provide services on a reimbursable basis and has absolutely no obligation with regard to COUNTY funding for any portion of the PROJECT.

2. Section 9 is hereby deleted in its entirety and replaced with (Revise and Replace):

Each CITY shall provide funding for implementing the PROJECT, including but not limited to the items listed in Exhibit B-1, Cost Estimate, attached hereto and by this reference incorporated herein. Each CITY has agreed and shall provide the PROJECT funding through its respective allocation of Transportation Uniform Mitigation Funds (TUMF) from Western Riverside Council of Governments (WRCOG) in the amount of \$5,823,000 as approved by a separate agreement between the CITIES

and WRCOG. Each CITY agrees and consents to the COUNTY to receive its reimbursement of costs by submitting an invoice to WRCOG directly for reimbursement for services completed under this AMENDMENT.

3. Section 12 is hereby deleted in its entirety and replaced with (Revise and Replace):

Each CITY will issue, at no cost to the COUNTY or its consultants and contractors, upon proper application by the COUNTY or the COUNTY's consultants or contractors, an encroachment permit authorizing entry onto CITY'S right-of-way to perform survey and other investigative activities required to complete the design, environmental documentation, right-of-way and construction activities for the PROJECT.

4. Section 21 is hereby deleted in its entirety and replaced with (Revised and Replaced):

This AGREEMENT, any AMENDMENTs and Exhibits A-1 and B-1, herein contain the entire Agreement between the PARTIES, and are intended by the PARTIES to completely state the Agreement in full. Any or representation respecting the matters dealt with herein or the duties of any party in relation thereto, not expressly set forth in this AMENDMENT, is null and void.

- 5. Exhibit A is hereby amended to add a page two (2), identified as Exhibit A-1, attached herein.
- 6. Exhibit B is delete and replaced by Exhibit B-1, attached herein.

The remaining terms are to be added to the end of the AGREEMENT (New)

- (New) COUNTY will retain a consultant to provide design support services during the advertisement and bid process, and design support services during construction of this PROJECT.
- 8. (New) COUNTY will advertise, award and administer a public works contract for the construction of the CITIES' PROJECT in accordance with all applicable federal, state or local statutes, ordinances, orders, governmental requirements, laws or regulations, including but not limited to the local agency public construction codes, California Labor Code, and California Public Contract Code
- (New) COUNTY will furnish a representative to perform the function of Resident Engineer during construction of CITIES' PROJECT.
- 10. (New) COUNTY will furnish qualified support staff to assist the Resident Engineer in, but not limited to, construction surveys, soils and compaction tests, measurement and computation of quantities, testing of construction materials, checking submittals, preparation of estimates and reports, preparation of as-built

drawings, and other inspection and staff services necessary to assure that the construction is performed in accordance with the PS&E documents.

- 11. (New) COUNTY will construct the PROJECT in accordance with approved PS&E documents.
- 12. (New) COUNTY will furnish the CITIES with one complete set for each CITY the full-sized film positive reproducible as-built plans and all contract records, including survey documents, within three hundred and sixty-five (365) days following the completion and acceptance of the PROJECT construction contract. Electronic copies of completed plans are available if CITIES desire. If electronic copies are provided, they will be provided on CD-R media.
- 13. (New) COUNTY will furnish the CITIES a final reconciliation of project expenses within ninety (90) days following the completion and acceptance of the PROJECT construction contract. If final costs associated with the CITIES' improvements are in excess with what is shown on Exhibit B-1. COUNTY shall include a final bill with the financial reconciliation to the CITIES.
- 14. (New) In the event that CITIES default in the performance of any of its obligations under the Agreement and this AMENDMENT or materially breaches any of the provisions of the Agreement and this AMENDMENT, the COUNTY shall have the option to terminate the Agreement and AMENDMENT upon 90 days written notice to the CITIES.
- 15. (New) Ownership and title to all materials, equipment, and appurtenances installed as part of this PROJECT will be automatically vested with the jurisdiction in which the improvements reside and no further agreement will be necessary to transfer ownership.
- 16. (New) CITIES shall be responsible for the maintenance of the improvements provided by PROJECT except as specified in any future agreements.
- 17. (New) PARTIES agree that if upon opening of bids for construction of the PROJECT the bids indicate a cost overrun of no more than 10% of the construction costs estimate as described in "Exhibit B-1", COUNTY may award the contract.
- 18. (New) PARTIES agree that if upon opening of bids, it is found that a cost overrun exceeding ten percent (10%) of the Total Estimate Cost will occur, COUNTY and CITIES shall endeavor to agree upon an alternative course of action. If, after thirty (30) calendar days from the date of bid opening, an alternative course of action is not agreed upon, this AMENDMENT shall be deemed to be terminated.
- 19. (New) PARTIES agree that construction by COUNTY of improvements referred to herein which lie within

CITIES rights of way shall not be commenced until an Encroachment Permit to COUNTY, or COUNTY's contractor, authorizing such work has been issued by the CITIES.

- 20. (New) PARTIES agree that any action at law or in equity brought by any of the parties hereto for the purpose of enforcing a right or rights provided by this Agreement shall be tried in a court of competent jurisdiction in the County of Riverside, State of California, and the parties hereto waive all provisions of law providing for a change of venue in such proceedings to any other county
- 21. (New) The Agreement and any amendments is the result of negotiations between the parties hereto, and the advice and assistance of their respective counsel. The fact that this Agreement and amendments were prepared as a matter of convenience by CITIES or COUNTY shall have no importance or significance. Any uncertainty or ambiguity in this Agreement and amendments shall not be construed against the party that prepared it in its final form.
- 22. This AMENDMENT may be executed in one or more counterparts, and when a counterpart shall have been signed by each PARTY hereto, each shall be deemed an original, but all of which constitute one and the same instrument.

Project Title:

Hamner Avenue Widening Project from Schleisman Road to Citrus Street and Detroit

Street to 6th Street/Norco Drive

Project Scope of Work

The County of Riverside in cooperation with Cities of Norco and Eastvale are proposing to widen Hamner Avenue from Schleisman Road to Citrus Street and Detroit Street to 6th Street/Norco Drive under the Hamner Avenue Widening Project. This proposed project will widen Hamner Avenue to the ultimate street section of six lanes (three lanes in each direction) to match the Bridge Replacement Project that will widen Hamner Bridge over the Santa Ana River. The limits of the Bridge Replacement Project are from Citrus Street to Detroit Street. These projects will meet the current and future traffic demands and will improve the traffic operation for this corridor.

VICINITY MAP


