Alice was born in 1928 to Eulogio and Jessie Sotello. She grew up in Murrieta, when the trains still ran. She once served actor John Wayne lunch, in what is now, an abandoned building. As an adult Alice spent four years in the Ground Observer Corps. During World War II and was very patriotic. Alice was a stay at home mother, a PTC member, she helped with Dime and Dip Dinner fundraisers, she was a Den Mother for the Boy Scouts and was part of the 4 H Live Wires (now Murrieta Mustangs). She was a founding member of the Garden Club. Alice delivered Thanksgiving meals to homebound members and long-time Murrieta residents, as well as helped with the Fireman's BBQ since inception. She also helped with the city's annual Food and Toy Drive, which was ran by her daughter Annette and son-in-law Pat Jennings.

Alice was Mother of the Year in 1986 and attended Citizens for Cityhood and LAFCO meetings to support Murrieta becoming a city. She was a member of the Cruising A's and the Temecula Valley Model A Ford clubs for 20 years, a hobby she shared with her husband Ray. Alice and Ray were in many holiday parades where Ray proudly displayed a sign titled, "Newlyweds Since December 5, 1948." Alice enjoyed the Murrieta Veteran's Day Parade and was proud of her son Robert, who served in the Vietnam War. Later in life Alice joined friends at the Murrieta Senior Center for "Craft 'n Chat" and looked forward to her morning walks to the post office. She was Grandma Alice to everyone her knew her, but particularly to her five grandchildren. Murrieta has been significantly impacted by the love of Alice Vose. The devotion she had to her family and to the community can be seen throughout the city, in its history and events.

David was born in San Bernardino on August 28, 1933, he served his country in the U.S. Navy, on the USS Iowa, during the Korean War until 1954. He met the love of his life and married Gayleen Slaton on October 16, 1955. He and Gayleen moved to Corona in 1955, they lived in a small home in the Canyon, across from Featherly Park. They purchased the family home in a small community of Corona known as Coronita in 1958. They lived there throughout their marriage, while successfully raising their four children David, Timothy, Michele and Robert "Bobby."

David owned and operated Dave's Westernaire barbershop on 6<sup>th</sup> Street for many years and was active with other community leaders in Corona. In 1972 David decided to follow God's direction to open a church in his neighborhood of Coronita. David attended California Baptist University in 1976 and graduated with his Bachelor of Arts degree, he later completed his master's and Doctorate Degree of Religious education. The Church's first service was in the family home on July 3, 1973. Through the years the church name was changed to Corona Christian Center, and had built more than 24,000 square feet of educational and worship centers, on 8 acres of land and met the needs of nearly a million people through the almost 50 years of Pastor Howard's service to God and the community of Corona. Today, the ministry continues under the name Corona Christian World Ministries.
