On motion of Supervisor Spiegel, seconded by Supervisor Hewitt, and duly carried by unanimous vote, IT WAS ORDERED that the meeting of Tuesday, March 2, 2021, be adjourned in memory of Mark Rubin, a Holocaust survivor and prominent builder of Riverside projects, passed away February 13, 2021 at the age of 84.

Mark Rubin was born January 14, 1937, in Sabinov, Czechoslovakia, the younger of two boys. A few years later, Nazi Germany invaded the country and his family went into hiding in 1942. Their hiding place was discovered in 1944, and they were shipped to the Terezin concentration camp on the outskirts of Prague, where they stayed until their liberation in 1945. The family left Czechoslovakia in 1948 and came to the U.S., settling in New York. In 1953, the family moved to Los Angeles.

Mark Rubin was a Beverly Hills resident, he never lived in Riverside or the surrounding area, but considered it to be a prime location for future Southern California growth. He started decades ago with the purchase of 2,500 acres of open land in the city's Mission Grove area, which today is a bustling part of the city along Alessandro Boulevard. He adopted Riverside as his second home and did a tremendous amount of good for the city.

Mark Rubin was the builder of office towers, townhouses and shopping centers in Riverside, and an advocate for UC Riverside medical school. Mark Rubin and his wife, Pam, gave the university \$3 million in 1994 to support the School of medicine that would arrive later. They had a vision for a school that would train students from the inland Empire who, upon graduation, work locally to serve the area. The dream is becoming a reality with 63% of the incoming class in August having ties to the Inland region.

One of Mark's most prominent developments is the Citrus Tower, a six-story office building at University Avenue and Lime Street in downtown Riverside, that is a signature landmark along the 91 freeway. His last project, the Mark, a seven-story building that will feature 165 apartments and 20,000 square feet of retail shops on the ground floor, is under construction a few blocks away, on Market Street. Mark Rubin also sat on local boards, including the Greater Riverside Chambers of Commerce, Riverside Downtown Partnership and La Sierra University.

Mark's memory and passionate spirit will live forever in the hearts of those who knew and loved him, he will be greatly missed but never forgotten.
